- 1. Develop principles & agreements for The Earth Bill Network.
- 2. Facilitate the formation of a high-level Coalition-of-Coalition.

ADOPT-A-DISTRICT TEAM: THE GROUND GAME

- 1. Establish lead organizations and activists in all 435 Congressional Districts.
- 2. Build mini-coalitions in districts across policy sectors to advocate for legislation.

- 1. Network Partners: Welcoming all local groups and activists. Over 70 local organizations and many activists nationwide, including national organizations & coalitions.
- 2. Faith Team: Welcoming faith leaders and organizations.
- 3. Indigenous Team: Welcoming indigenous people and organizations.
- 4. Art Team: Welcoming artists to help promote climate solutions.
