You never realize just how much worldbuilding you've done until you write a glossary this long.

You can jump to a certain letter by clicking View→ Show document outline.

# \*A\*

<u>Adult</u> - The fourth of the five stages of life for the Fairykind, characterized by full physical and sexual maturity, coming into one's full magic pool, and an "adult" set of wings. Gyne freckles turn red, brown, orange, or black during this time. This stage occurs between the ages of 140,000 and 180,000. "Adult height" is reached at this point, though this is not as tall as most fae will grow in their lives. See also, Senescent.

*Aengus* - One of the Tuatha Dé Danann; son of the Dagda. He's the one who bestowed the powers of love on the Eros bloodline. He was deeply in love with a damsel named Caer, whom he first saw in a dream. He could also turn his kisses into birds.

Afanc - The order of classification for Snobulacs and Yugopotamians, among other creatures.

<u>Age of Majority</u> - Not a term I made up, but probably worth noting. Age of majority means that one has reached the legal age of adulthood, so they can do things like legally sign documents and drink. For Fairies, this would be 200,000 years of age, for pixies it's 250,000 years of age, and for Anti-Fairies it's 150,000 years of age. As far as the anti-pixies are concerned, if you can hold your own cup, you can drink soda.

<u>Alux</u> (Faedivus milpa) - A subspecies of Fairies with extravagant crowns who are associated with wisdom and are invisible if you aren't looking directly at them. The plural form is aluxo'ob. They frequent the Mesopotamia and South American areas. Their patron is the owlfly, their food weakness is popcorn, their nymphs have bell-shaped exoskeletons, and most of them tend to be claustrophobic. The anti-alux patron is the Jamaican greater-eared funnel bat.

<u>Amazon</u> - A race of about a hundred or two beings who have secluded themselves in Cherish Jungle. They're capable of crossbreeding, although they rarely do and will generally be thrown out by their own people for it. They worship a chicken god and wear colorful headdresses. Their patron is the fowl tick, their food weakness is chicken, and their babies are shaped a bit like five-petaled flowers. Neither amazons nor anti-amazons have wings (See also, "Chicken Poofs").

<u>Ambassador</u> - A spokesperson for a particular race who meets with the Fairy Council and the other ambassadors during Council meetings; each Fairy subspecies has one (except the amazons who don't want to be a part of politics). The High Count, Countess, and their heir function as ambassadors for the Anti-Fairy class as a whole, and the Head Pixie was named ambassador for the Pixies by default. Ambassadors might be elected, appointed by the Council, or the position might be inherited through a royal line- it's the preference of the race. Though meant to speak for their race as a whole, they have little political power, and generally focus more on their physical location anyway.

<u>Amity Angel Safety and Protective Recall Agency</u> - The officials in charge of determining which humans are in need of Fairy godparents and when a human is happy and no longer needs them. If you carry a license allowing you to work with human godkids, then you're affiliated with these guys. There are other divisions for other races (for example, Amity Yugopotamian Safety and Protective Recall Agency).

<u>Amity Angel Safety and Protective Recall Agency v. Abdul</u> - A court case which ruled that only those with current godparent licenses are allowed to act as godparents, and if you don't have a license and are not assigned to the godkid in question then you're not allowed to "springboard off" their wish and/or grant their wishes directly. Nice going, Binky.

<u>Angel</u> - The official class name for humans. These days it's only used in official documents.

<u>Anthill, The</u> - A sugar bar found in Pixie World. Name is a reference to the "Ant and the Grasshopper" fable.

Anti-Cosma v. Adelinda von Strangle - This court case allows Anti-Fairies, Pixies, and Anti-Pixies to interact with humans as much as they want, so long as they're acting as neutral parties. Only if they are being obviously antagonistic are Fairies allowed to interfere, at their own risk (See also, *Pinewater v. Shadewind*). Anti-Cosmo himself is the one who fought for it.

Anti-Fairy (Class) - Encompasses all thirty-four subspecies of Anti-Fairy in addition to the anti-pixies (who aren't yet recognized as an official class although they probably should be). Almost all Anti-Fairies have blue fur, pointed ears, and bat wings. All Anti-Fairies have the ability to echolocate. They can be warded off through the use of good-luck charms and other superstitious behaviors, such as knocking on wood or throwing spilled salt over your shoulder. They also can't see transparent glass and tend to ram into it if navigating with their eyes, or get confused when their sonar doesn't bounce off items they can see on the other side. All Anti-Fairies are cube-shaped, no matter the race, and take their wings after their father's.

Anti-Fairy (Faeumbra fae) - A subspecies of Anti-Fairy with black six-pointed crowns. Their patron is the Mexican free-tailed bat. Their food weakness is chicken cordon bleu.

<u>Anti-Fairy Council. The</u> - Three elected representatives who each speak for one of the three regions in Anti-Fairy World: the Navy Robe of the High South region, the Teal of the Lower East, and the Maroon of the Far West. The Fairy Elder loans whoever holds these positions a portion of her power, which has certain effects- they can channel magic without using a wand, and their appearances are affected; specifically, their fur color changes to tints closer to their Robe colors.

Anti-Firebox v. Ivywish - A court case which states that business owners can refuse to serve "anyone whom they deem suspicious and/or threatening"; i.e. it ruled that discrimination by Fairies against other races (namely Anti-Fairies and later Pixies) is justified. See also, Ivywish.

<u>Anti-Gonzo v. Fairy World</u> - A court case which ruled that members of the Unseelie Court (later was extended to include Pixies as well) can consume sugar as they please and should not be held

to the laws of the Fairies which formerly told them not to. See also, *Mintwave v. Wandflick*. Anti-Cosmo's paternal grandfather fought for this.

Anti-Pixie (Faeumbra quadratum) - A subspecies of Anti-Fairy with green fur and yellow hair. They reproduce parthenogenetically (asexually) and their natural six-pointed crowns are always broken. They also wear yellow coats with red spots and other clashing colors, such as bright blue undershirts, pink- and orange-striped ties, purple pants, and mismatched shoes. They are led by the H.A.P., or Head Anti-Pixie, who used to be H.P.'s counterpart until he was overthrown by Anti-Sanderson. They live above Rio de Janeiro on Plane 4 of existence, quarantined on an island cloud called Anti-Pixie Isle, the most notable locations of said island being the amusement park and the Lotus Palace. Their patron is the spectacled flying fox. These guys appeared in the "Clash With the Anti-World" video game.

<u>Aos Sí</u> - The ancient ancestors of all the Fairykind. It's said that they had six hands, six eyes, and were all hermaphrodite. They were made up of three distinct segments - *Faedivus*, *Faeumbra*, and *Faelumen*. Religion claims that following the Sealing War, they began to split from stress and magical back-up, and over millions of years, broke into different "subspecies", and eventually shattered their old selves completely and became Fairies, Anti-Fairies, and Refractedall of whom share the same core.

Apex - The rounded or pointed tip of a Fairy's or pixie's wing.

<u>Aphrodite Protocol</u> - A "legal superpower" that allows the Eros Triplets to bypass other laws and "do anything they want" so long as they can prove it relates to love or reproduction.

As The Dragonfly Skims - As the crow flies; measures distance by wing without taking the topography of the landscape into account.

Asphyxiation - Again, something worth noting even though I didn't make up this term. Asphyxiation means "Death caused by not being able to breathe". Technically, the Fairykind can't drown, because they don't have lungs that would fill with water- they just asphyxiate due to not being able to draw magic from the universal energy field into their system.

<u>Attraction Signals</u> - Various pulses automatically put out by magical beings that allow other magical beings to detect their presence, and attract the energy field.

# \*B\*

<u>Banshee</u> (Faedivus turgidus) - A subspecies of Fairies with massive three-pointed crowns, usually in pastel colors. Their patron is the cicada, their food weakness is deviled eggs, their nymphs have slightly crown-shaped exoskeletons, and it shuts down their system if you cover their mouth. The anti-banshee patron is the giant golden-crowned flying fox.

<u>Barbegazi</u> (Faedivus diaemus) - A subspecies of Fairies with white bat wings, of all things. Their patron is the snow scorpionfly, which they share biology with despite the wing issue. Their food weakness is granola, their nymphs have almost pine tree-shaped exoskeletons, and since they don't function well in heat, they stick to cold areas of the world. The anti-barbegazi patron is the Honduran white bat.

*Barrenglades, The* - Plane 4 of existence. The Fairies consider it to be a bit of a wasteland, due possibly to the fact that some Anti-Fairies live here, although not too many because it is, well, a wasteland. Consider it the rural farm area of Anti-Fairy World. Anti-Pixie World and Giant Bucket of Acid World can be found here too.

<u>Barrier, The</u> - The magical forcefield that separates the Sunrise Skies from the Sunset Skies. Anti-Fairies can sometimes find chinks in its walls and slip out. Otherwise, you can only enter and exit through the Divide Gate- you can't teleport to one side from the other. See also, Divide [Gate], The.

*Beanstalk, The* - One of two apartment complexes in Pixie World. According to cloudland directions, it's to the west of Headquarters.

*Beast* - A race of fantastic beings that the Fairykind typically don't associate with. See also, Coblynau.

<u>Bit Bridge, The</u> - The Bridge that directly connects Planes 2 and 3 via Inkblot, Pixie World and Mushroom Rock, Kansas. It was formed some time following the War of the Angels and is currently still in use today.

Black Egg - If an Anti-Fairy consumes too much sugar while pregnant, this can damage their eggs and turn them gray. If an egg goes "black", it is technically dead and will result in a zombie-like pup with little coordination, the inability to keep food down or channel magic, and other impairments.

Blitz - Not a particularly nice word at all. May also refer to mating.

<u>Blood Processed Sugar Content</u> - The equivalent of blood-alcohol content. Under <u>Mintwave v.</u>

Wandflick, it's against the law to practice magic with a blood sugar concentration of .10 or more.

<u>Blue Castle, The</u> - The executive building in Anti-Fairy World. Also known as Anti-Cosmo's Castle ("Welcome not!").

<u>Blue Magic</u> - "Speed magic"; magic triggered when one acts against someone or something; commonly associated with stress and irritation. This color shows up in magical fights. Blue magic wears off on its own once feelings of irritation have subsided, and may last for days or weeks or even a lifetime. A nymph fertilized with blue magic will become sick and possibly even die if the reason its parents had "blue feelings" disappears. Blue magic tastes salty. See also, Indigo Magic.

*Buohyrine* - The chemical that allows the Fairykind to fly. Only damsels with wings are capable of producing this in their milk. A nymph fed the milk of a damsel who doesn't have wings won't be able to fly unless they receive buohyrine milk before the age of five.

<u>Bres</u> - The crossbred king who rose to the throne after Nuada lost his hand and was forced to step down, since "no one with a blemish could rule the Tuatha Dé Danann". He ruled for seven years, and was killed by Lugh after drinking poisoned milk from Lugh's three hundred wooden cows. He was a pretty-boy.

Brownie (Faedivus mundus) - A subspecies of Fairies with long noses, natural fabric hats in a variety of colors, and often buck teeth. They're very, very good at getting into places and seem to have an instinct to tidy things up. They fall at the bottom of the social ladder due to their venomous bite, and it shows. Their saliva sucks the magic out of things. Their patron is the assassin bug, their food weakness is ham, and their nymphs have octagonal exoskeletons. The anti-brownie patron is the common vampire bat. See also, Inrita.

<u>Brownie-Kisser</u> - A slur with its roots in the idea that brownies as a race are naturally dumb and shy and easily taken advantage of; someone with a brownie for a significant other would be viewed as not being able to "get anyone better"; a "brownie-kisser" is often viewed as desperate, easy, slutty, or even a rapist.

*Bundle* - Anti-Fairies tend to be community sleepers and snuggle together when they hang upside-down for the night. This is called bundling. See also, Roosting Room.

<u>Burrow</u> - The underground tunnel system home of Earthside will o' the wisps.

\*C\*

*Cairbre* - A famous poet of the Tuatha Dé Danann. He wrote a satirical poem about King Bres this one time.

<u>Camarilla [Court]</u> - Members of the Anti-Fairy aristocracy who eat and live with their mates, children, and the High Count and Countess in the Blue Castle; the High Count chooses six for his camarilla, one for each element of the zodiac differing from the year he was born in, and the High Countess chooses six others who weren't born in her year either.

Candle - A young genie; term can apply from infancy to preadolescence.

<u>Cath Maige Tuired</u> - The battle in which King Nuada lost his hand to Sreng.

Cetus - A magical outer space whale! Sometimes you get skyships hunting these.

