Top tier of legislative items did not all pass. We propose to continue working on items that did not pass

Member-led items. Still filling in items in the spreadsheet on the status of these items.

Proposals today is: 1) like to continue work that is not completed and 2) would like to be able to add additional items to the 2024 agenda. Sue came in as interim chair of Policy 3 months ago. Ask all organizations part of this coalition to give us what they are working on in 2024. Motion to do this. Was seconded. Discussion. Michael asked is part of intention to bump member-led items to coalition-led agenda items? Sue, we will discuss this at next Policy Meeting if this proposal passes. If 18 people are voting, does that carry for whole organization? We hold this as a public meeting so people can vote, comes down to how actively people are involved.

Policy team meetings are usually 2nd and 4th Mondays. During Nov and Dec 2nd and 3rd mondays. Plan it to begin meeting weekly starting Jan. 8.

Recognition of significant improvement in policies and coalition effort and role in these advances. Coalition reputation had been strengthened. Some of what we were doing was very broad. There was fatigue at end of session. Recognition that some important initiatives that were not successful. Lacking overall strategy. Frustration at lack of resources. Tension about involving people with lived experience.

Upcoming session

How coalition would advance agenda. Wanting greater clarity on role of coalition better sense of how coalition would operate. Discussion about how policy team attracted the most significant attention. Desire secure financial resources to insure activities and costs of coalition. Having a longer term strategy.

Vision: Every Minnesotan has dignified housing.

Mission: Homes for All is a statewide coalition to create policies and resources to prevent and end homelessness, and to ensure every MInnesotana has a dignified home.

Definition: note taker missed this

Key Principles

The Coalition Structure Policy team is core of coalition and looking to build around that. Venn diagram. Supporters outer circle. Inner circles: legislative team, engagement team, communications team, policy coordination and strategy team. Integrate the three aspects of policy work with each other. Policy team comes out of leg team, engage team and comm team.

Definition of who these groups are

Conceptual structure. Can we do this through meeting structure? Center things in the existing policy team meeting structure. Continue to have those meetings. Have breakout sessions where people could focus in on more specific topic areas. Eliminate redundant full coalition meetings. Could be an advertised time for new organizations that would be more explanatory and for when there is broader coalition business that needs to be done. Couple of times a month for orientation or training to join early. Opportunities to have team leads and others to come together and share space to coordinate how to advance agenda.

Sue - key is we want people to continue to join the coalition and to join the teams. Time before the team meeting is to educate people who want to be involved and understand how the process works. Involve all people and people with lived experience and advocate for themselves.

Michael - all of this is to make for fewer meetings and streamline the process. The work that has to happen through communication, engagement would happen in one meeting.

Sue - Will encourage a team approach. Valuing what each person brings to the team.

Linda - has fear how people might respond to change. How do we keep the origins as united coalition? Not great fear, just wants to state.

Sue - during breakout rooms, people choose which one to go to and then report back. Sharing ideas to bring back to the entire legislative team. People see how everything is working together.

Proposal is there would be 4 meetings a month through the session.

With this structure things happen when they are needed.

Shannon - question. One issue is engagement and action alerts. How does this structure help things get out? Strategic coordination will be leads of teams, will be provided the action alerts and letters of support. Team members need to put together the information. Shannon, where it has broken down is the coordination between teams. Action alerts need to be timely. Need to call this practical application out. Sue - After every meeting, the leads of the teams will meet to get the information out in a timely manner. Coordinating process happens right after policy meeting.

Michael - for every thing that happens there needs to be meetings and then coordinating what needs to happen. See all the teams work together.

Vote for the new structure passed

Begin to put the process in place as soon as possible.

Sue hopes we can begin at the next legislative team meeting. There is a lot of work to be done before the end of the year and the end of the session.

Rhonda stepping out of co-chair position. Encourage someone who is working in homelessness. Other teams might also want to invite in co-chairs. Sue is willing to be lead or co-chair. Important to have a diversity of people as chairs. She is searching for people to be co-chair. Engagement team would like to have a co-chair. If you are thinking about doing these positions reach out to Dave, or one of the current leads. There can be two more people for people with lived experience.

