I enjoy having a space to get to know scholars that is not "class", and where we can talk about anything.

I feel as though scholars do not see the purpose of family group. Many scholars skip. Other family group's don't follow the Family Group calendar and it makes it difficult to implement the slides/second step/outside rules when it seems as if you are the one of the few family groups that does.

They actually were a great bunch of kids. We developed a routine and stuck with it.

I don't feel safe or respected during family group, and we have tried very hard to follow the model AND be flexible and responsive to our scholars. Some have come around, but it is inconsistent. The yonder pouches and switch-up of systems really blew up our spot.

My positive feelings about my FG come from the amount of work my co-carent and I have put in to making our FG a positive space. Unfortunately, the lessons and activities provided to us were not appropriate or engaging for our kids. As a result, we were forced to plan all of our own activities and opportunities.

Family Group is an important part of school as I feel like it helps build necessary connections outside of the typical classroom setting.

More student choice would be nice

The play and social aspect of it, is best:)

I LOVE the idea of FG, but feel it could be run to promote scholar ownership. Can they get a survey like this too?

I feel good about the expectations being met and look forward to getting to know them more next year

Teachers will get out of Family Group what they put into it. People who don't like Family Group likely put in a half-assed effort resulting in half-assed participation and enthusiasm on the part of the scholars.

We have a great bunch of scholars

I loved my FG this year and had them last year. I had a couple of scholars that would never come and that created some frustration and hard to hold others accountable. Any suggestions for that? We wrote referrals and had constant contact with admin.

The dynamics of my family group were awful. The disrespect and failure to engage were a daily struggle.

Family group should be a great opportunity for scholars and carents to connect, however, that is not what occurs currently. Scholars dislike the lessons and feel that there wants and desires don't matter.

This was my first year being in a LS FG and my first year being shared staff. 7th grade was a mess, and although my co-carent and I got along well, the kids were just nuts. Was very difficult to establish rituals and routines, and the chaos on the 2nd floor just made it incredibly difficult to get anything done.

We had a rough mix of scholars. We had a problem having a handful of scholars attend on a regular basis. While attendance during the full day, as well as suspensions contributed, many absences from FG occurred while scholars were in the building.

We had a really great group this year and it was fun once the 2 bad apples stopped showing up

Family Group is hard at the end of the day when I am already tired - I am excited about it being in the morning next year.

This was a difficult combination of students.

#### Please offer any comments or questions you have about Second Step.

The idea behind second step is great - helping kids learn social emotional skills through hands on videos and activities. But the actual second step lessons are out of date. The questions are not always age appropriate.

It's bettert than the other curriculum we have been using. The activities in 2nd Step are more what I think we should be doing in FG. The other curriculum wasn't of interest to members of our FG.

It is way too similar to the lessons we did at the beginning of the year.

Just too difficult to start something like this way late in the year.

complicated sign-on process for co-carents; often not applicable; "robotic"; more like a lesson then the laid back FG vibe we developed

The scholars felt like it was more work.

Worksheets were a no-go

I think it would be more effective if we used it more consistently.

I did not like the lessons, they weren't engaging and starting it mid year was not good.

We did not follow second step given the needs of our scholars. We did touch on the topics just did it on a level that is appropriate to our needs.

# Do you have something special you want to say, about how your FG scholars get along in or outside of FG? Please feel free to share your thoughts or a story in the space provided below.

When my stepdaughter passed away recently, my family group all signed a card for me. It was touching and very appreciated.

It was a very difficult start of the year with relationship building but I truly feel we have made significant improvements in relationships over the course of this year.

Our scholars get a long pretty well now. At the beginning of the year there were some issues, but now most everyone seems to feel comfortable and friendly.

It's a problem that so many students didn't come. When we collected phones, they at least came at the end. Now they don't come at all. We have written referrals for this, but it doesn't seem to get any attention.

Most seem to get along in FG, not sure how they function outside of FG.

Our FG is tight.

They didn't know each other in the beginning of the school year but now they are all close friends.

Our scholars have somewhat of a relationship with each other in and outside of family group.

For the most part, everyone gets along.

The ones who come really enjoy it. Once we stopped giving out cell phones at the end of FG, our attendance dropped significantly, even with referrals and follow up with admin.

