**Hosted by Detention Watch Network:** This webinar will explore how disability and immigration justice are connected and discuss ways to include disability justice efforts to end detention. Hear from New Disabled South and Rodney Taylor, a double amputee migrant, who was recently released after spending 15 months in Stewart Detention Center thanks to community organizing efforts. Lately, there has been a rise in discussions and policies that promote eugenics and target disabled people across the country. However, the experiences and history of disabled immigrants are often overlooked when talking about immigrant rights, even though the U.S. immigration system has a history of discrimination against people with disabilities. Trump continues to push an aggressive expansion of ICE and immigrant detention. ## **Protect California Rights and Immigrants: Tell your State Senators to vote YES on SB 1105**

[Join ACLU](#) to protect our rights: Too many Californians feel a severe sense of distrust towards state and local officials since ICE showed up on our streets nearly a year ago. Trump has commandeered state and local police to do his dirty work through federal task forces. Our local police are then ordered to support racially discriminatory immigration enforcement activities, to investigate organizations and individuals demonstrating against these actions, and to target Americans who are documenting ICE's abusive actions.

**These operations violate California's existing laws.** It's time to send a clear message to the Feds that our state's police resources and personnel will not be used to silence Californians.

The Protect California Rights Act will protect the safety and rights of Californians by:

- Prohibiting local and state law enforcement from assisting federal agents in operations that involve racial or identity profiling, criminalization of speech, or use of unauthorized weapons of war against Californians.
- Prohibiting federal law enforcement from acting beyond their federal jurisdiction to stop and arrest Californians, except during times of emergency and with the Governor's approval.

## **ICE out of Dublin: No new ICE Detention Center in Shuttered Federal Dublin Prison (FCI Dublin)**

ICE has continued interest in reopening the notorious FCI Dublin federal prison in Dublin, CA as an immigration detention center. FCI Dublin was closed last year due to powerful survivor-led organizing following years of horrific staff sexual abuse, retaliation, and medical neglect. Survivors also uncovered inhumane and unsafe physical conditions at the facility, including mold, asbestos, and crumbling infrastructure. We call for the permanent closure of FCI Dublin and oppose its reopening as an ICE detention center. Prior to shutdown, non-US citizens incarcerated in FCI Dublin were specifically preyed upon by staff because of their immigration status and pending deportation case. Handing over a facility known for sexual abuse to another agency with a well-documented history of abuse is a recipe for disaster. Research has also shown that areas with immigration detention centers are correlated with higher rates of ICE activities and arrests. Join community advocates, survivors of Dublin, and Congressional representatives and sign the petition to demand a

permanent closure of FCI Dublin. The petition signatures will be delivered to local, state, and federal officials.

Additionally, such participation helps keep an eye on government efforts to subvert due process and assist ICE actions. In addition to providing a general introduction to immigration courtroom procedures, attendance is a prerequisite for those who plan to volunteer as court observers in San Francisco. Spanish language skills are not necessary for Court Watch. Efforts for Court Watch at Concord have been so successful that no further volunteers are needed at the present time in Concord.

**Background information from All Rise Alameda member Alice Sunshine:**

*All over the country, immigrant rights groups are waging a quiet but rapid mass distribution of information about our Constitution to people who need that information. In the past, the groups printed what's widely known as the "[red cards](#)" with text about our 4th and 5th Amendment rights—such as the right to remain silent, not open your door, etc. BUT—now that information needs to get into people's hands fast. So, the immigrant rights groups have dropped printing in red and they are saying to just make and circulate photocopies of the cards on sheets of plain white paper. Distribute those sheets of cards to people who can pass them on, and get them out in every way we can.*
