## **April Pay Award**

In April there is a legislative change to the National Minimum and the National Living Wage. The legislation includes a decrease in the age requirement for the National Living Wage which is currently 23 years old and over but becomes 21 and over in April. In LUU we do not pay the National minimum wage for 18-20 year olds, all staff on Grade A are paid either the 21-22 rate (even if they are younger) or the 23 and over rate. The legislative change means everyone on Grade A will move to the new National living wage which is £11.44.

The other weekly grades will adjust alongside Grade A changing. The new rates can be viewed in the table opposite. These rates are calculated each year by maintaining the cash differential between the grades.
