Meeting with Dean Kam, Dean of the NCE

- I met with the Newark College of Engineering Dean, Dean Moshe Kam, to introduce myself and any initiatives I hope to work on this year whilst following up on the progress of older projects.
- 2. We first spoke about the progress of the NCE tutoring center. Dean Kam said that Civil and Chemical Engineering have already begun to establish the the Tutoring center for their respective majors. I will be attending a Chair meeting that has all the engineering departments to discuss with them the continued progress of the tutoring program within each major.
- 3. We also discussed the current engineering pamphlets that were given out a couple years ago for some of the engineering majors. He liked the idea of updating them in a uniform manner and putting them on the department websites and the NCE website.
- 4. When it came to newer initiatives, I relayed to him the idea of having an NCE Professional/ Social event in tentatively November which would display all the engineering opportunities that students have on campus to build their resume and to further explore their interests. He told me to work with his office to come up with a concrete plan for the event within the next few weeks.
- 5. In addition, we discussed the NCE college funding regarding classes that require students to buy material for projects. He said that normally classes like this do not require a textbook, so the money that would go towards the textbook is expected to go towards students' projects.
