## "Create a City" Project

In Chapters 12 & 13, you have been learning about different aspects of settlements & urban patterns. Your evaluation for these chapters will be to create a city & draw a "Sanborn" style map.

Sanborn maps is an American publisher of historical & current maps of US cities & towns. The maps were initially created to estimate fire insurance risks. The maps include detailed information regarding town & building information. Author Kim Keister describes the legacy of Sanborn maps: "Stated simply, the Sanborn maps survive as a guide to American urbanization that is unrivaled by other cartography & for that matter, by few documentary resources of any kind." They are a highly useful resource for historical research, planning, preservation, genealogical research, sociological studies, & research of urban geography.

I have provided you with two example Sanborn maps so that you can get an idea on how to plan out and design your city.

The name, shape, & size of your city will come from your imagination. Maps will be drawn in class. **Make sure that you are creative, but not offensive!!!!!**

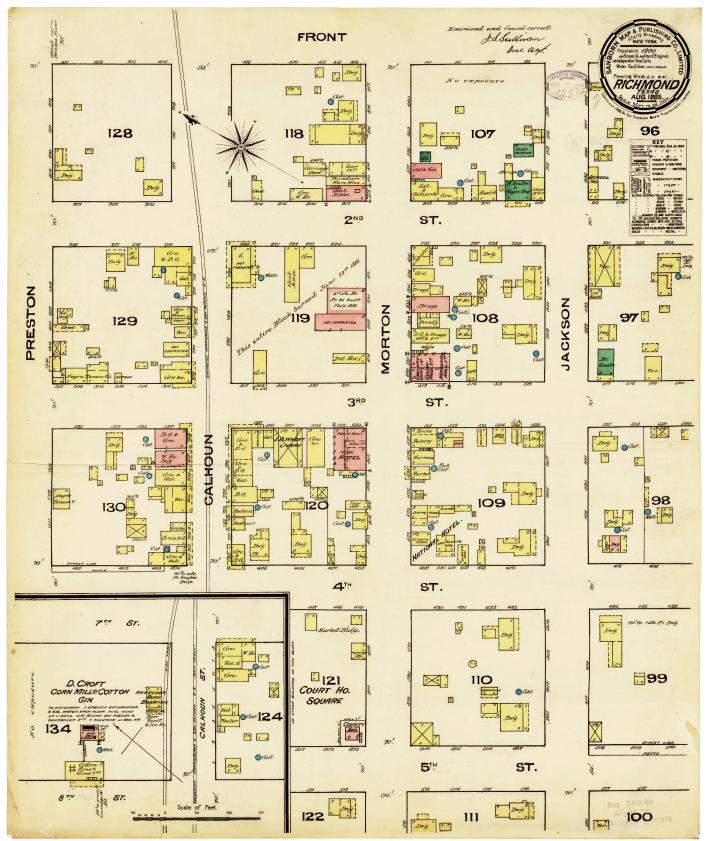

You will need to either label your buildings with the information in regards to what is located in them or you will need to color code your map (include this information on your map key).


