Updates to the Maunawili Opening School Handbook:

Page 6- Students may bring **PREPACKAGED** items **ONLY** for special occasions or celebrations. No knick knacks or goodie bags. Example of prepackaged items: Bag of M & Ms mini packs that is still sealed. Only the classroom teacher will be allowed to distribute the treat to the class.

Pages 9 and 10- Return to Work/School Criteria following illness now includes if an individual has COVID-like symptoms at home. If your child exhibits any of the listed COVID-like symptoms, then cannot return to school until they meet the criteria of one of the following:

- At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared AND no fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication AND symptoms improved
- 2. Signed note from a licensed healthcare provider AND no fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication AND symptoms improved.
- 3. Negative COVID-19 test result AND no fever for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication AND symptoms improved.

August 14, 2020 Updates

On Monday, August 17th, we will be distributing tech devices and learning materials to families in a drive-thru pick up in front of the cafeteria. In order for your child to borrow a school device and to participate virtually in distance learning, the following forms must be signed and turned in:

- Technology Device Loan Agreement
- Student Publication/Audio/Video Release
- Technology Responsible Use Form

The Technology Responsible Use Form and Student Publication form were included in the packets that went out last week. Please sign forms and drop off at the front office this week. You may also email the signed forms to your child's teacher. We will also be collecting forms on pick up day.

Pick Up Schedule and Procedures

The health and safety of your family as well as our staff members is our number one priority. In order to limit contact and follow social distancing and crowd size guidelines, we will adhere to the following pickup schedule and procedures.

Procedures

If you have children in multiple grade levels, please come during the time slotted for your youngest child. Prior to coming to campus, write your child(ren)'s name and their teacher(s)'s name on a piece of paper to be displayed in your front window. We ask that everyone stay in their car during pickup. The procedure and steps for pickup are:

- Pull up to curb in front of the cafeteria
- Display child and teacher name
- Staff will collect forms (as needed)
- Tech device and learning materials will be handed through the car window

August 12, 2020 Updates

Opt-In Full Distance Learning Program

Students who **opted** for Full Distance Learning will remain in their current program with their assigned Distance Learning teacher. We have closed the registration at this time and any

exceptions for entrance and exit of the program needs principal approval. An email was sent yesterday to these families regarding tech device distribution and Meet and Greet.

Face to Face/Blended

Students who were planning on reporting to campus and attending in-person will remain with their assigned homeroom teacher during distance learning. Opening of School packets were distributed last week indicating your child's teacher. Packets are available for pick up at the front office if you have not gotten it yet.

The Hawaii DOE will be implementing a 3 phase plan over the next couple of weeks. This plan is **only applicable to our Face to Face/Blended students**.

Phase One, August 17th to 20th (In-Person Training)

We will be doing a drive thru pickup of tech device and learning materials on Monday, August 17th. Pick up will be at the cafeteria ramp. The schedule will be by grade level. Families with multiple children will come during the youngest child's pick up. The schedule and detailed instructions will be emailed to parents.

Students must turn in the following signed forms in order to borrow a tech device from the school and to participate in the online learning/platforms:

- Technology Device Loan Agreement
- Student Publication/Audio/Video Release
- Technology Responsible Use Form

Phase Two, August 24th to September 11th (Ready to Learn)

All students will be in distance learning. Special education services that cannot be provided in a distance learning format will be available in person. Our care coordinators will be working with students' IEP teams to make this determination. We are working on creating a learning lab for students with no wi-fi and will be sharing these plans with families next week.

- Expectations
 - Attendance will be taken daily
 - Teachers will meet with students everyday
 - Standards Based curriculum (Acellus and curriculum maps) with supplementary instruction provided based on teacher discretion
 - Teachers will share specific class expectations and schedules with their families

Phase Three, Beginning September 14th (Transition to Blended Learning)

HIDOE will continue to closely monitor the situation and work with the Governor's Office and the Hawaii State Department of Health to assess whether or not students can safely return to in-person blended learning models. If distance learning will continue for the remainder of the first quarter of school, an announcement will be made on **September 8th**. Our focus for students as they transition from distance learning to Face to Face/Blended will be on:

- Continue instructional plan
- Ensure there is minimal to no change in curriculum to minimize gap in instruction

Reminders

Breakfast and Lunch

Starting on August 17th, Oahu cafeterias will be serving only grab-and-go meals; in-person dining will not be allowed. Our grab-and-go service will be a drive-thru and will be located at the cafeteria ramp. Students must have money in their meal accounts unless they receive free breakfast and lunch. Students must be **present** in the car when grabbing their meal. Fill out the <u>Lunch Form</u> every morning by 8:15 AM to order lunch for the day. Here is our schedule:

August 24th - September 11th Breakfast- 7:30 AM to 8:00 AM Lunch- 11:30 AM to 12:00 PM

After- school Programs

After-school programs (A+) will be suspended until students return to in-person blended learning models.
