St. Scholastica Alert Levels

Duluth Main and Health Science Campuses

St. Scholastica has established a color-coded series of alert levels intended to inform the college community about the level of risk posed by the COVID-19 virus to our community at any one time and the associated public health measures that will be implemented at each level. These alert levels will be based on specific data monitored on the Duluth campuses weekly, including testing for and monitoring the prevalence of the COVID-19 virus on campus, as well as other key metrics in the city of Duluth, St. Louis County, and the State of Minnesota.

The alert levels are defined by a set of indicators that include cases on campus, availability of isolation and quarantine beds, and the level of unknown case exposure (those cases that cannot be traced to a specific source). Additional factors affecting alert level determination include any new or modified Governor's Executive Orders; updated guidance from the MDH and CDC; travel availability and restrictions; faculty and staff availability to provide academic programs; and essential services as well as access to critical supplies and testing. Changes in alert levels will always be informed both by data and by our judgment of current conditions. The College will be prepared to move quickly from any level of alert to the highest level if necessary.