*Cherish Jungle* - A jungle slightly west of Pixie World (by the cloudland directions), although it is on Plane 4, not Plane 3 where Inkblot City can be found (that would be where the Pixie Woods are).

<u>Cherub</u> (Faedivus ciconiidae) - A subspecies of Fairies with feathered wings. and no natural crown. Their patron is the stork, their food weakness is pancakes, their nymphs have oval-shaped exoskeletons, and they're wired to have an obsession with counting seeds like vampires. The anti-cherub patron is the common raven.

*Chick* - A young Yugopotamian; also the name for a young Refract, most commonly under the age of forty-five.

<u>Chesberry</u> - Black trees with pink leaves. Their wood is used to make "well-rounded" wands. It grows food that tastes so bland to Fairies that it's more useful for the wand thing and to make chesberry parchment which, being made from a magical tree, will make any deal magically binding if signed. When it comes to wands, the Anti-Fairy equivalent is ebony.

*Chiropatagium* - The half of an Anti-Fairy wing membrane furthest from the body; it's synced up with the part of a Seelie wing that extends from jugal fold to apex. I can't imagine using this word in my work other than in the most pompous of circumstances. See also, Plagiopatagium.

Claimh Solais - The magical sword that belonged to King Nuada. The Fairy Elder owns it now.

<u>Claystrif</u> - A small town located on Plane 3, on the other side of Pixie Woods from Pixie World. Also known as Patio World due to its famous wooden carvings. There's a shrine to Mother Nature and Father Time here as well.

*Click* - A light green coin used in the cloudlands, manufactured from various materials, including the wood of the dalia tree. Three click pieces make a lyn. A single click comes out to be about three dollars in current American money. See also, Lagelyn.

*Cloud* - In this glossary, it refers to the solid ground that makes up the cloudlands. "Undercloud" would be the equivalent of "underground".

*Cloudcliff* - The edge of a cloud; fall or jump from the edge and you can descend planes of existence until you hit another cloud.

*Cloudjump v. Anti-Shale* - A court case which ruled that riding the trams repeatedly to exploit them for cheap food is not okay. Arguably allows prejudice against the homeless.

<u>Cloudlands. The</u> - Fairy World, Anti-Fairy World, Pixie World, and Anti-Pixie Isle across various planes of existence.

Cloudlength - A unit of measurement between a mile and a kilometer.

*Cloudship* - A skyship that only travels the cloudlands (Usually a merchant or transport ship for those without wings).

<u>Cloudstone</u> - A building material for many roads and buildings in the cloudlands, like bricks.

<u>Coblynau</u> - A phylum under the kingdom Fantastica; for creatures contaminated with magical reside; hybrid fantastic beings. Beasts, really.

<u>Cohuleen Druith</u> - A magical hat that allows one to breathe underwater. The standard design is gray with a star on the tip filled with infinite squid ink.

Cold Shoulder Syndrome - See also, Finella Reflex.

Color-Eye Virus - See also, Iris.

<u>Company Vice President</u> - Heir to the seat of Head Pixie; Mr. Longwood currently holds this title, and his duties include overseeing deliveries, watching over the young pixies, following up with the interns, organizing night watches, checking in with the Head of the Complaints Department, and grocery shopping.

*Cortycus* - A nutrient that promotes the growth of the core; until nymphs begin producing it themselves at about the age of one, it can only be gained from the milk of a Fairy damsel and is so essential that a Fairy or pixie will die without it.

Cosma Mutation - A genetic mutation in the fairy genepool that renders a fairy unable to use magic or fly without drinking nursing milk. Side effects include mental impairment, poor memory, distractibility, and random periods of near-asphyxiation. This mutation was eventually named after Cosmo when he became infamous during his Terrible Twos and is the reason fairy drakes had to get their tubes stopped up, and no fairy babies could be born.

Costa - Basically the top part of an insect's wing.

<u>Cotton Candy Oatmeal</u> - A slang phrase H.P. uses in place of "approach-avoidance conflict", or doing something that you really don't want to do if it means there's a chance you'll get something you want in return. It's not very important, but it does come up a few times. I named it after my favorite color of Crocs because my mom and I were shopping and when I read the sign I couldn't stop laughing.

*Core* - One of the three alleged parts of the soul and the centermost part of being. It's very sensitive and will result in a lot of pain if damaged. What the physical manifestation of one's core becomes depends on the being in question (H.P.'s core is a laser cannon, as seen in "The Fairly Oddlympics", Wanda's is a radar, and Cosmo's is a sort of bowl to allow for more storage space). The Unseelie Court will always have the same core as their primary counterpart.

<u>Core-Sync</u> - That thing that causes Anti-Fairies to mirror their counterparts in terms of being injured and mating.

*Core Trait* - The personality trait that a corresponding set of *Faedivus*, *Faeumbra*, and *Faelumen* inherently share; the "center drive".

<u>Council Meeting</u> - In these meetings the Fairy Council, Anti-Fairy Council, and all the ambassadors gather together to discuss anything that has been deemed important. These meetings are called when there's something important to be discussed and aren't regularly scheduled.

<u>Courtship Dance</u> - That thing that fairies do when they're in love, or showing off.

<u>Cù Sith</u> - A fairy dog. They were brought into existence by some nixes long ago in the hopes of rescuing the lost Tuatha Dé Danann from the center of the Earth. As a result, they're biologically wired to dig and to attack rodent-like creatures such as moles. They'll "swap souls" with you if they catch you committing one of the Three Deep Sins; literally, you will end up in a dog body and they'll take over yours. The plural form is coin sith.

### \*D\*

<u>Dagda, The</u> - One of the Tuatha Dé Danann and viewed as the god of life and death. He has a magic staff and a bottomless cauldron called Undry that satisfies all those who eat from it. He was also a massive flirt.

*Dalia* - A tree whose soft green wood is used in making lagelyn bills and coins. Since it's a magical tree, this wood prevents the Fairykind from messing with the money-duplicating it and such. Only a small amount is actually in the bills and coins and money can still be teleported.

*Damsel* - A female member of the Fairykind; taken from the insect "damselfly". "Damseline" means "feminine".

<u>Daoine [Sìth]</u> - Allegedly the single united form taken by a linked *Faedivus*, *Faeumbra*, and *Faelumen* upon death. It's said the Daoine have six hands, six eyes, and are hermaphrodite. They frequently have markings (the Aos Sí did not) which resemble those on them in life (such as patches around their eyes in place of glasses). They lose their magic at this time.

Daoism - That formerly unnamed Fairykind religion which suggests that after death, a fairy, anti-fairy, and refract unite in Daoine form after death. The Refracted are the most obsessed with this religion, with Fairies split down the middle. A few Anti-Fairies are Daoist, but it's uncommon.

Dayfry - The oldest son of Tarrow the Luck-Twister. His zodiac is Love and his day of the week is Friday. The Love Temple is located in the High South (Navy) Region.

*Dazzled* - A slang term from around the time Cosmo, Wanda, their counterparts, and the pixies were growing up. Replaced "jazzed". It simply means "Cool" or "Awesome".

*Deep Kingdom* - Planes of Existence 1-12. The Barrier divides Fairy World and Anti-Fairy World from Plane 3 upward, but Fairy World and Anti-Fairy World fuse together in Plane 13, where reality begins to fuzz.

Deep Sins - See also, Three Deep Sins.

Delegating Administrative Rules of the Known Universe, The - The full title of Da Rules.

<u>Delkians</u> - Aliens inspired by centipedes.

<u>Dentin Bloodline</u> - The Tooth Fairy's family.

<u>Diapause</u> - The insect equivalent of hibernation. Can kick in when a Fairy or Pixie who has been regularly eating well heads into very cold temperatures. They can only be woken by having their magical particles warmed up again, such as via SHAMPAX ("Sleeping Beauty" and "Rip Van Studwell", anyone?) Gynes are more susceptible to it, and especially if pregnant.

<u>Digi-Stream</u> - Magical Fairy and Anti-Fairy Internet, basically. Exists only in the Deep Kingdom.

<u>Direct Muscular Structure</u> - The type of wing design that [full-blooded] fairies have. The muscles pull directly on the wings to flap. This wing structure allows fairies to manipulate each of their four wings independently. Sylphs almost have this wing structure.

<u>Divide [Gate]. The</u> - The gate in the Barrier where people can pass between the Sunset Skies and the Sunrise Skies. You have to be invited through by someone on the other side who has legal permission to allow you to cross, although authority figures like Jorgen and the Fairy Council can barge their way through and allow others to follow after them. See also, Barrier, The.

<u>Divide License</u> - A small black badge engraved with a white star, two dark blue slashes, and another white star. Those who have these badges are allowed to pass through the Divide at will.

The High Count, High Countess, and members of the Anti-Fairy Council all have these badges. Foop, being heir to the High Count seat, has one too.

<u>Dökkálfar</u> - A phylum under the kingdom Fantastica; for creatures who dwell "below ground".

<u>Dot Bridge, The</u> - The spotted green and yellow Bridge that was supposed to directly connect Planes 2 and 4 via present-day Anti-Pixie Isle and Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. It was never actually finished.

Dome - See also, Forehead Chamber.

Domestic Magic - See also, Kitchen Wand.

"Don't flap your wings dustless" - "Chill out", "Calm down".

*Drake* - A male member of the Fairykind; taken from the insect "dragonfly". "Drakian" means "masculine".

Drone - If you're not a kabouter and not a gyne, then you're a drone. Drones tend to be simple-minded and are wired to follow the crowd, work hard, and speak quietly and briefly if at all. They're also born sterile for life about 75% of the time (and thus gynes are biologically driven to reproduce more often to ensure the continuation of their genes through non-sterile offspring). Drones generally require the guidance of a dominant figure to survive and contribute to society. Their understanding of object permanence may be limited and they tend to cling to people, places, hobbies, and familiar things very strongly. All unfreckled pixies are drones (although none are technically sterile due to the nature of *Wolbachia*). The "drone gene" does not affect the Unseelie counterparts.

<u>Duende</u> (Faedivus denudo) - A subspecies of Fairies with no natural crown, and no gravitational field to hold a crown even if they're crossbreeds. Their patron is the housefly, they don't have food weaknesses unless they're crossbreeds and share the weakness of the other parent, their nymphs are wide and oval-shaped, and it shuts down their system if you put anything directly on their head. The anti-duende patron is the Phillipine naked-backed fruit bat.

<u>Dustfinger v. Cadence von Strangle</u> - A court case which ruled that godkids can keep their godparents through to adulthood if it can be proven they have an utter physical dependency upon their godparent, such as if they choose to live alone in the desert with no friends and limited access to food and water, or if there is reason to believe the godkid will be drastically damaging to society without a godparent. This is also known as Utter Dependency Clause, and Juandissimo called the "drastically damaging" loophole just before "Remy Rides Again" to justify returning Remy's memories. See also, *Magnifico v. Amity Angel Safety and Protective Recall Agency*.

Dusty - In the right context, it may be the equivalent of "bloody". See also, Going Dusty.

<u>Dwarf</u> (Faedivus taenarius) - An all-male subspecies of Fairies, so all of them these days are crossbreeds. They are considered magical "dead zones" who can't be *poof*ed anywhere by starpiece magic, and they even drain the magic out of magical objects, if given enough time. They're natural enemies of lawn gnomes. Their patron is the harvester ant, their food weakness is mushrooms, their nymphs have "gem-shaped" exoskeletons, and almost all of them are agoraphobic. The anti-dwarf patron is the dwarf little fruit bat.

\*E\*

<u>Earthside</u> - The state of being on Earth as opposed to residing in the cloudlands.

<u>Eastern Elf</u> (Faedivus cobble) - This is the subspecies of elf that normally resides in Fairy World. They're the only ones of the subspecies to naturally have wings and they can turn various materials into shoes and clothes. See also, Elf.

<u>Ebonii v. Cairo</u> - A court case which ruled that after the memories of a godkid or other witnesses are erased, all memories must be kept in storage in the Fairy World Archives basement until they die.

Echolocation - See also, Sonar.

<u>Effervescence</u> - "Magical carbon dioxide"; genie tails are made of this, and their lamps are full of it. It's also that blue glow Santa gets when he takes on all Fairy power every year. <u>H.P. gets it during Digi-Stream Tuesday too</u>.

*Electors* - The beings who represent Choice; the name those who became Fairies gave themselves after the Sluagh, but before Fairies.

<u>Elf</u> - A division of the Fairy classification with three subspecies: eastern, western, and northern. Despite these three varieties, all have pointed caps with spikes at the base (caps being blue, green, or similar shades), have the honey bee for their patron, share honey as their food weakness, can't do magic without wearing shoes, and have nymphs with dodecahedron exoskeletons. The anti-elf patron is the bumblebee bat.

