

Judicial Confirmation Amendment

The purpose of this Amendment to the Constitution of Japan is to outline the procedures by which judicial appointees are confirmed.

1. Amends the constitution to add a clause between III§1.a.ii and .iii reading “Upon nomination to the supreme court by parliament or the prime minister, parliament shall deliberate and vote on the question of confirming the nominee. If a vote to confirm receives a simple majority in support, the nominee shall be a justice of the supreme court.”
2. The referendum on the amendment put forward by bill 8 is cancelled.
