This assignment is an optional opportunity to recover a past summative grade if you are dissatisfied with your grade. Students who didn't earn credit on a past grade can recover their grade up to a 60. Students do weren't satisfied with the grade they earned can earn up to 20 points added to their current grade (max 100). The grade you earn on this assignment will reflect your effort and how well you followed the directions.