Working with coordinating team. Steps are 2 group conversations, set of individual conversations, email survey. Survey put together by three teams of the coalition. Hope people will take survey. Hoping for 35 responses. Open until Fri. Oct 27. There will be 2 sessions to review what we learned. Write an evaluation report. A session for planning for next legislative session. She will write a report

about this process. Amy has learned that this evaluation and planning process is like H4A the coalition altogether, exceeding energy levels and expectations. Taking questions now.

Kim - does one on one conversations include people with lived experience? Interviewing 6 - 8 people. Some have had lived experience.

Tammy - are we going to be having a process of choosing policy agenda. She has tried to treat this more broadly to not conflict with policy setting process. More about the coalition. Dave - next discussion will be on policy setting process. Small amount of funding we got to evaluate intended to support our processes for setting agenda and other work of coalition.

Why money is being used for this? Dave on funding. The Heading Home Funder Collaborative was interested in supporting the work of the coalition and gave money for this study. This offer for funding was made by Heading Home and not as a request by the coalition.

Dave and Rhonda are ways to get in touch with Amy.

Discussion of Agenda Setting Process

Policy team has been diving into this. Sue has stepped into a leadership role with Policy Team Sue - background on Policy Team. Annie and Michael are past chairs. Sue stepped up as interim co-chair along with Junail Anderson from Freedom from the Streets.

Last meeting reviewed what was passed. Where we are at. Next meeting next Monday at 10 am to 11 am. 1st and 3rd Mondays of the month. Correction: 2nd and 4th Monday is the schedule of the Policy meetings.

Asking Each org identify what they are planning to work on in next session (50 words) Have by 8am the day of the meeting. Get this to Sue.

Policy agenda was set for just one year. Need to decide what we are having on agenda this year. 2nd step will we add anything to the 2024 agenda. Discussion about

Sue has put her name in to be elected as co-chair of Policy Team. Looking for co-chairs. The Policy committee will be making that decision

Taking questions

Nancy thought Policy was meeting only on the 3rd Monday. Asked to put the link to policy meeting in the email. Always the same link. Sue will send out reminder emails. Put info in chat if you want to be on the email list for policy meetings. can I please be added to the policy list - Each meeting we will spend time going over the agenda so newcomers will understand what we are working on.

Sue wants the team to work more as a coalition than a federation. Supporting each others' work.

Dave - is it helpful to talk about how this has happened in the past?

Michael - in past written submissions. Scorecard to get a sense of what aligns. Presentation about each item. Ranking on what the coalition members support. Lengthy process. It took a couple of months. Link for last year's process https://homesforallmn.org/policy-adoption-process

Process will need to be different this year due to time constraints.

Dave - Should it be a two-year agenda or a one-year agenda? Adapt the answer to what we need to do each year.

Rhonda - how is Sue thinking about what to do about announcement of budget surplus. Sue - that is part of the variables to consider. Not trying to decide for the committee. Key is to come to a

consensus as much as possible working with coordinating team so everything is transparent. Struggle is setting the agenda later in process. As much as possible, set it a few weeks before session begins. Short session: Feb to May. Mostly bonding.

Michael - it is a policy and bonding year. First year as seen as budget and the 2nd year as policy and bonding.

Rhonda - MCH worked hard for money for shelter capital. Operating costs covered for shelters.

Dave - celebrate a long list of manufactured housing changes. Regulation.

Michael - wrote a celebration blog post. Best single year for tenants in decades, or maybe ever.

Paul - shelter capital a huge highlight. Building spaces just for shelter. Increase in support for emergency capital.

Shannon - core principal. We have a story to tell that success was across continuum from homeowners to unhoused. Show how it impacts households and families across state

What didn't go so well in the legislative session?

Challenge that there is no staff and all volunteer organization.

