PBC ZONING COMMISSION HEARING- On 11/3, many CV unit owners attended a hearing of the Palm Beach County Zoning Commission, which considered an application from Khal Chassidm of WPB to convert part of the CV Medical Building into a Religious Place of Worship, reduce existing parking, and to construct two swimming pools at the rear and side of this building. There were five requests for variances associated with this application. Three of these variance requests were withdrawn before the hearing date. The remaining two variance requests were approved by the Zoning Commission, with modifications that include moving the northern edge of one swimming pool back to thirty feet from the Stratford A property line. The original application called for a twenty-four foot distance between the swimming pool and Stratford A.

The Board of County Commissioners will meet to decide on this application on November 28, 2022 at 9:30 A.M. at the Governmental Center, located at 301 N Olive Ave in West Palm Beach. The applicant, Khal Chassidm of WPB, has requested a Development Order Amendment to:

- Amend conditions of approval and reconfigure the Site Plan.
- Approve revisions which will include allowing the uses to be reconfigured within the same building footprint to eliminate the Adult Day Care and allow a Religious Place of Worship.

BULK TRASH- Last Friday, Waste Pro missed a number of bulk trash pickups at CV associations. I have sent a complaint to Waste Pro and PBC Solid Waste Authority, and will follow up until these pickups are made.

POST STORM UPDATE- CV was not affected by Hurricane Nicole. Overall, the property was very well squared away in the days preceding the non-storm. Thanks to all who helped with preparing for this non-event.

CERT- In the aftermath of storms and other emergency events, our volunteer CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) is trained to survey Century Village, assess and report on damage, and to assist CV residents and Associations. We encourage all CV residents to consider joining this group, which meets monthly at the Clubhouse. The next meeting of CV CERT will be on 12/9, at 1:00 PM.

COCONUTS- On 11/7, as preparation for the oncoming storm, D.R. Landscaping Services trimmed 118 coconut palms along the main roads of Century Village. As usual, some residents competed for the falling coconuts, ignoring and defying warnings from the workers, security guards, and me. Coconut palms at CV are treated with pesticides that accumulate inside the coconuts, and they are irrigated with recycled toilet bowl water. CV residents should not collect or consume coconuts anywhere inside CV.

BEES- On November 1, beekeeper Len Khan removed a beehive from inside an FPL pole near Bedford K, and another hive at Oxford 700. Capturing bees alive is preferable to killing them with insecticides.

GATOR- A large alligator has been reported in the Wellington section. A trapper has been assigned to remove it. In the meantime, please don't feed the gators. Please send gator reports to: ucomaintenance@gmail.com.

PAVING REPAIRS- On 11/8, Atlantic Southern Paving made repairs to roadways at various sections of Century Village. Roadway repairs are an ongoing effort.

RVS, TRAILERS, CAR CARRIERS, ETC.- As we come into peak occupancy season at Century Village, we are, as usual, seeing an increase of non-passenger vehicles and other equipment entering CV, which violate County ordinances, Association rules, and generally cause complaints and arguments between neighbors. To keep all of this to a minimum, and to limit damage to our roads, please be aware of the following:

- Vehicles that are over forty feet in length are not permitted through the gates. This includes moving vans, and vehicle/trailer combinations that exceed forty feet in length. Associations that are expecting material or equipment deliveries by over-length trucks should notify UCO in advance.
- Parking of recreational vehicles, boats, boat trailers, box trailers, jet skis, and portable storage units (PODs) inside Century Village for more than one hour is a violation of PBC Ordinance, and will be reported to PBC Code Enforcement without warning. The Associations that allow these vehicles to park on their property will receive the Notices Of Violation from PBC Code Enforcement, not the owner of the offending vehicle.
- Car carriers are not permitted to enter Century Village.
- All vehicles parked at Association parking areas must have license plates with current registration tags, should be in operable condition, and should not be used to store junk.


