Finding Sources

In this activity, you will search for two scholarly (academic) sources for your topic.

Instructions

- 1) Choose a search tool. You may **use ANY** of the following library search tools (or pick one off the list of <u>research databases</u>). To be successful in your research, you will probably use more than one.

- 2) Use different search strategies to locate **2 scholarly sources**. Strategies include:
 - a) "Exact phrase"
 - b) 3 Magic Words (and/or/not) [called "Boolean" in library jargon!]
 - c) Filters and Limiting
- 3) Find the suggested **MLA citation** for both sources, and paste it in the appropriate column.

Pro Tips

- Use your **strategies** "exact phrase" searching; filters or limiters; 3 Magic Words = AND/OR/NOT; suggestions from the tool; #subjects
- Be **flexible** by trying different search terms or keywords.
- Be **persistent** by trying a different tool if one isn't working so well.
- Ask for help if you need it! You have lifelines = meeting chat; open mic; raise hand; each other; instructor; librarians