Shannon - broad agenda made it hard to have a consistent message. Use this to our advantage. Communicate that we are making an impact. Change dollars to ongoing resources. Use broad coalition to see why these dollars matter. ROI

Dave - The more simple and clear it is to be involved in H4A the better vs. need the full continuum of issues and organizations. Creates complexity and problems for time management. Ways to encompass both.

Michael - funding and policy were both amazing. Learn to talk about both. Momentous session.

What are priorities for the next session?

Shannon - opportunity to continue to broaden legislative champions and leaders. Bipartisan support. Our continuum of housing could help us to achieve that.

Next steps

Michael - HomeLine Housing and Tenants' rights.

\$100 million for first-generation DPA program run through Mid-Minnesota CDC (on our coalition led agenda)

\$200 million for housing infrastructure in cash

\$90 million for acquisition and rehab of NOAH

\$4 million for lead safe homes

\$10 million each for the manufactured home cooperative pool purchase and lending grants

\$46 million/ biennium for Bring it Home GF PLUS the metro sales tax portion

\$40 million homeownership investment grants to develop and rehab affordable homeownership opportunities

\$4.8 million for local housing trust fund match

Additional \$15 million for the manufactured home park infrastructure grants

Additional \$95 million in 24-25 for challenge program

\$50 million for SHARE

Additional \$2 million for Bridges and for Homework Starts with Home in base

Additional \$45 million for FHPAP in FY 24-25

Additional \$20 million one-time for workforce homeownership

Huge additional dollars going into affordable housing.

Thank community for coming together. Money that came together for Bring It Home funding, great work.

Beth - Bring it Home what is it? Additional 5,500 additional rental vouchers. Amazing achievement.

Michael - 3 things on coalition. Disappointment was that source of income protection did not make it into the omnibus. Sen. Latz was the person who stood in the way. Gear up for 2024. 14-day pre-eviction notices, expungement reforms both passed. 2 of 3 of the issues that they were fighting for did pass. Next year need to work on source of income protection.

Health and Human Services - anyone to lead through? Rhonda - waiting to hear where homelessness funding lands. Emergency services, shelter capital, and housing support funding are still waiting to hear where the funding will land.

Beth - Homeless Youth Act and Safe Harbor don't know the funding yet. Sitting and waiting to find out. Michael -Homes for All wrote letter about tax issue. 119, 000 additional households will get renter's credit now.

Dave - manufactured housing, need certain things in place to make it work. Notice of all sales before they are offered. Perfection combination of elements of protection. Improving quality of life over time.

Communications. Currently working on summarizing updates. Post stuff on websites to share more broadly and sharing videos that are getting created. Work to be done this summer, too. More updates as session winds down.

If anyone on the call has an update about a member-led H4A agenda item, please let me know, and we'll work to include it in a post.

Beth - question about tax that got passed. Some of tax bill was going towards homelessness in the counties. Is this true? Free up more money for HHS. Michael confirms this is true. Metro sales tax increase that is part of housing bill is going to counties as local response to housing and homelessness needs. Bring it Home got some of the resources. .25 metro sales tax increase.

Matt - what counties are getting might be different than HHS priorities. Doesn't think it is the same thing. Were talking about doubling aid for local homelessness prevention funds. Michael understands the Omnibus Tax bill was approved last night. People can go in and check.

Ron - Local homeless prevention aid. Funding is already secured and sitting on the table. Waiting on counties to develop a plan to use the funds. First release is in July. Matt wondering if they were going to double and curious how they are going to include tribes in this funding.

\$378 million for renters credit.

Housing Aid established in tax bill. Goes to counties and cities. Similar language to what's in seven county metro sales tax. Anticipate it being skewed to GM cities and counties.

4d is in the bill. Haven't seen final language. What's on spreadsheet reflects the full .25 rate ask.

Tribal Nation aid can do housing activities.