*Elru* - Basically Spanish, but before Spain existed.

<u>Emper</u> - Cosmo's hometown; play on "Ember" (Fun fact: China Mayfleet used to live in the city of Emper, but I laughed too much at the reference and had to swap the names, so now she lives in Lau Rell).

*Epipole v. Fairy World* - A court case which prohibits outsiders from interfering with the will o' the wisp lifestyle, given that most of them live underground in their burrows and very few interact with the Fairies anyway.

<u>Equiangular Mutation</u> - The unofficial nickname given to the Pixie "square" mutation; named "equiangular" because I Googled "fancy word for rectangle" one time.

*Egg* - The first of the five stages of life for the Fairykind. Must be fertilized both physically and magically in order to create life.

Egg Nest - Basically the ovaries, except there's only one of them, and it's located in the forehead chamber. It houses all the eggs a Fairykind drake will produce in his lifetime (between eight hundred and a thousand five hundred) and is sometimes referred to as an "egg bubble". The "bubble" around the eggs is very difficult to pierce, but if it were pierced, all the eggs would die.

Energy Field, [The Universal Magical] - The substance in the universe that allows members of the Seelie Court to breathe and use magic. You can imagine it being given off by the Big Wand. Seelie are connected to this field via their invisible magic lines, and if all their lines become disconnected, they will asphyxiate. You'll want to read this post and this post for more.

<u>Eros Bloodline</u> - Cupid's family line. Their command and influence over the forces of love passes down through their blood. As a result, they kill off any wayward children to prevent spreading this power. Only the Triplet of the Morning (currently Cupid) is allowed (and required) to reproduce, and strict rules are associated with this, one of them being that all babies who aren't triplets (or quadruplets, quintuplets, etc.) will be killed.

*Eros Menagerie* - A sort of "zoo" or collection of every species in the universe maintained at peak environmental conditions; even animals considered extinct elsewhere in the universe are housed here.

*Eros Nest* - Cupid's business and place of residence; sometimes called the Cherub Nest or the Love Nest. This is where you'll find the menagerie, the "control room" where he and his brothers work, extensive lineages for humans and Fairykind, and almost every yoo-doo doll in existence.

<u>Eros Standard Time</u> - The Greenwich Mean Time equivalent in the magical world. Dimmsdale and Faeheim are at +2 EST. Pixie World is at +3 EST. Anti-Cosmo's castle is at +10 EST.

<u>Eros Triplets</u> - The Triplets of the Morning, Afternoon, and Evening; they work together to fulfill their sacred duties concerning the powers of love and reproduction. Cupid is the Triplet of the Morning and works his shift from midnight to eight in the morning. His brother Lucius then takes over until four in the afternoon, and Apuleius works from then until midnight. Their mother Venus was the former Triplet of the Morning, with the Afternoon Triplet being her sister Charite and the Evening Triplet her brother Ludell. Cupid is currently trying to breed the next heirs to the Eros bloodline, but hasn't yet succeeded.

*Eros v. Longwood* - A court case which ruled that pixies are forbidden from being in any Fairy World time zone where the time has passed seven in the evening. Additionally, pixies can only mate in Pixie World, or Cupid is legally allowed to arrest them. See also, Kalahari Act.

*Exoskeleton* - The "layer of blubber" around a Fairykind baby. Shapes vary with species (Poof is round, Foop is square, Goldie is triangular, pixies are hexagonal). The exoskeleton is "shed" during a stage of development called instar, after which the nymph will have a body closer to the shape of what you would expect. Not entirely a *real* exoskeleton, since it's been implied on multiple occasions that Foop has a square skull.

#### \*F\*

Fae, The - Ethnicity of the Fairies; mostly referred to only in official documents and by outside races, like aliens and maybe genies and such.

Faedivus - The genus name of the Fairies (and Pixies). Essentially means "godly fairies".

<u>Faeheim</u> - The capital city of Fairy World, found on Plane 5; this is where the Rainbow Bridge connects, where the Big Wand is located, where the Fairy Elder lives, and where the Capitol building can be found.

Faelumen - The genus name of the Refracted. Essentially means "light fairies".

Faeumbra - The genus name of the Anti-Fairies. Essentially means "shadow fairies".

<u>Fairy (Class)</u> - The class that encompasses all thirty-four subspecies of Fairies. All subspecies can interbreed, but <u>usually</u> cannot reproduce beyond the boundaries of this class. Pixies were considered members of the Fairy class until after *Whimsifinado v. Fairy World*.

<u>Fairy</u> (Faedivus fae) - The highest race on the social ladder. Their courtship involves a dance unique to each pair, and they notch the costas of each other's wings in the same pattern after they've bonded. They have four long wings and are the only species capable of rotating each

independently (though sylphs can do this to a very slight degree). Their patron is the dragonfly, their food weakness is rump roast, their nymphs have round exoskeletons, and they're biologically wired to feel anxious around fish.

*Fairy Council, The* - Four elected representatives who each speak for one of the four regions in Fairy World: the Purple Robe of the Central Star region, Blue of the High North, Green of the Lower West, and Pink of the Far East. The Fairy Elder loans whoever holds these positions a portion of her power, which has certain effects- they can channel magic without using a wand, and their appearances are affected; with equal heights and body structures, the idea is to promote the idea of unity.

*Fairy Elder. The* - The last of the Tuatha Dé Danann; the supreme being in Fairy culture. She wears yellow robes, has a very calm personality, and uses words such as "thee, thy, thine" and "thou". She wears a talisman of immortality around her neck given to her by Mother Nature and Father Time that prevents her from getting sick, and cured all the sickness from her past.

*Fairykind* - Includes Fairies, Pixies, Anti-Fairies, Anti-Pixies, and Refracts.

Fagigglyne - A chemical that powers the faggiggly gland. It's first passed to children via milk from the mother; they'll produce it on their own when they're older.

Fagigglytus - A magical illness that sticks a sick Fairykind in a single form and leaves them unable to shapeshift out of it. Usually passes within a day, or sometimes up to three. Not to be confused with a fagiggly gland "going bad", which involves rapid changing between various shapes.

<u>Falak Beans</u> - A bean from the Lower East Region that can be ground into the coffee that H.P. likes to drink.

Fantastica - The main Kingdom of classification we're dealing with here.

<u>Far Darrig</u> (Faedivus mus) - A subspecies of Fairies with pointed hats, ruffled collars around their necks, and flushed cheeks. Their patron is the rat (they take their wings from their non-far

darrig parent). Their food weakness is string cheese, their nymphs appear to be literal rats with pointed hats, and their systems shut down if you tickle them. The anti-far darrig patron is the desert long-eared bat.

Father Angel - Essentially God. Gets referenced sometimes, but isn't going to show up in my work or play any sort of major role.

<u>Father Time</u> - A nature spirit with control over time. Has a chipper personality, but his appearance may vary depending on either your idea of fatherhood or what you think he should look like. Sort of the brother of and sort of the husband of Mother Nature. He's supposed to be an impartial figurehead.

Fetal Sugar Syndrome - The equivalent of fetal alcohol syndrome. It's likely to lead to some mental and physical damage, along with altered facial features. See also, Black Egg.

Fez - A mild curse word in Genie culture. Refers to a genie's hat, obviously. May also come in the variation "fezzing".

<u>Field-Sight</u> - Fairies or Pixies who have triggered field-sight (by briefly rolling their eyes back in their heads) are able to see the colors of magic in the world around them. Things like clothing and facial features won't show up. Humans do not appear in the energy field unless they've recently come in contact with a magical item or magical being. The Unseelie lack this ability.

*First General* - The highest rank an Anti-Fairy can achieve short of sitting on the Fairy Council or being born heir to the High Count or Countess seat. This person leads the central army into battle and weighs in on plans and tactics.

<u>Finella Reflex</u> - The name for a Seelie's instinct to destroy their Unseelie counterpart. Strongest when an Unseelie is in a Seelie's territory (as determined by the strength of pheromones). "Finella" translates to "white shoulder", and the reflex is sometimes known as "cold shoulder syndrome".

*Finfolk (Faedivus lympha)* - A subspecies of Fairies without natural crowns and without wings. They have a tendency to kidnap people and drag them down underwater, which they can breathe in. On land, they always have to wear "wetsuits". Their patron is the minnow, actually. Their food weakness is worms (especially Gummi worms), their nymphs have conch shell-shaped exoskeletons, and they can't breathe if their gills aren't kept damp, hence the wetsuits. The anti-finfolk patron is the *soprano pipistrelle*.

<u>Flight Casings</u> - The hard seals covering the wings of newborn nymphs. They'll crack down the center and fall off when the nymph begins to drink milk for the first time. Until the casings are shed, the nymph won't have the ability to fly (unless they were wishbirthed, because then the touch of magic will have caused the flight casings to shed from the get-go).

*Florifae* - A phylum under the kingdom Fantastica; for fantastic beings who are plant-based.

*Fomorians* - One of the races who existed in the Great Dawn; they are further subdivided into Genies, Merfolk, and Milesians.

<u>Forehead Chamber</u> - According to canon, Fairies and Pixies (and therefore presumably Anti-Fairies) are able to push back their foreheads to reveal "hollow chambers". In a forehead chamber you will find the core as well as various other body parts like the ovaries (in drakes). Because of this, "opening your dome" in front of strangers is considered public indecency. The flesh is very sensitive in this area and easily damaged.

Forewing - The two upper wings of a four-winged insect; larger than the hindwings.

*Fritz* - The state of magic lines rapidly disconnecting and reconnecting to the energy field. See also, Magic Lines and Tingle-Fritzy.

<u>Gathering</u> - A will o' the wisp ceremony where trading of drakes and children occurs between members of the same burrow system.

<u>Get Flappy Reprise (GFR) AU</u> - AU where the original draft of "School's Out! - The Musical" went through and Flappy Bob is really Imaginary Gary in disguise. On this list because I'm tentatively planning to write a fanfic based on this AU called "Get Flappy Reprise - The Sort-of Musical".

*Ghost* - A race of fantastic beings that the Fairykind typically don't associate with.

<u>Gingertie</u> - Heavyset, red trees. Their wood is used to make "defensive" wands. This is the thickest, heaviest wand variety and the only one capable of deflection incoming magical blasts. However, it's very slow at using magic. The anti-pixies have the last supply of gingertie trees on Anti-Pixie Isle. When it comes to wands, the Anti-Fairy equivalent is flint.

<u>Goblin</u> (Faedivus avaritia) - A subspecies of Fairies with a five-pointed crown, each point topped with a small ball. Their patron is the fungus gnat, their food weakness is mushrooms, their nymphs have mushroom-shaped exoskeletons, and they overheat easily since they can't feel cold. The anti-goblin patron is the little goblin bat.

*Going Dusty* - A euphemism for death among the Seelie. The Anti-Fairy equivalent is, of course, either "going smoky" or "gone to smoke".

Going Tomte - See also, Tomte.

Gootie-Goggling - An old-fashioned slang term for checking someone out.

*Grasshopper, The* - A sugar bar on Anti-Pixie Isle. Name is a reference to the "Ant and the Grasshopper" fable.

<u>Gravitational Field</u> - That patch of space above one's head that allows them to hold a crown or other small items like hats and flower pots. The more magic you inherently have (see also, Magic

Pool), the more distance between your head and crown. And, well, having more magic is generally considered to make you more attractive, so...

*Great Dawn* - "Ancient Times"; everything before the Sealing War is considered to be the Great Dawn. This is the time period when races like the Aos Sí and the Tuatha Dé Danann were still alive and thriving. Yugopotamians, the Bodacians, the Snobulacs, Rhymepyes, and the Molpa-Pel existed too.

Great Flood - Exactly what you would expect it to be.

**Great Ice Times** - Periods of great freezing during various Ice Ages.

<u>Great Sidhe</u> - A large city of Fairies once found on Earth around present-day northern Florida; it doesn't exist anymore due to the fact that humans live there now. This is where the Seven Fairies House was and where Princess Vyanda had her bowling ball.

<u>Green Magic</u> - "Coordination magic"; magic triggered by feelings of misery, panic, laziness, or by blindly lashing out, though it can also be the magical equivalent of doodling. Anything affected with green magic will reverse itself within minutes to an hour, although sometimes it can be complicated for bystanders to undo. Nymphs whose eggs were fertilized with green magic will be born scrawny and sickly. Green magic tastes spicy.

Guardian - A member of the Fairykind assigned to watch over children as a godparent.

