RESPONSIBILITIES

An Academic Link (AL) lives in residence and is responsible for providing academic programming and support to residence students in their faculty and complementary programs as assigned. The primary responsibility of the AL is to provide an educationally supportive community for students as they make the transition to university life and are challenged to develop as individuals. This responsibility is carried out by offering creative programming opportunities which address students' academic needs and interests, facilitating group and individual study sessions, and by collaborating with other student leaders in residence and across campus.

DUTIES

- Create and implement residence-wide strategies to support student learning and development.
- Liaise and meet with faculty, Faculty Associate/First Year Coordinator and other academic related staff
- Communicate residence and university policies to residents
- Coordinate or facilitate faculty/program specific passive and active programming activities monthly (i.e. speakers in residence, coordinating a study session, moderating a debate, attending academically relevant events on and off campus, etc.)
- Attend weekly staff, floor and community meetings
- Coordinate one-on-one meetings with students in their section
- Participate in staffing AL office hours for approximately 4 hours each week plus an additional 1 flex hour weekly for programming or supporting residents.
- Be available at reasonable times to help and assist students with academic questions in person/online
- Participate in the hiring of new residence life staff
- Create and manage an Instagram or other social media group to build community and share information/answer academic
 questions
- Support academic support/enrichment initiatives beyond residence (i.e. Student Learning Support, Tri-Mentoring Program)
- Plan and run one floor program per month for your floor community
- Support in one residence wide program per semester
- Support with major initiatives such as move-in day, orientation, and student staff hiring
- Other duties as assigned related to portfolio work in leadership, wellness, and residence activities

QUALIFICATIONS

- Good study habits, time management skills, organization, goal setting, problem solving and multi-tasking skills
- Good communication and interpersonal skills including flexibility, and ability to function as part of a team
- Sound understanding of group dynamics and factors affecting university students
- Ability to exercise independent judgment, take initiative and be creative.
- Minimum of 4 months of post-secondary studies; previous leadership experience would be an asset
