## What will an LA do in this course?

The role of the LA varies slightly in each course. Read below for more information from Professor Stevens on the LA's role in this course.

*What is the role of the LA in this course?*

LAs in my GB1 section will work directly with their peers in small-group activities during lecture. They will help me determine in real time during lectures what concepts students are understanding and which require further discussion. During our weekly prep sessions, LAs will work with each other and me to plan review sessions based on material we've covered in lecture and what topics students find challenging. We'll also discuss strategies for running review sessions based on LAs' observations and their own past experiences of what works well. I regularly ask my LAs for feedback and advice on what works well and what doesn't and ask for suggestions on improvements, and adjust my plans accordingly.

***How could being an LA for this course benefit you?***

Based on my conversations with previous LAs, there are a number of aspects of the experience they find valuable. Seeing the process of learning from the 'other side' is often very enlightening, and the processes of leading students through course material and writing questions about the material helps them understand the material much better themselves. For students thinking about grad school, this experience is great preparation for the teaching that may be part of their grad school experience, and also an excellent addition to their application. For students planning on med school or other professional school, developing these communication and teaching skills is also great experience.
