

Tic-Tac-Toe Menu

As you read your independent reading book, you are going to express your ideas about the novel you read using textual evidence to inform, explain, describe, or narrate to the class the importance of your novel. You will at least three weeks to read the book and an extra week to complete a tic-tac-toe menu project.

Directions:

1. Highlight the boxes you plan to complete. They should form a tic-tac-toe across or down.
2. **All the products** are due by April 3rd. You will need to **choose one project** to present to the class on April 6th.

Character Analysis: Choose a character other than the main character that you feel had a significant impact on the story. Design a "You Be the Person" presentation in which you come to class as your character and talk about the impact on the plot and the theme of your novel.	Promoting Your Novel: Consider all the reasons your classmates might enjoy reading the novel. Create an advertisement to encourage your classmates to read your novel. Make it unique and interesting!	Proving Your Point: Complete this statement with just one word: Everyone thinks the main character of my novel is _____. Create a cube with six best quotes from your novel that prove your statement is true. Be sure to document where you found each quote.
Proving Your Point: Determine the theme of your novel. Choose at least four quotes from your novel that strongly support a theme and at least four quotes that neither support nor disprove it. Create a folded quiz book that asks users to determine if the quotes support the theme.	Free Choice Project: Summarize the novel. Provide quotes from the novel that help describe the setting/environment and important characters to the book.	Promoting Your Novel: These are various reasons why people choose the novels they would like to read, from the cover, to the summary on the back cover, to the recommendations of other people. Create a persuasive commercial that shares all of this information about your novel.
Promoting Your Novel: The Book Hall of Fame is taking nominations for the best fiction book ever written. Create a nomination video for your book. Describe your book and why it deserves the honor.	Proving Your Point: Create a game show that has contestants evaluating quotes from your novel and determining if they support given statements about it.	Character Analysis: Create a three-dimensional timeline for the main character in your novel. Include at least one date before the novel begins.
