

## **The Corporate Counsel Sections Guide to Hosting a CLE (Virtual)**

1. Decide on topic
2. Coordinate with speaker(s) on date and time of CLE. Plan on a minimum of 30 days lead time (e.g., if you want to hold a CLE in mid-Feb. plan on having topic, speakers and date and time firmed up by mid-Jan). We typically stay away from Mondays and Fridays for CLEs. We often schedule them from noon – 1 pm, but sometimes a breakfast CLE is a good draw and change of pace for attendees.
3. Once topic, speakers, and date and time are confirmed, draft a proposed marketing notice. The notice should contain the title and a brief synopsis of the CLE, the speaker(s) and bio(s) and date and time and, if in-person, location (See Exhibit A for a sample notice).
4. Once the marketing proposal is drafted, contact the Oregon State Bar CLE coordinator and let them know what other sections in addition to the Corporate Counsel Section we want to send the notice to (e.g., intellectual property, business litigation). If the event is virtual and the section is hosting it, select the “registration only” service (with this service option the bar will handle the registration process, but the section will be in charge of hosting the virtual event).
5. If applicable work with the speakers to fine-tune the event and gather written materials.
6. Submit the proposed CLE to the Oregon State Bar for accreditation (see Exhibit B for a sample of the form).
7. One or two days before the event, do a sound, video, and presentation check using the virtual platform. It is usually helpful for people to use a headset, but sometimes audio is OK without one, particularly if it is a single speaker rather than a panel. If the speaker is using slides, coordinate who will be running the slides during the presentation, the speaker or the host. Also, discuss the use of video and test it.
8. The day before the event the Oregon State Bar will provide an Excel spreadsheet with the first and last name of the registrant, bar #, and email address. This list is used to BCC the registrants with the link to the virtual meeting.

**\*Credit Calculation:**
