## **Content Standards:**

<u>Closure/Real World/Reflect</u>: journal writing - Do you have any certificates from your home country or the United States?

#### Day 2

#### Content Standards

Objectives: listening

<u>Real World Connection</u>: Ss learn about another career pathway possibility open to them through Pitt Community College's Continuing Education Division.

<u>Teach/Model</u>: T distributes <u>CRC Worksheet</u>. Class reads each question. T checks for understanding.

<u>Teach/Practice/Assess:</u> T plays <u>Career Readiness Certificate video</u> two times. As Ss watch, they take notes to answer the <u>CRC Worksheet</u> questions. Ss share their answers with a partner. Whole class corrects answers.

Discussion - What 4 ways can this certificate benefit you? T answers additional questions that may arise.

Closure/Real World/Reflect: journal writing - Is this certificate an option for you? Explain.
