

This protocol is designed for school teams to complete a thorough and comprehensive analysis of school-level chronic absenteeism data using the Attendance Data Dashboard. This protocol will serve to both familiarize yourself with the data displays in the dashboard as well as review disaggregated student chronic absenteeism data by school, grade, and subgroup to understand school attendance patterns and trends.

## Schools

The **Schools** page displays chronic absenteeism data by school per attendance category. The drop-down filters on the right can limit the view. Use the questions below to review the data.

Guiding Questions	Notes
<p>Compare category percentages amongst schools and to the <b>district</b>. What do you notice?</p>	
<p><b>If you only have one school per grade band, skip this question.</b> Use the Grade filter to cycle through one grade at a time. What similarities/differences do you notice about specific grades disaggregated by school? How do they compare to the district?</p>	
<p>When comparing your school to the other schools and the district, what stands out? What would you like to investigate further?</p>	

## Grade

The **Grade** page displays chronic absenteeism data by grade level per attendance category. Use the drop-down filter on the right to **select your school**. Use the questions below to review the data. (Ctrl+ or Cmd+ allows users to multi-select)

## Equity

The **Equity** page displays chronic absenteeism comparison data by subgroup per attendance category. Use the drop-down filters on the right to **select your school**. Use the questions below to review the data.

Accountability Connection - Many of the subgroups on this page correlate to gap closing subgroups.

- The filters will provide a view showing the attendance of students affecting multiple subgroups.

Directions:

1. **School:** Use the filter on the right to select your **School**.
2. **Grade:** Using the filter on the right, cycle through each **Grade** one at a time. Note observations in the respective subgroup area in the space provided.
3. **Race:** Using the filter on the right, cycle through each **Race** one at a time. Note observations in the respective subgroup area in the space provided.
4. **Economically Disadvantaged:** Note observations in the respective subgroup area in the space provided.

## Action Planning (30 minutes)

### Attendance Goal-Setting Best Practices

- Set annual attendance goals and measure your progress along the way.
- Ensure attendance goals reflect multiple attendance measures, such as:
  - Improvement in average daily attendance.
  - Reductions in the percent of students who are chronically absent.
  - Increases in students with satisfactory attendance.
  - Establish multiple goals:
    - School-wide.
    - Sub-group specific based on needs, such as reducing chronic absence among students with disabilities.
- Share attendance data on a regular basis.
