GENERAL EDUCATION Criteria for Elements 5A & 5B

ELEMENT 5A CRITERIA

Courses in Element 5A must have the following characteristics:

- The central defining element of the course is a focus on continuities and changes over time within human society, and on <u>non-contemporary</u> world views.
- 2. The course focuses on the interactions among the multiple dimensions of human societal contexts. These dimensions may include, but are not limited to, social, cultural, political, economic, religious/philosophical, environmental, scientific and/or technological.
- The course requires analysis of methods used in historical disciplines including the evaluation of written, oral and/or artifactual sources primarily in the context of the historical period in which they were produced.

ELEMENT 5B CRITERIA

Courses in Element 5B must have the following characteristics:

- The central defining element of the course is a focus on individuals and societies and their interactions in a complex, multi-dimensional, and contemporary world.
- The course introduces and defines the discipline's methods and practices, explores key disciplinary concepts, and explores the development of the discipline.
- The course focuses on analyzing the discipline's perspectives on and contributions to fundamental questions of social science, including issues of personal and public importance.
