## **Call for Enrichment Proposals 2025**



The Yale Pathways to Arts & Humanities Summer Scholars program is a free, 2-week, on-campus summer program offered to local public high school students. Yale faculty, graduate students, and staff are invited to design and teach a one-off, 60-min enrichment in our summer program. We are seeking proposals that will spark students' imaginations and extend their learning beyond the walls of their high school classrooms. You can view last year's Closing Ceremony video to see the full breadth of the summer program.

The number of students will depend on the format of the session and instructor preference. Instructors can teach the same enrichment multiple times with different groups of students. Enrichments happen alongside 5-day workshops – both weeks, Monday through Thursday.

## Proposal Information needed

Please provide the following information for your proposed enrichment session.

- Instructor information (Name, dept, contact info, etc.)
- Working title of enrichment session
- Primary subject area
- Session format (Hands-on activity-based, interactive seminar, tour, etc.)
- Number of students you can accommodate
- Brief, **3-5 sentence description** of your session
- Any space requirements (any room with tables/chairs, room with movable tables, room with one large table, etc.)
- Availability
- Would you be willing to host the enrichment multiple times?
- Do you foresee any scheduling conflicts?
- What types of supplies will you require?

## **FAQs**

**Can I co-teach with multiple instructors?** Definitely. However, we find it's best for student experience if there are a maximum of 2-3 instructors collaborating on the entire enrichment rather than splitting it into a survey-style enrichment with instructors leading distinct parts.

What is the budget for supplies? Enrichment budgets vary greatly based on format. 1-hour enrichments might have supplies that total \$200, depending on the activity and number of students. However, there are many successful 1-hour enrichments that need very little in the way of materials.

What sort of in-classroom support will I receive? Each enrichment is assigned a Pathways Team member who handles student transportation and other non-content-related logistics. Note that the teaching assistants will likely not be subject matter experts, so they may not be well suited to troubleshooting experiments but can certainly help get students excited about the activities. They also won't be available to help with setup and breakdown because they will be taking students to activities throughout the day.
