**TITLE: The Bronco Boost: Finals Care Relief Bill**

**I. Purpose**

The purpose of this bill is to ensure that ASBSU provides full support to students during finals week and provides resources for students during one of the most stressful times of the year. ASBSU's Health & Wellness committee is committed to providing support and resources to students that can positively impact their mental and physical health.

**II. Rationale**

WHEREAS, the Health and Wellness Committee's mission statement states, "*The Health and Wellness Committee exists to engage with campus partners and ongoing initiatives that provide essential health and wellness services.*";

WHEREAS, this bill proposes a tabling-style event where the HWC and ASBSU would provide beneficial finals week snack foods and beverages throughout the tabling events held that week;

WHEREAS, ASBSU and the HWC have created a sign-up sheet for tabling and will share the sheet closer to the event. In addition to providing a sign-up sheet, ASBSU and the HWC will staff and manage the tabling events;

WHEREAS, providing beneficial finals week snack foods and beverages will provide a more engaging environment and resources to reach the HWC's goal of providing resources to students;

WHEREAS, snack foods, such as dark chocolate protein bars and organic products will benefit students during their finals week;

WHEREAS, the HWC and ASBSU will take into account food allergies and offer different food alternatives for allergen-prone students;

WHEREAS, ASBSU will utilize \$900.00 in funding for providing beneficial snack foods and beverages that will improve student efficiency during finals week;

WHEREAS, ASBSU will provide chalk and select space within the Quad for anyone to display words of affirmation that will serve to help support students through finals week;

WHEREAS, ASBSU will encourage students to engage with all of our campus partners tabling alongside ASBSU for the chance to enter our Bronco merchandise raffle;

WHEREAS, the winners of these raffles will be announced by the end of finals week, and the items will be distributed following said announcement;

WHEREAS, these events will take place the week of December 15th, 2024, through December 19th, 2025;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that ASBSU will appropriate \$900.00 from the ASBSU Sponsored Projects budget, in the Committees line-item budget.

### **III. Account Drawn From**

Funds will be withdrawn from the ASBSU Sponsored Projects Budget.

### **IV. Provisions**

- I. \$900.00 will be allocated from the ASBSU Budget within the Committees budget line to be spent at a University-approved vendor (Albertsons & Costco)

  - B. All snacks and refreshments purchased will be used for tabling throughout this event as a resource for students.
- II. The remaining balance after completing all purchases will be placed back into the respective budgets.
- III. The provisions of this bill will go into effect upon the passage of this bill and its signature by the ASBSU President and Vice President.

### **V. Fiscal Impact**

- A. This Bill will have a total Fiscal Impact of \$900.00, which will be taken from the ASBSU Sponsored Projects Budget.
