

9-12 DESE Required Sexual Abuse Prevention & Harassment Training Letter to KSD Families

Dear Kirkwood High School Families,

The [Missouri State Statute 170.045](#) requires that students in grades 6-12 receive trauma-informed developmentally appropriate, sexual abuse training. The school district shall notify parents or guardians in advance of the training required under this section, of the content of the instruction, and the parent's or guardian's right to have the student excused from the instruction.

As a District, [we will use Vector Solutions](#) to deliver this training to students. Vector **Solutions** is an online provider of safety and compliance solutions that help create safer and more inclusive schools. The trauma-informed, developmentally appropriate, sexual abuse training will include the following four virtual courses.

Families choosing to **excuse** their students from the instruction must [complete the following opt-out form](#).

As a reminder to families, all school staff are mandated reporters, but anyone can report suspected child abuse and neglect. Mandated reporters "who know or have reasonable cause to suspect" are required by law to report child abuse and neglect. The hotline number for making reports is 1-800-392-3738.