The family group dynamic really depends on whether or not certain "high-flyers" come to class. There are two or three scholars that can throw off the delicate balance of safety and order.

Our students can follow expectations during Family Group. When there is not a united front of Family Groups with the same expectations (especially around attendance, phones, and swapping classes), it makes an unfair situation for our students.

My positive feelings about my FG come from the amount of work my co-carent and I have put in to making our FG a positive space. Unfortunately, the lessons and activities provided to us were not appropriate or engaging for our kids. As a result, we were forced to plan all of our own activities and opportunities.

Each individual in my FG are kind and sweet, but as a whole they struggle to interact positively with each other.

I feel scholars should get to vote for who they want to have in FG with them. Or at least vote for which carents they would like to have.

The boys typically like throwing a tennis ball or football around the room. The girls typically like to socialize.

Usually very well! Only rarely do we have to re-establish boundaries and trust.

I feel like the girls in our group were pretty close to each other but some of the scholars kinda stuck to their own

I feel like my scholars look out for each other outside of Family Group. Even when two of my scholars had a conflict outside of FG time, they used FG time to mediate it, on their own. I think this is because my co-carent and I have created a safe space.

They get along well, as siblings would. Most just fine, with an occasional arguement

I feel like the scholars that I struggled to have a good relationship with were the ones that didn't come, participate and we were always in a situation where we were holding them accountable.

They generally get along with each other but they did not see FG as an opportunity to build relationships. It was viewed as a non-graded play time and there was little accountability for them to stick to the plan.

Not at this time

Most of them don't come - they skip for most of the school day and family group as well. As soon as we instituted the pouches there was no reason for them to come to family group since attendance did not matter to them and there were no consequences for skipping.

They do not get along well. As I said, this was a difficult group of personalities. Things did improve when one scholar went to a new school, but overall its been a difficult year with them.

# Do you have something special you want to say about Family Group? Please feel free to share a thought or story in the space below:

For family group, the whole is greater than the sum of its parts. Day to day can truly feel mundane, yet at the end of each year we share strong bonds with one another. We are most cohesive and build the strongest relationships while playing games. Kids then feel comfortable to engage in deeper conversations and confront difficult truths about academics and life.

We have quite a bit of seniors this school year and has been really amazing to watch them grow over the past 4 years.

Lesson plans need to be age appropriate and more engaging for high school students, also need to be different from previous years.

I love my kids! They are amazing.

I love my family group with the kids who do come to the class. Some kids see it as a joke or say that it is boring and skip ALL THE TIME! It takes away from the relationship we have with the kids who do come and make it a negative thing.

With some of the students, I really feel like they are my "school daughter" or "school son". I value the relationships that we form in FG.

It has been great to see the kids in my Family Group go from being strangers to being friends who look forward to the time they spend together there.

FG has lost its sense of purpose. Kids do not come and there is no accountability.

When I entered mid-year I was welcomed with open arms and everyday since.

This year has been better than many in the past - we got several new 9th grader, and they are good folks.

I love my co-carent and my family children

The sense of entitlement is disturbing by some (half) of our kids. "Where's the food? Oh, I don't like that! Is that all you brought?" WTF! It really ruins the experience for me.

I would rather the FG be either the first thing in the morning, right before lunch, or at the end of the day. Having it between first and second ruins any momentum the day may have.

Love connecting with scholars

We have wonderful kids in our family group.

We have had only two students stay this year. The huge differences between the different FGs creates issues.

I think that some of the activities do not engage students. More movement might be needed.

I liked the students in my FG this year

We had a lot of success this year tailoring our family group to the interests of the kids who regularly attend. When we discovered that many of them enjoy movies, we made this a consistent part of our weekly routine, but were able to develop relationships with them through talking about the films and topics that came up because of the films. I guess what I'm saying is, as much as we want there to be a universal "curriculum", family group is about building trusting relationships that will carry over four years. That should be the main priority. We did lose some kids after February... they were often in the building but did not regularly attend. They did, however, check in individually at different times throughout the year and we maintained individual relationships with them.

I enjoy getting to know the scholars and being someone that they can talk to about their lives, struggles, relationships, etc....

I love my kids. I get along great with my Co-carent. I do not feel as though what was planned in the calendar was effective at building relationships.