*Guides* - The beings who represent Guidance; the name those who became the Refracted gave themselves after the Sluagh, but before they were called Refracts.

<u>Gyne</u> - If you aren't a kabouter or a drone, you're a gyne. Gynes have freckled faces, necks, chests, and arms, and sometimes legs. These freckles are white until puberty and will remain brightly colored until the gyne nears the senescent stage of the life cycle. Gynes have a biological tendency to lash out against authority figures and usurp their positions. They can only give birth to drone or gyne offspring (never kabouters). The only way to become a gyne is to eat

lots of jelly and little honey before shedding your baby exoskeleton. True story. The Anti-Fairy equivalent of a gyne is a pilot and the Refract equivalent is a plume.

# \*H\*

<u>Habetrot</u> (Faedivus embroidera) - A subspecies of Fairies with pointed hats topped with stars. The hats of damsels also have ribbons. They tend to be rural farmers who work with animals, since they're known for having exquisite knitting skills. Their patron is the cuckoo wasp, their food weakness is lamb chops, their nymphs have round and fluffy exoskeletons, and they have the highest turnover rate of any magical being due to the fact that they can have blood drawn by and be killed by magical objects. The anti-habetrot patron is the dayak fruit bat.

*Hangover City* - The only city on Anti-Pixie Isle and therefore its capital by default. It's named such because it sits on the edge of a cloudcliff, obviously.

*Hap* - The name Anti-Sanderson prefers to be addressed as, as opposed to H.A.P. One word, without the letters being individually pronounced.

<u>Head Pixie</u>, <u>The</u> - The CEO of Pixies Incorporated, and by extension of their corporatism-based society also the leader of the entire Pixie race.

<u>Headquarters</u> - The central and executive building in Pixie World; the Head Pixie gets the penthouse suite at the top, but from there on down it's mostly offices, storage rooms, and cubicle floors. Lots and lots of storage rooms.

*Hiccup* - The name I gave to Foop's second personality. He has claustrophobia, springs up when Foop feels highly stressed, and presents himself as "Savage with a smile".

*High Count* - The executive branch of government in Anti-Fairy society and the highest position a drake can achieve short of sitting on the Anti-Fairy Council; Anti-Cosmo's current position. Foop is next in line to inherit it.

*High Countess* - The equivalent seat for damsels; Anti-Wanda's current position. Presumably, Foop's future spouse will take her place following Foop's coronation. The High Count and High Countess are viewed as equals and both speak totally and legally for Anti-Fairy World as a whole.

*High Kingdom* - Planes of Existence 13-24. The Barrier fades out around here and space distorts a bit. Very little sunlight and oxygen reach these areas.

*Hindwing* - The two rear wings of a four-winged insect; smaller than the forewings. Many Fairies have these, though some lack them. All pixies have hindwings.

Hipposelachi - Sharks with the bodies of horses ("Love Triangle").

Honey-Lock Instinct, The - The all-powerful magical instinct that drives Anti-Fairies to mate with the counterpart of whomever their "host" does. In preadolescents, mere feelings of attraction can incite a "mini honey-lock" of affection in their counterpart.

Honeywheat - Just one of the magical foodstuffs grown by the Refracted on Plane 19.

Hoseks - Aliens inspired by simians. Mandie's dad is one.

Huldufólk. The (Faedivus cibus) - A subspecies of Fairies who originated from the Iceland area. Technically, they're a branch off the elves. They still practice the changeling children thing because they can only digest milk and grains like cereal, and they're stereotyped as being heavy partiers. Their patron is the crane fly (because their babies are called leatherjackets and Sammy Sweetsparkle wears a leather jacket, you see). Their food weakness is sugary cereal, their nymphs have pentagonal exoskeletons, and they function poorly if their basic needs aren't met.

<u>Hy-Brasil</u> - Anti-Fairy World's official name; named after the mythical island said to be off the coast of Ireland inhabited by large black rabbits and a magician in a stone castle

*Hy-Brasilian Scale, The* - A system of measurement for temperatures below freezing (since Fairy World doesn't naturally reach that low, and neither does Fairy magic). Warmer temperatures are measured by the Rainbow Scale.

### \*I\*

"I'm only [Un]Seelie" - "I'm only human".

<u>Imp</u> (Faedivus gryllidae) - A subspecies of Fairies with antennae and no natural crowns, although crossbreeds will show the crowns of their mothers. Their wings chirp because their patron is the cricket. Their food weakness is french fries, their nymphs have (vertically-oriented) rectangular exoskeletons, and it shuts down their system if you make the balls at the tips of their antennae touch. The anti-imp patron is the spotted bat.

<u>Imprint</u> - A magical being's "personal signature" in the energy field; something like the magical version of facial features, but can be picked up on from anywhere within a close radius.

Anti-Fairies use a similar system called a *vocal signature* to identify people.

<u>Indigo Magic</u> - Indigo magic occurs when someone's feelings are between those that would trigger blue or purple magic; for example, if someone is using magic only to keep their job, or if someone is fighting to suppress their irritation, or if someone's feelings are just all-over conflicted. There is some debate on whether it's actually separate from blue magic, so you might get eye rolls if you try to bring it up- however, indigo magic always wears off when the user falls asleep, whereas blue magic won't necessarily. Juandissimo seems to use this color an awful lot. See also, Blue Magic.

<u>Indirect Muscular Structure</u> - The type of wing design that non-fairy Seelie Courters show (crossbreeds included but barring those who don't have insect wings). The muscles pull on the body to flap the wings, and a patch on the back constricts and expands with these movements. Those with this wing structure cannot manipulate their wings independently.

<u>Inkblot City</u> - The only city in Pixie World and therefore its capital by default.

<u>Inrita</u> - A chemical secreted through a gland at the roof of a brownie's mouth. It holds no effect over them per se aside from helping them break down almost anything they put in their mouth, but inrita drains the magic from objects and some magical beings; a "closed circle of inrita" will cancel all magic in the vacinity, including causing Fairies and Pixies to "drop their lines" and start asphyxiating. Vendors often keep "inrita mud" near their wares to prevent people from magically stealing it. If inrita has any effect on genies, it's a slight one. Brownies fall low on the social ladder due to how easy it is for them to kill someone. See also, Brownie-Kisser.

*Inspectors* - The beings who represent Introspection; the name given to those who became Anti-Fairies after the Sluagh, but before they were called Anti-Fairies.

*Instar* - A Seelie Courter who still has their nymphhood exoskeleton, so typically someone under one year of age (give or take a few months) is said to be "in instar". Poof is the exception to the rule giving how his body has been messed up by the frozen timestream.

<u>Insula Solis Infintum</u> - Anti-Pixie World's official name; literally translated its name means "The Island of Infinite Sunshine". Located above Rio de Janeiro.

<u>Ipewood</u> - Slender, white trees. Their wood is used to make "cautious" wands. These wands are very lightweight and generally considered elegant and pretty. Such wands are quick on the draw, but overheat easily, so are good choices for those who use their magic sparingly. When it comes to wands, the Anti-Fairy equivalent is clay.

<u>Iris</u> - An Anti-Fairy with a sexually-transmitted disease that makes their eyes match their counterpart's eyes, as opposed to default red. The STD is highly prized in Anti-Fairy society due to a history of being associated with success, leadership, wealth, and cleverness, and generally it's kept out of the reach of the commoners. It comes with additional unpleasant side-effects, most notably sores in the mouth and the inner thighs.

Iris Virus - The common name for the color-eye STD.

*Ishigaq* (*Faedivus caecus*) - A subspecies of Fairies with feathered "tracker" hats and who are almost always blind. They never leave footprints and only crossbreeds have fingerprints. Their patron is the ice crawler, their food weakness is truffles, their nymphs have jagged, almost snowflake-shaped exoskeletons, and they can't step out of shadows without help. The anti-ishigaq patron is the silver-haired bat.

<u>Ivorie v. Goldenglow</u> - A court case which argued that the tax will o' the wisps pay on non-wisp drakes living with them should not be dropped; rejected due to conflicts with *Epipole v. Fairy World* that prevent outsiders from interfering with the goings-on of will o' the wisps and their burrows.

<u>Ivory Wand and Comet Blood</u> - A well-known sugar bar found on Plane 6 somewhere above Oklahoma. It's really the only thing worth mentioning in that town. The Pixies own half of it and it shows in the way they decorated.

*Ivywish* - A common word in Anti-Fairy society in reference to the *Anti-Firebox v. Ivywish* case. Saying something like, "They pulled ol' *Ivywish* on me" or "They went *Ivywish*" means, "They discriminated against me on the basis of my being an Anti-Fairy".

### \*.J\*

*Jacked* - A slang term from the time when H.P. was growing up; "That's jacked" means "That's dumb" or "That's messed up".

*Jazzed* - A slang term from the time when H.P. was growing up; "That's jazzed" means "That's cool" or "That's awesome".

Jelly - Eating too much jelly as a child will give you freckles. See also, Gyne.

Jitterlines - "Are you jitterlines?" means "Are you crazy?"

*Jugal Fold* - An area near the base of an insect wing, close to the body. There's a distinctive "bump" in this area. In the case of someone ceremoniously cutting off their wings, this is the place where they would cut.

*Juvenile* - The third of the five stages of life for the Fairykind, characterized by rapid mental development, gradual physical development, the beginnings of sexual development, and gaining control over magic. Gynes also gain pale freckles during this stage. This stage refers to someone between nymphhood and age of majority. Sometimes shortened colloquially to "juvie".

### \*K\*

*Kabouter* - A "normal" Fairy; neither a gyne nor a drone. The name comes from the Dutch word for gnome or leprechaun. There are no pixie kabouters and never will be. Kabouters may have freckles, but they will not have a serious number- that would make them a gyne.

*Kalahari Act, The* - A law passed in the name of Aphrodite Protocol that forbids Fairies from mating with pixies. Longwood has toed this rule by pulling the selkie girlfriend card. See also, *Eros v. Longwood* and *Longwood v. Sanderson VI*.

*Keeper of Da Rules* - The being (almost always of the von Strangle bloodline) tasked with keeping Da Rules in order and checking in when rules are broken.

*Kiff-Tie* - If two Anti-Fairies having an intimate moment are both killed, they'll regenerate together and be fused like one creature until they're killed again. It's sort of like gem fusion, but less impressive and less functional. The act is called kiff-tying. In place of the typical Valentine's Day celebrations, it's popular sport among Anti-Fairies to use arrows to kill snuggling couples instead.

*Kiiloëi* - The great fountain; located on Plane 24 of existence. The "rosewater" it produces is an essential component of working Fairykind starpieces. As indicated by "The Big Fairy Share Scare", the center of the Earth is literally as far away from Kiiloëi as possible.

*King Nuada Airgetlám* - King of the Tuatha Dé Danann and a legendary hero of the Fairies. He lost his right hand in the Sealing War and, now impure, was forced to step down from leadership. He would later replace his hand with one made from silver and regain his throne sometime after that. Eventually he was beheaded in battle. See also, Sreng.

*Kiss of Frost* - Will o' the wisp saliva has the ability to paralyze the limbs; a deep enough kiss will even freeze the body to the point where it stops functioning and dies.

*Kitchen Wand* - A cheap and simple wand with no monthly payments attached to it. It can be used to do a few simple domestic things, like folding clothes, washing dishes, starting a fire in a wood stove, opening cans, peeling vegetables, warming water, forming ice cubes in liquid, and stirring coffee, but the point of it is that you're not supposed to be able to do much with it, since it's a one-time buy thing. See also, Transparent Magic.

<u>Kitnut</u> - Tall bushes with yellow nuts. Their wood is used to make "reliable" wands that are durable and have decent magical quality. These wands can only be used a few times in a short period before needing a break, although they recharge quickly. Kitnut allergies are common, like peanut butter allergies. When it comes to wands, the Anti-Fairy equivalent is silver.

<u>Kobold</u> (Faedivus auxiliaris) - A subspecies of Fairies with colorful top hats. They have an instinct to please and will become upset if you tell them there isn't anything they can help with. Their patron is the ladybug, their food weakness is candy corn, their nymphs have diamond-shaped exoskeletons, and their magic doesn't work anywhere near cobalt. The anti-kobold patron is the Egyptian fruit bat.

*Kolobian Plane* - Plane 24 of existence. The highest known plane at this time.

Koralin - A potato-like fantasy world food.

*Korrigan* (*Faedivus myrmeleontidae*) - A subspecies of Fairies who seem beautiful in the shadows, but whose beauty fades after more than five minutes in direct sunlight. They have the ability to travel by bubble. Their patron is the antlion, their food weakness is pine sap, and their

nymphs have vaguely pine cone-shaped exoskeletons. The anti-korrigan patron is the Indiana bat.

