

Mentored Basic Climb Evaluation Form

The following criteria should be considered when selecting a Mentor and Climb. This is part of the Rock\Glacier leader badge requirements.

1. The same Mentor cannot be used for both Rock and Glacier climbs.
2. It is recommended, but not required that at least one mentor climb be a new and unfamiliar peak or route that has not been climbed by the Mentee.
3. For the Mentored Rock or Glacier Climb, the participants must be 50% current Basic Student affiliated with any branch. The climb may consist of as many rope teams as Mentee wishes.
4. The Mentored Climb must only have one mentor and one mentee in order to preserve the quality of the planning and leadership experience for the mentee.

Expectations:

1. Mentee sends a planning email with a planning document to mentor ahead of time.
2. Mentor reviews the plan and provides feedback.
3. Climb. Mentee does primary leading of trip.
4. Mentee completes "Mentee Post Trip Self Eval" (Page 2) and sends to mentor for feedback.
5. Mentor adds feedback to form (Page 3 and 4)
6. Mentee submits climb email, trip planning document, and this form to <https://forms.gle/9usbUzZhvYka7nbZA>

Technical Ability <i>Constructing anchors, performing belays, rope management, setting protection, navigation.</i>	
Judgment <i>What key decisions were made and how did the candidate involve participants in decision making? What risk management was demonstrated during the trip?</i>	
Coaching, Instruction, & Group Leadership <i>Inspires confidence, works well with the group, handles group dynamics effectively, keeps team working together, keeps calm. Communicates well with the team and ensures everyone is on the same page.</i>	
Problem Solving <i>Handles problems that come up, prepared and had contingency plans in place.</i>	

Time Management <i>How effectively was time managed? Did the trip conform to the planned times? If not, how was that managed?</i>