The two years when junior-go-seniors have been pulled out of our FG, it may have worked well for the seniors, but there are no scholar role models for maturity in our group. The freshmen/sophomores in our group, after coping with COVID, display very immature behaviors.

75% of our kids buy in. The other 25% sit quietly.

Our family group bonds over our collective appreciation for Marvel and Star Wars

This year we had two young men that teamed and got into trouble together. Very toxic relationship

Some of the kids do not like each other no matter what we do. It is uncomfortable and just plain miserable.

Our family group is very close and everyone gets along. They all have very different personalities, but respect one another and encourage each other to do well. We had a FG party outside of school and everyone enjoyed it (that came) and wanted to do it again next year.

We have great relationships with most of our scholars, but they still do not come to family group. They want to be with their friends and tell us that other teachers let them in their family group without a pass.

I have a good relationship with the few students who come.

Many of the bilingual scholars wanted to join another family group that had more of their

friends.

It was evident that some of our younger family group members spent time together outside of the class.

Many of them keep to themselves, however, they seem to enjoy each other's company. A few of them will communicate during unstructured time with each other. We have not had any behavior issues.

Our family group really does act like siblings and care about each other like siblings. It is special. We do not have "skipping"; if they in school, they are in FG.

Our scholar makeup was widely divergent - a few dominant and loud, a few very reclusive - with only 3-4 willing to collaborate, lead a project on occasion, or even contribute to party food. One pair of girls worked well together when both attended. One scholar insisted on attending another FG every day. By mutual carental agreement, she was allowed to do so as long as she checked in for attendance; if she did not, she was marked absent. Another FG carent allowed a once-per-week visit, provided permission was given each time. My co-carent and I understand that the aim was to build community in our group, and we followed the protocols; but sometimes we couldn't even lead the horses to water, let alone get them to drink.

### **US** General Feedback on 2020-2021 Changes

I think the website and lessons are very well-organized and easy to access.

Family group was challenging and rewarding this academic year.

What? There was feedback from the walk throughs. I thought that it was just a way to catch people not complying. How come this survey doesnt address or ask for feedback on SLCs?

It would be interesting to ask FG Carents what kind of feedback they might like from walk-throughs. That way you could lean into how different carents enact a similar vision as opposed to whether or not we are "doing the thing." For example, I know we often veer off on tangents when we talk, but all of those are important to us or to what kids need at the time. I would love some feedback specifically about how to get more kids to attend, as opposed to whether or not the slides are displayed. That kind of targeted feedback would help our FG specifically. It's like, do we need all FGs to enact the same stuff or do we need all FGs bought into the same vision? If the second one is true more so than the first, asking carents what they might like to work on would be a helpful way to launch feedback to FG.

I just don't know how to help with it.

We do not need walk thru's. We are adults and should be treated as so in FG

We did not get feedback?

Walk throughs that have happened are just awkward. The students feel uncomfortable when outside adults come in especially when they just stand at the door.

Some groups worked well; others did not. It seemed that food, most often supplied by the carents, was a big draw. Some groups had good chemistry, but ours did not.

### LS General Feedback on 2020-2021 Changes

We had only one walk through with no feedback, very disappointing.

It should be encouraged and not forbidden. Also, the students really enjoyed it and they did a great job of being good citizens and following rules.

Allow for more autonomy in FG's.

This was a very difficult year for many reasons. There are systems-level changes that need to be considered in order to set everyone up for a positive experience in family group. I really hope things get better.

I think the start of the year was too unstructured. I am hopeful SecondStep will be a helpful structure for next year.

As it currently exists, FG does not meet the needs of our kids or teachers. Although the materials are beautiful and organized, they are not responsive to the needs of our kids, and therefore, teachers must do their own planning for FG. It has become another class for teachers to plan for. It feels like we are trying to fit a circle into a square with the plans and the current approach to FG. When problems arise, the issue seems to be poor implementation on the part of the teacher and the teacher is expected to make changes. Perhaps the focus should shift from poor implementation of beautiful materials to more thoughtful and engaging plans created by the FG coaches.

Things were okay

Please use EL schools CREW as a model to assist in any changes.

