Theme 1: History of contribution to the project

Objective: Specific practices used within projects that relate to onboarding new contributors and retaining existing contributors.

Theme 4: Findings from the quantitative survey

Objective: Dig deeper into areas of interest highlighted from the quantitative survey as identified by the Project Leads.

Question: Prior to this study, NumFocus have conducted a quantitative survey which came out with the following findings

1. The profile of a typical contributor can be summarized as upper class, highly educated, white male from North America and/or Central and Western Europe;
2. 14% of contributors consider themselves a member of URM groups. With gender, nationality and race being the largest categories.
3. People with disabilities and those who said they are from a minority group are less likely to feel included as compared with other respondents;