One time capture/transfer of mortgage registry and deed tax for workforce and affordable homeownership program

Organization update and advocate updates

Michael - honor to work on this with everybody. We have made an impact in the direction. Detailed asks have mattered. Beth echos this. Youth Services Network doing best they can with volunteers. Means so much to collaborate with H4A. The more I learn about lobbying and policy work, eyes are open to how much work that is. Dave - echoed Michael. Hard work that people continue to do over

time. Look back 10 years, different legislators. Victories possible this year because of consistent messages over time from this group of organizations. Understanding of the issues has increased. Michael - organizational update - Tenant protection. In addition to 3 items, transparency in cost of housing. Landlords can tack on additional fees and need to disclose at beginning of lease. Privacy protection. Medical termination of lease. Heat code of 68 degrees. Emergency repairs expanded. Change in eviction procedures. There are a whole bunch of things added this year for protections. Dave - Home Health MN getting close to end of available funds. Need to apply to be on a waitlist. Be aware if you work with folks who could benefit from program.

Michael - can't speak for legal aid. But they will be doing a number of zoom trainings on specific changes that happened this year. Sign up for their monthly newsletter to informed about upcoming trainings. Some changes won't happen until 2024. Wrote a book in 2012 and need to write another book to update information. https://homelinemn.org/home-line-connection-newsletter/

Linda - new tenant handbook and tenants need to be informed.

Presentation: Housing Narrative Lab Marisol Bello, Executive Director. introduced. How we are talking about housing today.

Narrative Lab we do the research and help shape the public narrative. Mission is change minds
Narrative. Context setting. The big story. Collection of stories. Builds trust and connection. Messaging.
Opportunity agenda likens narratives to mosaics. What is narrative? List in chat. People with lived experience lead in the storytelling. Dismantling dominant narrative. Narratives permeate. What does narrative power look like? Ensure communities have tools to dismantle dangerous narratives, resources, space to tell stories.

Words like housing turns issue into a technical issue. People don't respond to that language. People move to action about what they believe and how they feel. Michael how to move beyond charity and to more systemic solutions. How we tell the story is critical. Intentionally connect them to system barriers. Elizabeth - will work on how this will work. If folks have suggestions on who to participate, put in chat. Reated to constitutional amendment? Separate project but for whole continuum. Constitutional Amendment for Housing

James Haggar - Overview of the amendment and updates. Time is critical for a bold move. Structure hasn't changed things over the years. 3 spaces: create homes, prevent homelessness, and eliminate disparities in housing across state. Principles Race Equity, Sustainability and Climate, Uplifting Rural Voices, Accessibility, Ensuring frontline leaders are decision-makers and campaign leaders.

Sue - can we change for describing frontline leaders as people with lived experience.

Not a new concept for Minnesota. Legacy Amendment passed in 2008. Colorado passed Prop 123 in 2022. Same values we are lifting up.

Steps: legislature approves to get on ballot, can only go on ballot in even year. Goes onto November ballot. Need a majority of everyone who votes to pass.

Don't expect to get through legislature this year, but next year. Get on ballot in 2024 Draft language

Shall the Minnesota Constitution be amended to dedicate funding to creating homes Minnesotans can afford; increasing opportunities for Minnesotans to own their own homes and reducing racial gaps in homeownership; improving housing conditions; and reducing and preventing homelessness; by increasing the sales tax rate beginning July 1, 2025, by 3/8 of one percent, and specifying that the dedicated revenues shall not supplant existing appropriations for affordable housing programs

Addresses rental eviction? Yes.

Effective on Jul 1 2025 if it passes in 24. Could future legislature overrule? No that is why we are going for constitutional amendment.

How funds will be used. 3 flexible funds. \$440 mil will go up each year. Household and community stability Rental opportunity Home ownership opportunity Want to be clear on guidelines but not rigid about future needs.

Key pieces reducing disparities Community based Improve home Energy efficiency

Council of 24 people including people with lived experience. Will be core piece of deciding how this money will be spent. Appointed. Budget and policy for each of the three funds. Most appointed by the governor and some by legislative leaders. There are parameters, not just anyone. State-wide council.

