This approach will equip future healthcare professionals with the necessary skills to recognize and address the needs of patients with invisible disabilities. DEPWD with the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, in collaboration with medical education boards, should mandate training on recognizing and accommodating invisible disabilities within medical and allied health curricula. This training, as a part of SIPDA will ensure a more empathetic and effective healthcare workforce, further facilitating the disability certification effectively.

Strict adherence to this initiative must include staff training to recognize the Sunflower Lanyard and provide appropriate, empathetic support. Despite the initiative, untrained staff have caused discomfort and confusion for passengers with invisible disabilities. A recent case filed with the CCPD against Air India highlights the urgency of this matter.

Enforcement of Equal Opportunity Policy (EOP) in all the private establishments as per RPWD Act 2016: Many private organizations lack an EOP, creating barriers for people with disabilities, particularly invisible disabilities, due to fear of disclosure and challenges in seeking reasonable accommodations. Private establishments shall be required to establish an EOP and submit regular compliance reports to the DEPwD. Training programs for Human Resources and managerial staff on the importance of DEI and reasonable accommodations for invisible disabilities should be mandated. To ensure accurate data on organizations with Equal Opportunity Policies, DEPwD should maintain a comprehensive database. To facilitate this, DEPwD can collaborate with NGOs, training & skilling centres such as CRCs and placement agencies focused on the employment of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs), leveraging their expertise and networks to gather and verify this information effectively.</p>
