Publications for regular track students: at least 1 reputable international journal publication (accepted: indexed Scopus Q1, Q2, Q3, or indexed WOS), or a combination of 2 publications with <i>accepted</i> status from: 1 reputable international journal (indexed Scopus Q4) or international proceedings indexed by Scopus -and 1 accredited national journal (SINTA 1, 2, 3). Student publications in the research path: at least 2 reputable international journal publications (accepted: indexed Scopus Q1, Q2, Q3, or indexed WOS), or a combination of 2 publications <i>with accepted</i> status from: 1 reputable international journal (indexed Scopus Q1, Q2, Q3, or indexed WOS) and 2 reputable international journal articles (indexed Scopus Q4) or international ng indexed Scopus index.