Budgets have to be approved before money goes out. Does money roll over for next year? Yes. Money would move through Mn housing. Doesn't sit in general fund.

Where we are in campaign. Next week hear what budget targets are. Amendment is way we get investment over the long term. Lobby Day at the Capitol March 23. Talk about amendment and their own agenda. Introduce

the bill. No amendments will get put on ballot this year. Hard to get through revisor process this year. Waiting to introduce bill. Then do press and kick off events. Begin working with Housing Narrative Lab - broader than the amendment effort. How to make shift in issue like housing to an issue that people want to act on.

Sue - good to see people in millennial age group involved and seniors who are struggling.

We don't have House file yet because hasn't been introduced yet. As soon as there is a bill they will get it to this group.

3 things to cover. 3 actions: Pathway home, emergency assistance, request on targets. Conversation about racism and white fragility in committee hearings. Individual bill status.

Pathway Home Act. Rhonda. Now we have action alert through MCH to have Gov. and Lt Gov to pass the act. \$150 mil shelter capital, funding for emergency services program, money for transition housing program, money for homeless youth act. Funding home management system. Chosen family grants.

Sue: \$40 million for emergency services grants;

\$25 million for Homeless Youth Act grants;

\$9 million for transitional housing programs;

\$2 million for Homeless Youth chosen family grants; and

\$1.25 million for a homeless management information system.

Matt: +\$150M for shelter capital

and next biennium, emergency services grants increases to \$70M/biennium and Homeless Youth Act increases to \$40M/biennium

Family homeless prevention program hearing. Not scheduled for Senate yet. Calls are helpful. Dziedic having health issues. Call staff.

Targets. Action alert drafted. In chat. Needs to be circulated right away. Budget targets will set how much money we have to work with. About generating that there is broad support for these targets. Targets could be set early next week. Call before that.

Racism/white fragility in committee hearings. Questions about why Black communities were being highlighted and not everyone. History of redlining and GI Bill not for Black veterans. A testifier shared a story about person choices and was told that actions have consequences. Then another member asked for a hug from testifier. Is there a response that we need to make? Bringing testifiers into this environment is not good. Sue's

recommendation is a letter from H4A. Do we want to do this? Who do we share it with? Conversation about options.

Sue: Making sure folks within own culture were advisors about becoming home owners. Letter value people of color for their testimony, need to be respected. To address disparity, need to target specific groups.

Michael: protect testifiers. How to expect this behavior.

Dave: appreciate bringing forward. Need to figure out how to respond and what we recommend for what committee leadership does in the moment.

Rhonda: Do people who are leading on that bill want us to act? Need to check with them.

Paul: Go to committee chair with anything approaches racism. Copy the Speaker on the issue. Hears doesn't want to cause harm to bill but need to address this when it happens. Well worth it for this group to do something.

Michael and Annie had conversation with Rep Howard. He feels like he should have done more.

Paul: Private conversation is not enough.

Sue would outreach with David to have interaction with bill authors before our action.

Paul: harm does not extend to just this one bill. Larger than that.

Michael: do we want to just comment on this incident or in a general way? Don't put any testifier on the spot. Address it from a general perspective. Any other incidents?

Paul: racism has happened before. Ask for leaders to say it is racism and to stop it when it happens. A work in process.

Sue: this treatment is true for those who have been experiencing homelessness, too.

Dave: frustrating theme during this session. Sorting out the worthy and unworthy for help.

Michael: letter to leadership with instruction when these issues happen, chairs need to intervene. Name the behavior and to acknowledge the value of the story the testifier is giving. Weeking meetings between Speaker and Minority Leader. Right now, non-public letter, shared with leadership and ask if there is a conversation that needs to happen between parties.

Paul Slack: An extra step could include a public acknowledgement that disrespect will not be tolerated, leadership will ensure that the public will be respected.

Sue, will members of H4A get this letter? If that is so, then it is a public letter. Could talk about the content at the next policy team meeting.