Teachers/Staff who were higher while we ere remote should get some sort of training on what FG is and how they being actually present makes a different.

SLC's in FG, killed our momentum and progress. That is when I had many scholars starting to skip FG. I think FG could be in charger of scheduling, sending home invites, helping a little with practice or final touches. Many activities were challenging for us, because we had a NYSSA FG. If we mix NYSSA kids again, those FGs need to be given leeway on what they do and are able to accomplish.

See other comments. There are so many great team building activities that require physical movement etc and can really spice it up. Also make explicit connections to SEL 5 Core competencies. Do role plays, etc.

SEL's crashed any hope of engagement. They should be done in a content area class. Especially when you are trying to build relationships with scholars that are completely disengaged and don't care at all about school work.

This year, much the level of attendance depended on whether scholars felt their time well spent to attend for 40 minutes on an asynchronous day. Most of ours did not. They may have considered it a day off or a day to go to work, rather than an independent day for studying, bonding, and getting help from teachers.

Appreciate you both and all that you do to bring this together.

I would just like to ask for more autonomy in FG.

I like the concept of Family Group. It will be interesting to see if there is a difference in attendance with it being in the a.m.

Is there a way we can be more consistent with our expectation that all carents attend - even admin? OR, if admin need to be pulled away, is there a way we could be flexible about FG in terms of where it happens? I always wondered like, if kids chill in the staff cafe during FG, could we just have someone go there and talk to the kids nonjudgmentally about their lives, how they're doing, and other things before they police them into attending FG? Hall sweeps for family group were a real vibe killer, and it put carents in awkward positions. How can we accomplish the goal of ensuring school safety for all kids while not sabotaging the goal of FG being welcoming and low pressure?

Please consider using some significant fraction of the 150 minutes of FG time as a way to give students a chance to participate in a school activity or club of the student's choosing.

I don't like walk thrus without follow up.

No space to comment on the attendance question, but our FG attendance was great for the beginning half of the school year, then dropped off. By the 4th MP we had only the same 4 or 5 students showing up daily with a handful of others coming sporadically.

This year was hard due to lasting effects of COVID and not being able to have celebrations/block parties/etc. Hopefully next year will be more "normal"

I love the idea of field trips, board games, and more unstructured time to just talk with them about what is happening in their lives.

I would just strongly prefer to not have the same group of students for FG next year, if possible.

I would like to see family group be more fun, informal, and be based on relationship building and social emotional learning. Many scholars skipped this school year compared to previous years and were in the hallways, which led to other scholars wanting to be in the hallways with there friends. This appeared to especially increase once SLC's started...

Building relationships should be the primary objective of family group

We need to change up co-carents! Some of us have been together 4+ years. It is time for a change.

Family group TL should speak when they come into the room and even engage with the students when possible.

Thanks for all your effort.

My students like when fg is more laid back and they can just take time to relax and share their interests whether it is through watching a particular youtuber or picking a movie that everyone can comment on.

I do appreciate the work FG leaders put into the lessons, they are geared more towards lower school, but the effort is seen!

We really need to get ahold of other FGs allowing kids that are not on their roster in.

The issue of attendance HAS to be addressed if we are going to continue doing this. Every teacher I talk to says that they don't know where kids are during this time and it is a huge safety issue. Teachers need to be on the same page about writing passes and allowing kids in the room.

I think that it is imperative that Upper School and Lower School lessons are different. I also think that we should have our own FG Coach that knows our scholars and their developmental needs.

I am happy with my co-carent Keller! We work well together :)

Is there a way to have snacks in FG? Our kids were very hungry at the end of the day and in the beginning of the year we had a snack everyday, but it was getting expensive. Wondering if there is a way for us to have cereal or granola bars or something.

I think Family group is a valuable tool. Get rid of the Pledge, no one does it

Teach what is meant by flexibility with fidelity so Staff understand where they can be creative and innovate AND maintain to high quality the principles behind FG.

Familys are diverse and unique

scholars being accepted into other family groups without the knowledge of original carrents became a big issue this year. While I understand that scholars want to be with their friends it does completely degrade the purpose of relationship building in a larger community.

Can we consider doing mixed grade levels for LS?

I think there is a big opporunity to discuss current/world/local events that should be included in the curriculum.
