

Dr. Tina Curry is an adjunct at DePaul University serving as an equity consultant in the Office of Innovative and Professional Learning and a professor of education at National-Louis University. Dr. Curry is an expert in equity in education and has trained educators in culturally responsive teaching and equity practices. Dr. Curry is currently an instructional lead coach at Fernwood Elementary School in Chicago.