Krisday - Basically Fairy Christmas, named after Kris Kringle.

\*L\*

Labby - See also, Labyrinth, The.

<u>Labyrinth, The</u> - The major filing room in Pixies Inc. It's located "undercloud" and stretches for a mile in any direction from the elevator and stairs, which touch down in its middle. A faulty computer might help you find things. Otherwise, you'll have to search on foot.

<u>Lagelyn</u> - The money used in the cloudlands. The bills are yellow and the coins are green. Three click pieces make a lyn, and twenty lyn make a single lagelyn bill. A single click comes out to be about three dollars in current American money, so one lagelyn bill is approximately worth \$180 in America.

Lau Rell - A small town located somewhere above Argentina on Plane 3 of existence. Its name is a play on "laurel" and signifies rags-to-riches type of success.

[Lawn] Gnome (Faedivus poacae) - A subspecies of Fairies with red caps and the ability to turn into mushrooms (usually when they fall asleep). Their patron is the aphid, their food weakness is maple syrup, their nymphs have oak leaf-shaped exoskeletons, and they will break out if they come in contact with soap. The anti-gnome patron is the California leaf-nosed bat.

<u>Leprechaun</u> (Faedivus leipreachán) - A subspecies of Fairies who tend to congregate around Ireland and wear green. They're associated with rainbows and sometimes with greed. In return for releasing them after capture, they are obligated to give you any 49 things you ask for, such as pieces of gold, kisses, smacks to the face, or even years of service (Most people demand gold, not knowing they have other options). The one thing they can't give is forty-nine children, since (barring the effects of *Wolbachia*) they can only produce offspring once in their lives (\*cough\*

magical Rh factor \*cough\*). Their patron is the click beetle, their food weakness is potatoes, their nymphs have almost clover-shaped exoskeletons, and they lose power if turned upside-down. The anti-leprechaun patron is the brown long-eared bat.

<u>Lia Fáil</u> - The "stone of destiny". This is where coronations and "swearing-in"s of all races occur, in accordance with the traditions of the Tuatha Dé Danann.

*Lifedust* - As implied in "Fairy Idol", Fairies leave dust behind when they die, not corpses.

Lifedust is referenced regularly in common phrases like "Oh my dust", "Dust, no", and "For the sake of dust".

*Lifemist* - The Refract equivalent of lifedust or lifesmoke; often referenced in phrases like "Oh my vapor" or "Vapor, no". When a Refract gives birth to lifemist, it rushes towards the primary "host" counterpart and envelops them.

*Lifesmoke* - The Anti-Fairy equivalent of lifedust; often referenced in phrases like "Oh my smoke" or "Smoke, no".

Lines - See also, Magic Lines. When an Anti-Fairy damsel gives birth to lifesmoke, it rushes towards the primary "host" counterpart and envelops them. Poof's counterparts (Foop and their Refract) "bound together" and "attacked" Poof at the exact same time, hence the giant cloud and the confusion of the Fairies; normally the clouds are much, much smaller.

*Ljósálfar* - A phylum under the kingdom Fantastica; for creatures who dwell "above ground".

<u>Loose Paper Room</u> - The infamous "break room" on the lowest floor of Pixies Inc. Random scrap paper gets tossed in here and pixies tend to chew on it.

Longwood v. Sanderson - A court case which ruled that despite their genetic relations, pixies are considered individuals and therefore that eating each other's specially-marked packages of food out of the freezer is legally considered theft.

Longwood v. Sanderson II - A court case which ruled that pixies who don't perform the minimum required hours of work in the office per week will be required to pay a fine and make

up hours via community service over the following week(s), in addition to scrambling to meet their minimum for that week.

Longwood v. Sanderson III - A court case which ruled that pixies who do not follow curfew rules can be fined for disturbing the peace.

Longwood v. Sanderson IV - A court case which ruled that breaking and entering is not a crime when one has reason to believe their health and safety may be in danger, especially if it's Halloween.

Longwood v. Sanderson V - A court case which ruled that even pixies over age of majority are not allowed to stray beyond the borders of Pixie World after hours without the written consent of the Head Pixie or some figure of higher rank (such as the Keeper of Da Rules, Mother Nature, Father Time, the Fairy Elder, or the Eros Triplets).

Longwood v. Sanderson VI - A court case which ruled that selkies and swanees are immune from the rulings of the Kalahari Act, which forbids relationships between Fairies and Pixies. Nothing can be done about the sideways glances one might get from the breaking of social norms, though.

Longwood v. Sanderson VII - "The Tree-Hugger Case"; A court case which ruled that murders which occur on Pixie vapor fall under Pixie jurisdiction unless the murdered figure was ranked a duke or duchess or higher in terms of social status (You may notice the loophole that if a pixie kills you on Pixie vapor, he could theoretically be ruled innocent by the Head Pixie and get off with no charges).

<u>Longwood v. Sanderson VIII</u> - "The Bumper Cars Case"; a court case which gave Sanderson the right to legally adopt young Gary and Betty (and Betty's brother, Kenny) after their respective parents hit each other in a car crash. This is the first case of a non-Fairy adopting a human, so it was kind of a huge deal. The Fairy Council settled the disputes over whether Pixies would use wishes to manipulate the universe in their favor by deciding to "lock up" the three humans' abilities to "wish". Which was the whole reason behind Sanderson trying to adopt them, so then he got stuck with them after that.

Lotus Palace, The - The executive building in Anti-Pixie World; the Head Anti-Pixie's room is officially at the top of a tower, but Anti-Sanderson usually sleeps wherever he happens to pass out after a long day of partying.

Lousy-Lines - A phrase that means something like "grumpy-gus" or "Debbie downer".

*Lowlands, The* - Plane 3 of existence. Pixie World, Pixie Woods, Mistleville, Lau Rell, Patio World, and other locations are on this plane.

<u>Lugh</u> - A crossbreed Tuatha Dé Danann hero and quite the jack of all trades. Basically the youthful god of harvest and the arts, but also a warrior. He had an obsession with wooden cows and invented a board game called <u>fidchell</u>.

<u>Luna v. Fairy Court</u> - A court case which ruled that memories are too easy to manipulate with magic and cannot be used as evidence in court without multiple witnesses and the existence of items clearly not touched recently by magic.

*Luna's Landing* - The capital city of Anti-Fairy World; the Blue Castle and Big Anti-Wand are located here.

*Lyn* - A dark green coin used in the cloudlands, manufactured from various materials, including the wood of the dalia tree. A lyn is made up of three clicks, and twenty lyn make a bill. See also, Lagelyn.

### \*M\*

*Magic Lines* - If you've read anything of my work, you've probably heard this explained a dozen times. <u>Here</u> is the post you'll want to read if you haven't.

*Magic Pool* - The shared amount of magic between the corresponding *Faedivus*, *Faeumbra*, and *Faelumen* counterparts; this is where the "inner reserves" of magic, or pink magic comes from.

The larger "your share" of the magic pool is, the stronger your attraction signals in the energy field.

Magical Energy Field - See also, Energy Field [Universal Magical].

Magnifico v. Amity Angel Safety and Protective Recall Agency - A court case that ruled Juandissimo could be reunited with Remy and that Remy is allowed to retain his godparent and his magical memories through adulthood so long as he remains rich and influential, doesn't spill the fairy secret or wish Juandissimo away, and accepts that he's forbidden to make wishes after the age of eighteen. See also, Dustfinger v. Cadence von Strangle.

Membrane - The clear portion of a Seelie Courter's insect wing, as far as you're concerned.

*Merfolk* - A race of magical beings who live underwater, especially in the Atlantic Ocean around Atlantis. Divided into mermaids and mermen. Pretty sure that's all that needs to be said here.

<u>Milbark</u> - Trees that only survive in water and have gray bark and trailing vines. Their wood is used to make "practical" wands that are completely water-resistant, and the blasts it produces are very fast. It has a slow recharge time between each blast, however. When it comes to wands, the Anti-Fairy equivalent is pumice.

*Milesians* - A race from the times of the Great Dawn known for their contributions to the arts: language, sculpture, and paintings. Especially language. They're still alive, though they live very far from Earth now- one might even say on the opposite side of the universe. The Milesian language is something like Latin, but also not.

*Milkmother* - A damsel who provides milk for a child that isn't her own.

<u>Mint</u> - A slang term that will crop up during Poof and Foop's teenage years; "I'm mint" basically replaces "I'm awesome" in the future.

<u>Mintwave v. Wandflick</u> - A court case which ruled that Fairies who practice magic under the influence of sugar will receive high fines and may have their starpieces revoked for up to three months. See also, *Anti-Gonzo v. Fairy World*.

<u>Mistleville</u> - A tourist town on Plane 3 that the cherubs pass through while migrating, and so it holds a strong connection with Valentines Day. Its name is a play on "mistletoe", which is commonly associated with kissing, as are cherubs. This would be the town seen during the "Love Struck" episode.

*Molpa-Pel* - An advanced alien race who ended up sealing themselves deep inside the Earth during their war with the Tuatha Dé Danann; the Mole People ("Wishy Washy", "Fairly Odd Pet", and "The Big Fairy Scare Share").

*Mother Angel* - Wife of the Father Angel.

<u>Mother Nature</u> - A nature spirit with control over space, plants, and animals. Has a pleasant and attention-seeking personality, but her appearance may vary depending on either your idea of motherhood or what you think she should look like. Sort of the sister of and sort of the wife of Father Time. She's supposed to be an impartial figurehead, but is definitely biased towards the Fairies.

*Moult* - The state of a Fairy or pixie "shedding" their wings. This happens frequently in the juvenile stage, but stops once you get your "adult wings" until you shed those for your "senescent wings". It leaves one sore for days or weeks as their new wings come in and is considered sort of embarrassing.

Moulting Ceremony - A coming of age ceremony for Fairies (and Pixies) that's supposed to occur the day after moulting into the adult wings. Involves some interesting traditions such as painting markings on the skin, swallowing money, a good deal of dancing, and drizzling unicorn blood in the hair.

Mudlip Town - Genieworld, USA.

*Munn* - The fourth son of Tarrow the Luck-Twister. His zodiac is Sky and his day of the week is Monday. The Sky Temple is located in the Far East (Pink) Region.

# \*N\*

Naiad - A wingless Fairy (both those born without and those whose wings have been cut off).

*Naming of the Seasons* - Basically the Fairy New Year; the Fairy calendar starts with spring (March 15th). For this holiday, at midnight in the Coordinated Cloudland Time time zone, Mother Nature reveals the name for the next year. Also referred to as "Naming Day".

Nature Spirits - Ancient magical entities with more raw power than the Fairykind, but can use that magic only in a specialized area, such as manipulating either water or fire. Lots of power for only a single element. There's a nature spirit for each of the seven elemental temples in Fairy World, and the spirits sometimes appear to act as impartial judges during events like the Fairy World Games or the Bake-Off. Mother Nature, Father Time, Tarrow, and Tarrow's sons are all nature spirits.

<u>Nemaphins</u> - Aliens inspired by dolphins.

<u>Night Bridge, The</u> - The black and purple Bridge that once connected Planes 2 and 6 between the city of Shadeblink in present-day Anti-Fairy World and the island of Tasmania off the coast of Australia. The Bridge was shattered during the War of the Sunset Divide.

*Nip-Rot* - A Fairy illness that temporarily swaps a Seelie Courter's personality with the personality of their Anti-Fairy counterpart (memories not included). It's highly likely to occur if Anti-Fairy DNA gets into a Fairy's system (see also, "The Gland Plan"), although there are other ways one can contract it too.

<u>Nix</u> (Faedivus pisces) - A subspecies of Fairies typically stereotyped as socialites. Their clothes are wet and their damsels have fish tails. Their patron is the dobsonfly, their food weakness is

lobster bisque, their nymphs have round and chronically-damp exoskeletons, and they can't do magic without wearing their fancy coats. The anti-nix patron is the greater bulldog bat.

*Northern Elf (Faedivus septentrio)* - This is the subspecies of elf that tends to live with Santa at the North Pole. They're very resistant to cold and are capable of digesting just about anything short of metal. See also, Elf.

<u>Novakiin</u> - The small town on Plane 6 where H.P. grew up; literally translated its name means "of the family of stars". Has Wish Fixers and the science museum that appeared in "When L.O.S.E.R.S. Attack", but not much else.

*Nymph* - The second of the five stages of life for a Fairy; refers to Fairies under the age of forty-five.

