# **Shadow Puppetry**

Workshop Information- History, Fables, Puppet Design, Creative Writing In this session, students will learn about the history of shadow puppetry and how it has been used to tell stories for thousands of years. They will read several examples of fables, and they will learn the common characteristics of these tales. Students will work together in groups to write their own modern-day fables. They will begin with storyboards, which they will convert to script form. Next, students will design their own shadow puppets to act out

their fable. Shadow puppets will be made from thick black paper, brads, and dowels. Students will learn how to make a simple shadow puppet theater, and how to use gels with lighting to affect the mood of the action.
