

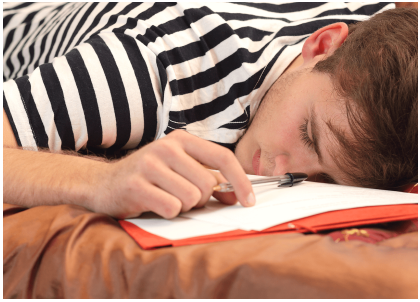
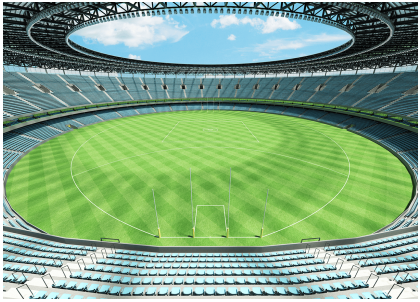
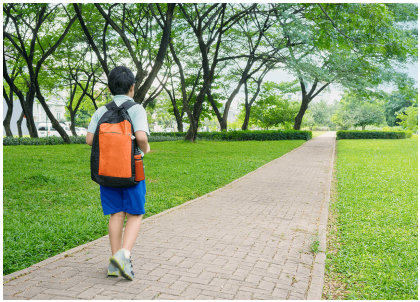
Word	Part of Speech	Example