## \*0\*

Obsidian v. Horace - A court case which ruled that genies don't have the right to lawyers.

*Opaque Magic* - Magic in a physical state; for example, magical beams and Bridges are formed of this magic. See also, Transparent Magic.

*Oracle* - A magical being who can supposedly predict the future. The Fairy who wrote the toilet paper prophecies from "Country Clubbed" was an oracle.

<u>O'Weskar v. Pixies Incorporated</u> - A court case which ruled that Fairies are forbidden from interacting with injured or sickly pixies, and that pixies must be kept in the isolation wings of medical care facilities. Also, poaching killing a pixie will incur capital punishment.

*Pastel Bridge, The* - The Bridge that connects Planes 2 and 7 via Comet Falls, Fairy World and Cairo, Egypt. Currently still in use today.

<u>Patron</u> - The insect a Fairy or Pixie shares a third of their biology with; the bat an Anti-Fairy shares a third of their biology with; the bird a Refract shares a third of their biology with.

P.A.W.S. - See also, Previously-Activated Wand System.

<u>Pheromones</u> - Chemicals released by Fairies or Pixies that can affect those around them. The Fairy Elder gives off a great deal of pheromones. Most notably, when a pixie bleeds, they inadvertently give off a "buttery, minty, wet-dog-hair" scent or taste that will attract nearby pixies and potentially cause them to swarm (since that's what their patron does if injured).

*Pilot* - The Anti-Fairy equivalent of a gyne. While pilots still display freckles like their counterparts, they also show black stripes of fur on their faces, not unlike a mustache and goatee. These black stripes will also appear on their chests as they mature.

<u>Pinewater v. Shadewind</u> - A court case which ruled that deliberately antagonizing or interfering with a neutral party on Earth (as determined in the rulings of *Anti-Cosma v. Adelinda von Strangle*) is grounds for getting in trouble with the law, including paying a fine and potentially doing jail time.

*Pink Gate* - The forcefield that surrounds Anti-Pixie Isle and prevents anti-pixies from leaving without permission. H.P. and Anti-Cosmo worked together to put it up near the end of the War of the Angels. It looks like a tall, pink, solid wall with a great pink wooden gate on its south side (by cloudland directions).

<u>Pink Magic</u> - "Reflexive magic"; magic triggered through a knee-jerk reaction or through feelings of selfishness or retaliation. This type of magic is also used for shapeshifting, flying, teleporting, breathing, activating the core, and other regular body functions and does not prevent magical back-up. Having more "natural, stored magic" (i.e. this pink magic) will allow your crown to float higher above your head than someone who has little; the energy field and genie lamps are more attracted to those who put out more pink magic. This magic is unstable and

relatively easy for a bystander to undo. Nymphs whose eggs were fertilized with pink magic always show some sign of deformity, such as twisted limbs, blindness, deafness, or being unable to fly. Pink magic tastes sour.

Pixalchia - See also, Wolbachia pipientis.

*Pixalchia Day* - A Pixie holiday that H.P. invented after he gave up trying to remember the birthdays of all his offspring individually. It occurs once a decade on February 12th (H.P.'s birthday) and is often celebrated on Anti-Pixie Isle with the anti-pixies because sugar and no responsibilities to pay for anything broken.

<u>Pixie</u> (Faedivus quadratum) - An all-male, asexually-reproducing species who are all genetically identical. All have lavender eyes, black hair, and broken crowns, which they usually cover with pointed gray hats. They live by a corporatism or dictator system of government and are led by the Head Pixie and Company Vice President. Following the War of the Angels, they were removed from the Fairy classification and into their own division. Their patron is the paper wasp, their food weakness is animal crackers, their nymphs have hexagonal exoskeletons, and their magic doesn't affect those who wear clothing inside out, and covering a pixie with inside-out clothes will affect them like a butterfly net.

<u>Pixie Woods</u> - A forest that surrounds Inkblot City and therefore exists on Plane 3, alongside the rest of Pixie World. Its name is canon if Cosmo's board game in "Cosmonopoly" is to be believed.

<u>Pixie World v. Starshine Studios</u> - Sanderson wanted credit for his music this one time.

*Pixies Incorporated* - I'm going to assume that we all know what this is and simply say that it's a separate concept from Pixie World; Pixie World is the physical location where pixies live and Pixies Inc. is a single business located there.

*Plagiopatagium* - The half of an Anti-Fairy wing membrane nearest the body; it's synced up with the part of a Seelie wing that extends between body and jugal fold. Again, probably won't ever really come up, but look at this bat anatomy you're learning today. See also, Chiropatagium.

<u>Planes of Existence</u> - Layers in the universe; function something like alternate dimensions in the fact that they all "technically" overlap. You can descend planes by jumping off clouds and boats and things and letting gravity pull you down, but you can only move upwards if you ascend a Bridge or teleport. Abracatraz, stars, and black holes are on Plane 1, planets are on Plane 2, Pixie World and other low levels of Fairy World are on Plane 3, etc., etc. There are twenty-four known planes of existence, with Plane 24 being "heaven".

*Plume* - The Refract equivalent of a gyne. Think king of saxony bird of paradise, because instead of having mustaches and goatees like pilots among the Anti-Fairies, plumes get dramatic head plumes sweeping from their eyebrows over their shoulders to about their waists.

<u>Policy Meeting</u> - In these meetings the Fairy Council, Anti-Fairy Council, and Head Pixie gather together with non-Fairykind representatives like aliens, genies, or even humans to discuss anything that has been deemed important. These meetings are called when something important occurs and aren't regularly scheduled.

<u>Porter v. Starshine Kiss</u> - A court case which ruled that if a godchild draws their godparents and someone sees them, the godkid can say "I drew my fairy godparents" or "I drew my imaginary friends" and won't lose their godparents.

<u>Previously-Activated Wand System</u> - Sort of like a kitchen wand, but for the "Fairy Internet" (the digi-stream) as opposed to domestic kitchen magic. It's often abbreviated P.A.W.S.

Prince of Destiny - See also, Gyne.

<u>Principle of Observation</u> - This is what it's called when a human doesn't realize they're in the presence of a Fairy or Pixie, due to the "dust and sweat" they naturally secrete that renders them

"unnoticed" unless they're looked at closely; humans see only what they expect to see, as determined by cues around them. The Unseelie Court and non-Fairykind races lack this ability.

*Pterostigma* - A cell near the tip of an insect's wing that is colored black. All pixies and most Fairies have these. The plural form is pterostigmata.

<u>Púca</u> (Faedivus virens) - A subspecies of Fairies who always have some tint of green skin, and usually antennae, as well as natural three-pointed crowns. Their patron is the emerald ash borer, their food weakness is corn chips, their nymphs have bread loaf-shaped exoskeletons, and they react poorly around stereotypical good-luck charms. The anti-púca patron is the California myotis.

*Pup* - The second of the five stages of life for an Anti-Fairy; refers to Anti-Fairies under the age of forty-five.

Pure Bloodline - Basically a "purebred" of any particular species since the beginning of "sentience". They're much larger than the average Fairykind. Jorgen and the Tooth Fairy are both pure fairies, and Mrs. Powers is a pure korrigan. While we're on the subject, Simon Sparklefield is almost pure, hence why he's bigger than most fairies but not as big as, say, Jorgen.

Purple-Born - A Seelie Courter fertilized with purple magic.

<u>Purple Magic</u> - "Neutral magic"; magic triggered by feelings of neutrality and focus. Pixies are able to use this type of magic regularly, although Fairies and Anti-Fairies often struggle to channel it. Purple is the color of magic in its raw, "default" state. Only the caster (and the Fairy Elder) can undo purple magic directly, although it cancels after death, so nymphs whose eggs were fertilized with purple magic will die when both of their parents do. Fortunately, it's the duty of Cupid's family to fire "love arrows" that will turn other colors of magic yellow. Anti-Fairies are technically formed of purple magic. Purple magic tastes sweet.

*Qalupalik* (*Faedivus crepito*) - A subspecies of Fairy with a three-pointed crown who frequent the northern areas of the U.S. and Canada. You can hear them coming from a ways off in flight because their patron is the cockchafer. Their food weakness is king crab, their nymphs have round exoskeletons (and are always stark white until they shed them). The anti-qalupalik patron is the northern ghost bat.

Quadrant (of the Known Universe) - The whole universe as far as we're concerned.

Quadrant Pack Rules - The treaty between the Fairykind and several alien species that basically gives everyone free passage and trade rights and politely asks everyone not to attack each other. Mark inadvertently violated this treaty at the end of "F.L.A.R.G." and a lot of legal stuff had to be done about it.

Quickflap v. Abel - A court case which ruled that there are no legal punishments for killing sprites.

#### \*R\*

<u>Rainbow Bridge, The</u> - The Bridge that directly connects Planes 2 and 5 via Faeheim, Fairy World and the hills between Dimmsdale and Brightburg, California. Currently still in use today.

*Rainbow Scale, The* - A system of measurement for temperatures above freezing (since Anti-Fairy World doesn't naturally reach anywhere near the hot end, and neither does Anti-Fairy magic). Temperatures below freezing are measured by the Hy-Brasilian Scale.

<u>Rapunzel Tower: The</u> - One of two apartment complexes in Pixie World. According to cloudland directions, it's to the east of Headquarters.

<u>Red Flag Races</u> - The five species whose marriages are not legally upheld: pixies, finfolk, will o' the wisps, redcaps, and brownies.

<u>Red Magic</u> - "Strength magic"; magic triggered by desperation and/or obsession (such as when Foop used it during "Play Date of Doom"). Red magic occurs when someone is focused on the results of their magic; it may occur due to concern about someone's life or health (Wanda used red magic to shock the unconscious Timmy awake in "Yoo Doo") or if someone is fighting with everything they have to defend their life or something they care about. Red is usually associated with insanity, terror, and immaturity. The effects of red magic never last long and will reverse within minutes, if not seconds. Eggs fertilized with red magic will abort. Red magic tastes bitter.

<u>Redcap</u> (Faedivus ruberconlis) - A subspecies of Fairies with tall pointed caps (usually red, but often in other colors too). They have three additional eyes hidden under their hats because their patron is the robber fly. Their food weakness is roast beef, their nymphs have pyramid-shaped exoskeletons, and they'll die if their hats are off their heads for too long, or if their hats aren't regularly dampened with blood. The anti-redcap patron is the eastern red bat.

Reedfilter Rules AU - Alternate headcanon universe where pixies don't reproduce asexually, H.P. and Sanderson met for the first time during a party, and H.P. subtly overthrew the previous Head Pixie - Rani Reedfilter - before taking up the reins himself. One of the 130 Prompts ("Only an Idea") is based in this AU.

<u>Regions</u> - Political states in the cloudlands. There are seven- Four in Fairy-World and three in Anti-Fairy World. Each region is represented on their respective Council by a democratically-elected Robe. You need a passport to travel between regions, though most Fairies have passport chips in their wands that, if certified, can skip through customs instantly.

Refract - See also, Refracted, The.

<u>Refracted, The</u> - The common name for those in the genus *Faelumen*, who are sentient individuals born of one third from a Fairykind core after the hermaphrodite Aos Sí "evolved" in ancient times. They're classified as members of the Unseelie Court and mirror their counterparts much like Anti-Fairies do. Instead of being black and blue, they're white and gold and have feathered wings. They're basically the genderbents of the Seelie Court with a bit of an obsession around being holy, not being naked, and secluding themselves from sinners (hence why they live

in Planes 19-21). Like anti-pixies, <u>pixie refracts</u> differ from fairy refracts (namely, by reproducing asexually and having tan skin and purple hair, like a purple-crowned fairywren).

Regeneration - The state of an Unseelie recovering from "dying" and pulling themselves back together again. A young Unseelie can regenerate in about five seconds whereas an adult might take two minutes and a senescent hours. This has nothing to do with their counterparts- This is just what happens if you "kill" an Unseelie by stabbing them or crushing them under a truck or something (Foop regenerated in "Man's Worst Friend" after a bird melted him with fire).

*Rhoswen* - A cherub from times long ago who believed that the wild-like Anti-Fairies could be "tamed"; he taught a few to read and act civilized and sort of kickstarted their evolution into sentient beings. Bit of a "Messiah figure" to the Anti-Fairies, rather like King Nuada to the Seelie.

*Rhoswen Syndrome* - A Fairy who has an affair with an Anti-Fairy was once said to suffer from this syndrome; eventually the definition expanded to apply to anyone who shows interest in those across the Seelie-Unseelie Court lines. Cross-Court love affairs are extremely looked down upon by both sides.

