'Stand! Fight! A Ballad in honour of the Nithraelas's martial prowess.

The sheet music is annotated with four bars of instrumental dedicated to a lute, or another, magically empowered string instrument. Given the nature of the ballad, this song indicated a need for passion and fervor. Everything about the instrumentation spoke of an urge to motivate, to inspire, and to incense the heart of the listener. They too could stand and fight; and triumph in the act!

The music explodes again with a warrior's furor, as though it sought to cast the listener into the heart of the fray with sound alone. The lyrics note a need for deep passion from the vocalist during the chorus.

The music recedes into a quieter tone once more, though this time it builds over a prolonged period of chants; like a looming storm drawing closer by the moment.

The music explodes again with a full-hearted passion. The defiance of a would-be champion manifested through the melodies of voice and instrument all at once. The momentum carries through to the very end of the song, as does the passion behind the lyrics.

The ballad ends suddenly, with no fading exit nor gentle retreat. It finds its close as swiftly as battles often did.

A footnote by the composer, 'The Rose of Boralus': "My path has crossed with those of the Nithraelas on multiple occasions. Though oft' they are lamentably brief, I have come to respect many of them for their virtues, tenacity in the face of adversity and, perhaps most importantly to this ballad: Martial capabilities. When I heard of their tourney and had the great bouts recounted to me by dear friends among their number, I felt compelled to commend their deeds to history. Legacy is an important matter, and I would see their favourable aspects and pursuit of mastery well remembered."

The sheet music for the song sells for 50 copper as a single ballad, or for a higher price as a part of an anthology (once published as such). It can be purchased from most bookstores and musical establishments within Alliance Territory.
