The home school is responsible for scheduling all regular season hockey games. All NorWOSSA regular season hockey games shall arrange for a three (3) man system for all games. The three (3) man-system shall consist of two (2) referees and one (1) linesman. If teams wish to use the 4-man system in regular season play, both teams need to be in agreement 48 hours prior to the game and all extra costs will be covered by the home team.

All NorWOSSA playoff hockey games shall run the 4-man officiating system. Two (2) neutral referees from our own league and two (2) local linesman will be used unless there is a mutual agreement by the schools involved to use all local officials.

The officials will be assigned by the convenor in coordination with the host school.

All attempts must be made to schedule them from the same community to facilitate safer winter travel.

Overtime in regular season play will consist of a five (5) minute period of four (4) on four (4) hockey. If the tie remains at the expiration of the overtime, the teams will have a 3 player shootout with the home team to determine who shoots first. If the game is still tied following the 3 player shootout, a sudden death shootout will take place until a winner is determined. All players (except goaltenders) must shoot before shooters can be re-used.

In the event of a tie game at the end of regulation time in playoffs, the following will apply:

1. Overtime period is stop time
2. Overtime is sudden victory except in a first phase of shootout
3. One ten (10) minute overtime – (4 on 4)
4. If still tied, a penalty shot system will be used; five (5) player pool from each team – total goals from five (5) players will determine the winner
5. If still tied, the remaining players will take alternating shots until a winner is determined.
6. Teams may however revert to the first 5 shooters, however they must shoot in the same order.

Exception:

1. Goalie does not participate in the shootout.
2. A player who has been assessed any penalty and has not fully served the penalty prior to the shootout is ineligible for the shootout process.
3. The home team will have the choice to shoot first or second in the Shootout.

And whereas...the OFSAA policy supports the decision of the local association		
Be it Resolved That...NorWOSSA adopt the OFSAA transgender policy under By-Law section 8 student eligibility as By-Law 8.1.1 to read “NorWOSSA TRANSGENDER PARTICIPATION POLICY		
Definitions		
1. The following terms have these meanings in this document:		
a) “Transgender” – Transgender refers to individuals who are born with the physical characteristics of one gender (male or female) but identify with the other gender.		
b) “Transgender Female” – Someone who at birth had a male body, but who identifies as a female.		
c) “Transgender Male” – Someone who at birth had a female body, but who identifies as a male.		
d) “Gender reassignment” – A professionally-supervised program of treatment by a licensed physician, to change a person’s body to align with their gender identity, through hormone therapy and/or surgery as well as counseling.		
Purpose		
2. OFSAA believes in equal opportunity for all people to participate in school sport. In order to accommodate transgendered students, while at the same time balancing safety and fair competition for all students, a participation policy for eligibility has been developed for transgender students.		
Eligibility Policy		
3. The following conditions will be used to determine a transgendered individual’s eligibility to compete:		
a. Transgendered females, to compete on a girls’ team, must submit documentation from the treating licensed physician to show that gender reassignment as defined in 1 d)		

above has been active and ongoing for at least one year.

b. Transgendered males may participate on a male team as per OFSAA'S gender equity policy.

4. Any transgender person who is not undergoing gender reassignment will be deemed to be their birth gender for the purposes of sport eligibility. Birth gender is that which is specified on the person's birth certificate.

Application for Eligibility

5. A transgender female is required to apply in order to be eligible to participate on a girls' team. The applicant will initiate the eligibility process by submitting documentation to NorWOSSA which demonstrates that they have been undergoing active and ongoing gender reassignment treatments (see 1 d above) for at least one year. NorWOSSA will decide each case based upon the documentation provided and may request additional information and or clarification.