<u>Robe</u> - An easier way to say "Member of the Fairy or Anti-Fairy Council"; capital R required.

Roosting Room - A community "bedroom" or "living room" with a high ceiling found in nearly all Anti-Fairy buildings. Features structures that allow Anti-Fairies to hang upside-down while they chit-chat or sleep. They like to snuggle. Roosting together for the night is known as "bundling".

<u>Rosewater</u> - An essential component of Fairykind wands that allows the wielder to tune into the proper frequency of the energy field for using magic. Without this "rosewater" in the caps of their wands, it's impossible for them to channel starpiece magic. See also, Kiiloëi.

Rhymepye - The "official" name for members of the "Gigglepie" race.

Sacred Revolution, The - This cold war against various Great Dawn races in the universe ended with the Fairies asserting themselves as their own class, dividing themselves up into subspecies with names that everyone agreed on, accepting a standard language for their class (Snobbish), and establishing a government and presence in the universe. Also during this time, Anti-Fairies were beginning to be sentient and chose to rebel against their "owners" and shake off the "pet" lifestyle that they had been subject to.

Sanderson v. Longwood - An attempted court case which argued that pixies shouldn't be allowed to kiss during work hours; never went through due to pixies being laughed out of the courtroom for bringing up the idea at all.

*Saturn* - The second-oldest son of Tarrow the Luck-Twister. His zodiac is Fire and his day of the week is Saturday. The Fire Temple is located in the Far West (Maroon) Region.

<u>Satyr</u> (Faedivus satyrus) - A subspecies of Fairies who have hooves and who, instead of covering their chests with clothes, stick with their colorful fluff. Their patrons are all various goats, their food weakness is appleasuce, their nymphs are colorful balls of fluff with hooves, and it shuts down their system if you bang on tin within their earshot. The anti-satyr patron is the long-legged bat.

Saucerbee - My name for the sport we saw little Cosmo playing in "This Is Your Wish". Three teams play on the field at once, and your goal is to shapeshift the saucer into something that will score you major points with the judges, then cart it through the goalposts belonging to one of the two opposing teams. You will then gain bonus points, and the other team will lose a point or two. It's a sport that prizes elegance, strategy, and teamwork (Here is a one-shot I wrote where Poof and Foop try out for their school's saucerbee team, and here is a game in action).

Sealing War, The - The ancient war of the Tuatha Dé Danann, many of the Tylwyth Teg, and the Afanc, against the Fomorians, the Bodacians, and the Synapdoe; it resulted in the Tuatha Dé Danann and the Molpa-Pel being sealed up in the center of a prison planet, which eventually

blossomed into Earth due to the magic emanating from the bodies of the Tuatha as they died. The Molpa-Pel are still alive down there.

<u>Seelie Court</u> - Non-Anti-Fairy members of the Fairykind (i.e. Pixies along with Fairies and all subspecies in Fairy classification). You might also encounter this term as Seelie Courter.

<u>Selkie</u> (Faedivus arctocephalus) - A subspecies of Fairies who turn into seals if they wear their sealskin coats, and who are "forced" to follow any orders given to them by someone else wearing their coat. They wear crowns of pink coral and their wings function more like fins and aren't great for flying with. Their patrons are all seals, though which one may vary. Their food weakness is clam chowder and their nymphs have scallop-shaped exoskeletons. The anti-selkie patron is the lesser bulldog bat.

Senescent - The last of the five stages of life for the Fairykind, characterized by a growth spurt in height, longer wings, and other side effects of aging such as hair fully turning gray or white, hair loss, wrinkles, difficulty channeling magic, and a weakened immune system. It's a lot like the third stage of evolution for a Pokémon, actually. This is the only stage of life other than nymphhood where a Fairy or Pixie could potentially die from sickness. Gyne freckles should have wholly faded by this point. It usually happens at about 800,000 years of age (aprox. age 71), and in Anti-Fairy culture, senescents are forced to step down from the position of High Count or Countess. H.P. hit his senescent stage early due to the amount of magic he's been required to use to bring the other pixies to life. Technically he should be dead from magic usage but shh don't tell him that.

<u>Serentip</u> - A large port city on Plane 5 where most of the skyships that travel the trade routes to alien planets make berth; literally translated its name means "Edge of the stars".

<u>Sesame Paste</u> - A "flavoring" that makes food taste more bland; the pixies usually eat a lot of this.

<u>Shadow Bridge. The</u> - The black and blue Bridge that once connected Planes 2 and 4 between the city of Crowfeld in present-day Anti-Fairy World and the island of Hy-Brasil off the coast of Ireland. The Bridge was shattered during the War of the Sunset Divide.

<u>SHAMPAX</u> - CPR for the Fairykind; stands for Sharing Magic to Prevent Asphyxiation. Usually administered mouth to mouth, but can also be administered by mouth to an open cut in the skin.

"Sheathe your wand" - In this sense, it means "Hold your horses".

<u>Skyship</u> - Literally a boat that flies through the sky. Skyships that travel only in the cloudlands are cloudships. Occasionally used during war, but mostly used for merchants or by those who don't have wings and can't always cross the cloudlands easily. Customarily designed after an animal and usually has wings. Usually expected to look pretty and carry desirable goods.

<u>Sluagh, The</u> - The first name the Aos Sí gave themselves following their split into Fairy, Anti-Fairy, and Refract. See also, Electors, Inspectors, and/or Guides.

*Smoof* - Mild curse word; Norm and Sanderson have both used it in canon. With smoof supposedly being a reference to hemp, I've headcanoned smoof as being a plant that can be used for various things, such as making burlap sacks. Materials made of smoof will render most magical beings powerless (Works on genies as said in "Genie Meanie Miney Mo", and since Sanderson used the word in the musical, I decided the Fairykind are weak to it too).

<u>Snapjik</u> - A gambling game sort of like chess, with a very long board and colorful round circles instead of checkered tiles. This game is played in teams of three who take turns moving pieces and you're not allowed to talk to your teammates. For part of the game, when you knock into other pieces, you "catapult" or flip them through the air, and one of the rules then is that you have to play the pieces where they lie.

<u>Snatter</u> - Not a nice name to call someone; sometimes strung together as "snattersmoof". The exact definition falls somewhere between "brown-noser", "cheat", "lovable scamp", and "female dog".

Snobbish - Basically English, but before England existed. It's named after the Snobulacs.

<u>Snow v. Carmichael</u> - A court case which ruled that godchildren who reveal the existence of another kid's godparents will lose their own godparents as a result.

<u>Social Ladder</u> - The caste system of the Fairies. Anti-Fairies and Pixies are less concerned with it.

*Sonar* - That thing Anti-Fairies use to echolocate. All Anti-Fairies can use it (including the ones based on fruit bats, even though real-life fruit bats can't echolocate).

*Soul* - That metaphysical thing that fills a body with life. Allegedly there are three parts to the soul of a Fairykind: the hands (body), the lines (magic), and the core (life).

Soulmate - Especially in the olden days, if you say you're going to hang out with your soulmate, people will assume you're referring to your counterparts before someone you feel romantic affection towards.

Southern Elf - See also, Dökkálfar.

<u>Sparkletail v. Whimsifinado</u> - A court case which ruled that Pixies can make their own starpieces, but aren't allowed to distribute them to non-pixies. Any non-pixie caught with a pixie starpiece will have it terminated.

Spear of Lugh - The choice weapon of Lugh, one of the Tuatha Dé Danann.

<u>Sprigganhame</u> - Pixie World's official name (as far as you're concerned).

*Spriggish, The* - Ethnicity of the Pixies; mostly referred to only in official documents and by outside races, like aliens and maybe genies and such. I based this term off the Cornish mythical being called a spriggan because... you know. Cornish pixies.

*Springcase* - A musical instrument that's sort of like an accordion and sort of like a violin. Don't ask.

<u>Sprite</u> - Tiny green creatures who are the magical world's equivalent of mosquitoes; they drain your magic. Although they are sentient, it's not against the law to kill them. They really like grape juice.

<u>Sreng</u> - The Milesian who cut off King Nuada's right hand in the stories of the Tuatha Dé Danann and the Sealing War, thus rendering King Nuada impure and forcing him to step down from leadership.

*Starpiece* - A collective term for all variations of wands (for example, the cell phones used by pixies). Sometimes abbreviated to "star". The type of magic used by the Fairykind is called "starpiece magic".

Starport - A port for cloudships and skyships in the cloudlands, and sometimes alien planets.

Starsailing - The act of traveling the cosmos via skyship.

Struggle With the Darkness, The - The war related to that whole "Wishology" business.

Sugarloaded - The state of being "sugar-drunk" due to consuming too much candy and/or soda.

Sunrise Skies - All territory in Fairy World. See also, Tír Ildáthach.

<u>Sunnie</u> - The third oldest son of Tarrow the Luck-Twister. His zodiac is Water and his day of the week is Sunday. The Water Temple is located in the Central Star (Purple) Region.

Sunset Skies - All territory in Anti-Fairy World. See also, Hy-Brasil.

Svartálfar - The "evil elves" from "Birthday Battle". Not technically a "real variety" of Fairykind elves, although they are sometimes referred to as "southern elves". They're just one of the other magical races out there, but they don't use starpiece magic and are genetically very different from elves and other Fairies entirely, to the point where interbreeding cannot occur, so they are not even considered to be Fairykind! They live in the Scandinavian area.

<u>Swanee</u> (Faedivus cygnus) - A race of beings very similar to selkies, although they have feathered robes instead of sealskins; 'swanee' is a more gender-neutral term for the swan

maidens of myths. They usually have horns under their hats. Their patron is, understandably, the swan. Their food weakness is toast and their nymphs have round and feathery exoskeletons. The anti-swanee patron is the black scoter duck.

<u>Sweep Jamming</u> - This is what it's called when an Anti-Fairy interferes with another's sonar by echolocating near them while out and about, causing them to crash into things or otherwise lose focus while flying or hunting insects or heading out to cause bad luck or something.

<u>Sylph</u> (Faedivus flavus) - A subspecies of Fairies who wear tall, pointed hats with yellow stars scattered across the fabric. They're the stereotypical bookworms of the magical world. Their patron is the eastern amberwing, their food weakness is soy sauce, their nymphs have cupcake-shaped exoskeletons, and if you splash even a little water on a sylph, they can't use magic until they dry off. The anti-sylph patron is the yellow-winged bat.

<u>Synapdoe</u> - The order of classification for Giggle Pies, Hoseks, and the Molpa-Pel, among other creatures.

## \*T\*

*Tarrow* - A respected being in Anti-Fairy culture; he had seven sons whose names became the days of the week. It's generally believed by the Anti-Fairies that the High Count and Countess and their camarilla courts each channel the power of one of the seven sons (depending upon the year of their birth in the zodiac) so long as they are acting favorably; if politics have become corrupt, it's believed the sons withdraw.

*Tenderfir v. Redbrush* - A court case which ruled that humans aren't allowed to spend more than eight hours straight in the lowest areas of the cloudlands, and as little as one hour in some of the upper areas. This is due to the limited amount of oxygen there, so humans who stay too long will asphyxiate. Visits to Earth to break up these periods of time in Fairy World are required by law.

Thinningcore - "Going thinningcore" is the Unseelie equivalent of going tingle-fritzy, since the Unseelie don't have their own magic lines. Simply put, when they begin to stress, they can have difficulty "breathing". It's also a common side effect of Anti-Fairies being right-side-up too much. While tingle-fritziness can sometimes be associated with pleasure ("sugar high"), going thinningcore is generally considered unpleasant.

Three Deep Sins - The three sins that allow a cù sith to steal your soul if they catch you doing one. They're written on the very first page of Da Rules: Tell no lies, excepting those dressed in white. Kill no one before they've engaged in fair fight. If ever in doubt, recall the Fairy Elder is sure to be right. Disobey these and you'll lose your path to the light (Don't lie, don't murder, don't disobey a direct order from the Fairy Elder).

Threedspiral - A reed-like plant used to make papyrus. It's used to make cheap wands that are lightweight and inexpensive to replace, so it's a good choice for those who lose or damage their wands often. The reaction time is very quick on this one. When it comes to wands, the Anti-Fairy equivalent is plastic.

*Thurmondo* - The youngest son of Tarrow the Luck-Twister. His zodiac is Leaves and his day of the week is Thursday. The Leaves Temple is located in the High North (Blue) Region.

*Time Key* - Wooden, granite, tin, bronze, limestone, ruby, emerald, silver, sapphire, opal, gold, diamond, and platinum keys that allow one to look back or even travel back in time. Wooden keys are kind of like cameras whereas platinum keys are the ultimate in timestream locksmithery.

