- Welcome Session, Elizabeth City State University
 - i. SGA President: Kayla Dixon
 - 1. Welcome to Elizabeth City State University! It is our role to advocate, collaborate, and push for progress on our campuses as needed.

ii Chancellor Edmonds

1. We are small but mighty! I am interim chancellor, I had been here before as the superintendent, but I am very excited to be back home. I want to take a second to share some of the great things that are going on here in Elizabeth City. Hugh Cale was our founder, March 3, 1891. We are seeing record enrollment this year, 2261 total students, and a 4.4% overall increase compared to fall 2023. 48% increase in the aviation program since Fall 2023. In terms of construction, we have a new Residence Hall with 352 beds, opening this summer, a dining hall opening this summer (751 students) and a caribou coffee opening, as well

as a new aviation building. We won the 2024 All In Award → most engaged campus for student voting. We are so thankful to the General Assembly for the NC Promise program, and to be able to connect with the ASG. We know what we do every single day is because of you, the students, so thank you.

Founded and funded by students, the University of North Carolina Association of Student
Governments (ASG) champions the concerns of students and ensures affordability and
accessibility to quality education today and tomorrow.

4. Guest Discussion

- Dr. Ivy Taylor, Senior Advisor to the President of the UNC System and Director of Local Relations at UNC Chapel Hill
 - i. What advice are you willing to give?
 - ii. I didn't know serving as mayor would be good preparation for serving as president of a college campus. But a college campus is much like a small town. It takes important work and injects work into spaces. We can all agree that within the last 25 years, the pace and speed of change have far surpassed my first 25 years of life. One of the other key lessons is the importance of lifelong learning. You still have to be willing and open to learning because the pace of change is very rapid. Charismatic leadership can be exciting for organizations but without structures in place, things will fall apart. It can be difficult when everything is galvanized around one person for it to work out.
 - iii. Wanted to ask a question about black history month, how do you challenge students to inspire this change on their campus and beyond their campus too?
 - iv. Focus on Martin, Malcolm, and Rosa, we owe it to them to help the next generation because there are so many disadvantaged people across our country. Black history is American history so everyone should know those stories so we can make a better history for those that come after us.
 - v. You were a president at an HBCU in Mississippi, how would you advise us to advocate for these issues as a higher education leader?
 - vi. I have to acknowledge Chancellor Edmonds, she is doing this important work.

 One of the key issues I was grappling with is the pipeline to our campuses, there are so many students ill prepared by the public schools, so we need to strengthen the pipeline and strengthen them as students before they arrive.

- vii. How would you advise students to advocate and be engaged in local politics when it's not the norm of their culture to be engaged?
- viii. Everyone is leaning in too much to the hyper partisan nature of the current political scene. Everyone is so focused on what's happening in Washington DC. There's an old saying that all politics are local. Use reputable sources about what is happening in your local community. Find a place to get ingrained in your local community, whatever that looks like to you. There are many ways to connect and see what's going on. You can also of course volunteer to assist local organizations in your community. I know you're busy, so the main thing is finding the time and being consistent but you will feel rewarded after the fact.
- ix. What role should students play in advocating for HBCUs and MSIs?
- x. I see student leaders as a bridge and connector on campuses between administrations and the student body. Frustrated on her campus with student leaders because she communicated a lot and after a while realized those students didn't actually communicate that narrative back to the student body. Challenge you all to communicate the information you receive with your student body's even if people don't want to hear. Being the bridge is really important!

 Sometimes there is a "town gown tension" and student leaders can be a big part in extinguishing that.
