

# Awesome Kidz 1

## Unit 3 Lesson 9



**Aim:** To introduce prepositions (on, under, next to) through interactive play.

**Time:** 45-60 min

### **Materials:**

- Real-life objects: a box, a ball, a toy train, and a doll or similar small objects.
- Crayons
- **AK audio track**

**Tip:** Make the activity playful by letting children take turns placing objects on, under, and next to the box. This hands-on experience reinforces their understanding.

### **Engage:**

Begin the lesson with a greeting song to get the children engaged and ready to learn. Use a real box, a ball, a toy train, and a doll to demonstrate the prepositions.

Place the ball on the box, the doll under the box, and the toy train next to the box. As you do this, clearly say, "The ball is on the box," "The doll is under the box," and "The train is next to the box."

Encourage the children to repeat the phrases after you and point to the objects as you move them around.

### **Explore & Practice:**

#### **With the Book**

Go through the images together, pointing out the ball on the box, the doll under the box, and the train next to the box. Ask the children to point to the correct image as you say the preposition out loud (e.g., "Show me what is on the box"). Tell children they will listen to the audio track and colour the pictures according to what they hear.

As they colour, walk around and ask them questions about the images: "What color is the box on which the ball is sitting?" or "Can you show me the doll that is under the box?"

Encourage the children to describe the images using the prepositions they have learned.

### **Closing:**

Play a simple game where you call out prepositions and the children must follow by placing a small object (like a crayon or a toy) on, under, or next to their chair or another object in the room.

For example, say, "Put your crayon on the table," "Put your toy under your chair," or "Stand next to your friend." Praise them for correctly following the instructions and encourage them to give directions to their classmates.
