Abstract

Abstract length should be at least 150 words and no longer than 300 words. Should contain a short summary of the study, its methodology, and the results and conclusion. Articles must be written in English.

INTRODUCTION

Manuscripts should use 1.5 spacing and be typed in Times New Roman, 11-point. Pages should be A4 with margins of 3 centimeters on all sides. Manuscript length must be at least 4500 words and no longer than 8000 words; this includes references, tables, figures, and appendices.

All English text should be regular and free of special formatting (no italics or bold lettering). Non-English words and terms must be italicized.

The introduction should provide a clear description of the topic discussed in the manuscript. The author should offer a descriptive explanation of the state of the art of the field about the topics described and how this study contributes to overall scholarship in that field. To that end, authors are expected to cite several relevant studies. The theoretical framework used to analyze the research problems may be included here. The final section of the introduction should contain a statement of the research problem or research questions that this study will answer.

LITERATURE REVIEW

Explain the concepts and theories used in the problem analysis. Use recent sources (from the last five years), prioritizing accredited scientific journals. Describe previous studies related to the study's focus.

RESEARCH METHOD

In this section, the author should provide clear descriptions of and explanations for the research methods used in their study. It is not necessary to include definitions for any methods used, but do offer explanations for why these methods were chosen. If the manuscript describes a quantitative study, this section should explain sample collection methodology, level of statistical confidence, margins of error, and sample sizes. For qualitative studies, authors should detail how the method was used, how informants were selected, and the total number of informants. Research location and reasons for selecting them should also be explained in detail.

RESULTS AND ANALYSIS

The author should place all study results and analysis of said results in this section. Results of the study should also be accompanied with a detailed description and analysis of the results. The author should describe how the results or findings of their study differ from those of previous published academic works.

Tables and Figures

A well-designed table complements and clarifies the text. Authors should review any tables and figures – if a table or figure does not significantly add to the impact of your manuscript, considering replacing it with text or removing it entirely.

Any tables and figures should be inserted on its own separate line, center-aligned.

Figures must be in picture format (i.e. .JPG, .PNG, .GIF) – manuscripts containing figures drawn in Microsoft Word will not be accepted.

Tables and figures should be numbered consecutively, with separate number series for tables and figures.

Any table captions must be placed before the table it describes. Tables cited from external sources should be placed below the table or figure. If the table or figure describes the author's study described in the manuscript, no source is necessary.

Do not repeat the contents of your abstract; it is sufficient for the author to offer any conclusions derived from the results of their study. This section should also include a description of potential applications for the results and/or suggestions relevant to the findings of their study.

REFERENCES

References must adhere to the APA 6 style guide. Authors should take extra care to ensure the titles and names relating to any works cited in their manuscript are spelled and formatted correctly.

Authors are permitted to cite their own works, but this should be done sparingly – excessive self-citation is generally frowned upon.