*Time Lockbox* - A magical, metaphysical memory bank that can be accessed via time keys. Lets you view physical "photographs" of a scene and hear the actual transcripts of conversations that occurred in times long ago, but only if you were present there.

*Tinfoil Hat* - Putting a tinfoil hat on a Fairy or Pixie will absolutely scramble their lines and cause them to go completely limp. If the hat is not removed within a few minutes, the Fairy or Pixie will asphyxiate. Humans and other creatures wearing tinfoil hats are immune to Fairykind magic.

*Tingle-Fritzy* - A state of arousal in the Fairykind that might result from anxiety, feelings of attraction, or from being sugarloaded, for example. This term is so named due to the fact that a Fairy or pixie's magic lines will fritz in and out of contact with the energy field in this state..

<u>Tír Ildáthach</u> - Fairy World's official name; "The Land of Many Colors".

*Tír Na NÓg* - Land of the Tuatha Dé Danann during the days of the Great Dawn; Plane 23.

<u>Tomte</u> - A Fairy without the ability to channel magic; named after the mythical creature from Swedish folklore. If someone tries to "go tomte", it means they've injured or are considering injuring their right hand, which is the "organ" of a Fairy's body that really channels magic. Alternatively, it may also mean that they're trying to "go natural" and not use magic, but without injuring their hand. Anti-Fairies are not affected by their counterparts going tomte, and injuring their hands won't have an affect on their ability to channel magic either.

<u>Transparent Magic</u> - Magic that doesn't magic-touch something; for example, shapeshifting and teleporting. Kitchen wands, which are used for domestic magic like stirring drinks and peeling vegetables, run on this system to avoid draining food of nutrients. See also, Opaque Magic.

<u>Troll</u> (Faedivus troglodytarum) - A subspecies of Fairies with green, blue, or gray skin who generally live underground. They're actually a very civilized and even elegant race, although they rarely have the chance to show it. Their patron is the termite, they don't have a food weakness, their nymphs don't have exoskeletons, and they don't do well in bright sunlight. The anti-troll patron is the hoary bat.

<u>Tuatha Dé Danann</u> - An ancient race who existed in the times of the Great Dawn; gods to the Fairykind. The Fairy Elder is the last of the Tuatha now.

<u>Twinkletuft's Wandporium</u> - A well-established and well-known business that used to distribute wands and handle service plans. The Pixies bought it some time ago after Twinkletuft's girlfriend ran off with his fortune- however, Pixies are not allowed to manufacture starpieces for non-pixie races.

<u>Twis</u> - The fifth oldest son of Tarrow the Luck-Twister. His zodiac is Soil and his day of the week is Tuesday. The Soil Temple is located in the Lower East (Teal) Region.

<u>Tylwyth Teg</u> - The order of classification for Boudacians and the Aos Sí, among other creatures.

\*[]\*

<u>Ulkroot</u> - A type of wand that comes from ulk trees, which are similar to palm trees with silver bark and red leaves. The magic quality is very good, although the wand itself is not terribly durable. This is the wand you would give to someone who was "handicapped" when it came to magic. When it comes to wands, the Anti-Fairy equivalent is copper.

<u>Undercloud</u> - "Underground" in the cloudlands (So yes, basements can be a thing). Of course, if you move too deep, you can fall through the cloud.

<u>Undry</u> - A bottomless cauldron that belonged to one of the Tuatha Dé Danann and supposedly satisfied anyone who ate from it. See also, Dagda, The.

*Universal Energy Field* - See also, Energy Field [Universal Magical].

<u>Unseelie Court</u> - Fairykind "counterparts" whose lives are wired to mirror those of their "hosts"; Anti-Fairies, Anti-Pixies, and Refracts.

<u>Upper School</u> - A combination between middle school and high school; this term was used in the older days but is now out of date since middle schools and high schools became separate things.

<u>Urvogel</u> - Another name for an archaeopteryx; before chickens evolved, you might have been called an urvogel instead of a chicken if someone thought you a coward.

<u>Utter Dependency Clause</u> - See also, Dustfinger v. Cadence von Strangle.

\*V\*

<u>Valleysky v. Geraldson</u> - A court case which ruled that Fairies are allowed to legally adopt humans under the age of eighteen if said human has no legal guardians otherwise. You have to be cleared by the Amity Angel Safety and Protective Recall Agency and possibly the Fairy Council, though. Sanderson argued in *Longwood v. Sanderson VIII* that pixies should be allowed to adopt humans under the same conditions too, and won.

<u>Vapor</u> - Earth has dirt, but the cloudlands have vapor. If you're "on someone's vapor", you're in their territory. Most magical plants only grow in vapor and won't survive in dirt. Dirt is imported into the clouds when the Fairykind want to grow Earth plants.

<u>Vocal Signature</u> - Sort of like facial expressions, but with voices and other identifying sounds. Anti-Fairies use these to identify people sometimes more than they use their eyes.

#### \*W\*

<u>Wand Sheath</u> - Exactly what it sounds like- a scabbard for the Fairykind to keep their wands. Fairies generally sheathe their wands on the right side of their body, Anti-Fairies on the left, and Pixie wands are typically kept in the inner left pocket of their jackets. Anti-Pixies use their right pants pocket and Refracts keep their wands in their left sleeves.

<u>Wanderplains, The</u> - Plane 7 of existence, connected directly to Earth via the Pastel Bridge. Lots of open spaces and grassy fields. There's more oxygen on this plane than anywhere else, excluding Plane 2. Very few of the Fairykind actually live here, though, but this is where you'd find magical beings like unicorns, hipposelachi, pegasi, dragons, etc. This is also where Cosmo ran away to in "Fairly Odd Baby" when he was told to get lost.

<u>War of the Angels. The</u> - The war between Fairies and Anti-Fairies to determine who would be allowed to have godchildren. Ended in a truce, which is renewed annually during the Bake-Off of the Angels ("Balance of Flour").

<u>War of the Sunset Divide, The</u> - The war between Fairies and Anti-Fairies that resulted in the erection of the Barrier between their worlds and the splitting of the sky into blue and red. It didn't happen terribly long ago- H.P.'s father fought in this war in his youth.

<u>W.E.B.</u> - See also, Worldwide Existence Branch.

<u>Western Elf (Faedivus coquito)</u> - This is the subspecies of elf that doesn't have wings and tends to live on the ground in the forest. They can activate and travel through "tree passages" and tend to be good bakers. They also tend to have large buck teeth. See also, Elf.

Whimsifinado v. Caudwell - One time Caudwell tried to abandon his life as a pixie. H.P. said no. In fact, this case ruled that age of majority for pixies is 250,000 and not 200,000 as it is for Fairies, and that the Head Pixie has legal say to choose whether his pixies can leave. Technically, all pixies out beyond the borders of Pixie World without a permit written by him are supposed to be arrested and brought back. This is where it comes in handy to be a species of hardly five hundred members, I guess.

<u>Whimsifinado v. Eros Nest</u> - A court case which ruled that under Aphrodite Protocol, the use of a yoo-doo doll to restrain someone does not qualify as cruel and unusual punishment.

<u>Whimsifinado v. Fairy World</u> - A court case which ruled that Pixies should be their own class and are no longer to be classified under the Fairy umbrella on the grounds that they cannot reproduce with Fairies (or members of the Unseelie Court, or beyond the class of the Fairykind etiher).

<u>Whimsifinado v. Knuckleheads</u> - A court case which ruled that the Fairy World courthouse is to be used for serious purposes only and not for settling silly squabbles, particularly if said squabbles can be resolved through good communication and/or the weighing in of the Head Pixie.

"Who brushed the dust off your wings?" - "Why are you so grumpy?"

"Will a genie's kiss fry your lines off for a week?" - Rhetorical question given as an affirmative answer; equivalent to, "Do chickens have lips?" Stemmed from the fact that genies have so much magic in them, kissing one long enough will overload the body and cause the Fairy to fritz all lines from the energy field.

<u>Will o' the Wisp (Faedivus lepidoptera)</u> - A subspecies of Fairies with flashy butterfly wings and paralyzing saliva (See also, Kiss of Frost). There is a stark contrast between drakes and damsels, with damsels being domineering and drakes being rather dumb. Their patrons are a variety of butterflies and moths, their food weakness is butter, and their nymphs have triangular exoskeletons. The anti-will o' the wisp patron is the six-spot burnet moth.

<u>Wing Brush</u> - Something like a toothbrush, but for your wings. Yes, I am still laughing about how Norm found "How to keep your wings clean" written in Da Rules during "Fairy Idol".

Wingthumb - The hooked claw at the tip of Anti-Fairy wings.

<u>Winni</u> - The second youngest son of Tarrow the Luck-Twister. His zodiac is Breath and his day of the week is Wednesday. The Breath Temple is located in the Lower West (Green) Region.

<u>Wishbirthed</u> - A nymph who skipped the birthing process and was wished out of their parent, and as a result ended up with a large glob of magic stuck to them. This process can be seriously risky if you don't know your anatomy well or can't channel sufficient power.

<u>Wishowatt</u> - Canon (but obscure) unit of power for measuring magical strength ("Land Before Timmy").

**Wisp Kiss** - See also, Kiss of Frost.

<u>Wolbachia pipientis</u> - A real-life bacteria that causes certain female insects (wasps, ladybugs, some flies, etc.) to reproduce asexually and males to die off shortly after becoming infected with

it. In my world, all pixies are infected with this and usually refer to it as *Pixalchia*. Hence, Pixies are an asexually-reproducing all-male species and can't interbreed with anyone.

<u>Worldwide Existence Branch</u> - In essence, an "online" school program for magical people that came into existence shortly after the digi-stream (magical Internet) itself did. It's usually abbreviated W.E.B.

<u>Wraith (Faedivus phasma)</u> - A subspecies of Fairies with no natural crown and translucent skin, so one can view their organs. They turn colors depending on what they eat. Their patron is head lice, their food weakness is poppy seed muffins, their nymphs have tombstone-shaped exoskeletons, and putting color on their skin really messes with their minds. The anti-wraith patron is the New Zealand lesser short-tailed bat.

## \*X\*

<u>Xero Act, The</u> - Under this law, the sterilization of Anti-Fairies (Refracts were later included) is forbidden (It wasn't an uncommon thing in the olden days, until Fairies realized that their children were dying due to not having an anti-fairy to split their heavy load of magic with). It's also against the law for Anti-Fairies to sterilize themselves in an attempt to avoid having pups-various cherubs in the Eros Nest will put a stop to that as fast as they can.

# \*Y\*

<u>Year of Promise</u> - The time period between when fairy courtship begins and when one's wings are notched; nowadays also used to refer to "the honeymoon phase".

<u>Yellow Mafia</u> - The Head Anti-Pixie is a "mob boss" of anti-pixies called the Yellow Mafia, and they'll do favors for the right price of sugar. The mafia is very small and pathetic right now, but it will totally be way scary one day.

<u>Yellow Magic</u> - "Balance magic"; magic triggered by the desire to please and/or be helpful and/or do the right thing. The biggest key to triggering yellow magic is that there is no reluctance involved. The color yellow promotes happiness in Fairy society and is commonly found in decorations. Yellow magic cannot be undone by anyone other than the caster and the Fairy Elder. Nymphs whose eggs were fertilized with yellow magic will live on even after their parents have died; the best color to use for fertilization. Yellow magic tastes peppery.

"You're fudging your wand waves" - "You're exaggerating".

"You're twirling my lines" - "You can't be serious" / "You're making me anxious".

"You're yanking my wing" - "You're pulling my leg".

## \*Z\*

Zinflax - A tree with dark pink bark and tiny bristles. It "bleeds" thick sap if you cut it. This wand is very heavy and considered to be the most powerful (which is why Jorgen and Foop use it), but it's very draining on one's abilities and even one's emotions, in addition to its habit of scratching up one's hands. When it comes to wands, the Anti-Fairy equivalent is obsidian. The funny thing about emotional drainage is, there's only one pixie who can handle using this type of wand. His name is Rosencrantz.

<u>Zodiac</u> - There are seven elements on the Fairy zodiac: Love, Fire, Water, Sky, Soil, Breath, and Leaves. They circle in that order and the Anti-Fairies value the zodiac like religion due to its affiliation with luck and the correlation of how Anti-Fairies hold opinions to other Anti-Fairies in conjecture with or as opposed to how their counterparts interact.

<u>Zodiism</u> - Someone with full and devoted belief in the zodiac's power and the nature spirits who represent its elements is said to be Zodii. It's basically the standard religion among Anti-Fairies.