Linda wonders if there is a Robert's Rules that allows for interruptions.

Bring it Home up for committee today.

Shannon - thanks all. Will communicate to comms team on Monday. Send information to the team.

Heading Home Minnesota Funders Collaborative Support Funds of \$20 thousand secured for H4A for engagement, alerts, resources, stipends for testifying. Shared screen of the agenda and went through each one

Question on number one: clarify the wording around acquiring and/or rehab. Goal acquired by affordability-minded buyer. There are properties that need rehab but do not need to be acquired. Answer, think there are other programs for rehab alone. The goal of this program is to acquire new properties.

Continued going through the policy agenda.

The constitutional amendment concern. If there is a knee jerk rejection of this, could it affect the whole agenda? Sue, there have been other proposals that have taken a long time. This issue helps to broaden the discussion of fair housing.

Sue - could we do updates on member-supported items? MICAH bringing forward Lead Safe Home Bill = Rep Fischer and Sen Howard are authors. Also working on Guaranteed annual income legislation bringing through the Tax Committee. Also working on making sure two programs don't compete with each other.

Question about Member-led points from Jean Lee. As people vote are they voting for the agenda plus member-led issues. What do the votes mean? The vote is for the full slate of items. Do you support the proposals over all. Point system is over with. Agenda is presented in total form. Not trying to assume any hierarchy between the two tiers.

Dave - how the issues are described is a representation of what our individual organizations have already voted on. All proposals came from much longer proposals. Descriptions are not as complete as they could be.

Michael - HomeLine voted yes to support agenda though there is one item that HomeLine does not support. Our vote reflects supporting the full agenda with one exception.

Steve - Coalition will invest time and resources on this policy agenda. When we are doing work as a coalition, we are focusing in on these 10 items and there are these other member-led items. Is this how this will work? Lillian on comms team and agrees with this assessment. Make sure there is advocacy material with this idea in mind. We will have a cache of one-pagers for member-led items and can be used.

Paul - when communications materials are done. One-pagers focus on main body of the policy agenda. Not including member-led items.

Shannon - comms team taking suggestion on what people lead. They are trying to support initially and as we go through session. Importance of getting message and key themes ready for Launch. How to support the member-led issues given the capacity of the comms team and what already exists from the member organizations.

Mary Ann - as reading through proposals, there is one thing I noticed, we have a lot of requests for vouchers, things like that, but need to request for homelessness all the time. We need to secure vouchers then people become homeless again. Protect vouchers. Bring It Home is a universal proposal that may help. Protection from housing directors to take back voucher. That is the type of problem people with lived experience have. In this policy requests money but not oversight and implementation. Sue: Homes4All supports task force for shelter standards. Dollars in emergency programs could help work through some of those issues.

Time check. Dave. our work on this agenda will not end with approving it. Suggestion anything in the first 10 points, the policy team meetings could be a good forum for discussing and clarifying the items. For the member-led items, come up with a system where people can contact them about issues and proposals. Indicate how to vote. Within the meeting or by following the link https://forms.gle/igWoaeBLeNhKuB688

This is an annual agenda not clear about it being a bi-ennial agenda. Annie replied that there is an assumption this is the agenda for the biennium, but will change if/when any of these things are passed.

Jean Lee wants to amend the first proposal. That is not allowed in this process. Suggested to work with the organization bringing the proposals forward.

Bloomington has loan program to give out small amounts to keep up the home appearances. Severe problem for seniors and disabled.

January Launch Event. - Matt. Last meeting poll showed support for virtual/hybrid. Are there dates to avoid? MLK holiday should be avoided. There is an event in the 2nd week with lawmakers going to UofM. Humphrey Institute. Other ideas: Would it be good to target MLK in the rotunda on that day? So many events already planned on that day, it would be hard to think that it would go well. Would we be able to connect with one of those already planned events? Could H4A get connected to the Governor's event? There is only a limited amount of tables but there are other ways we could be included. If we started our kick off event after MLK could we start with an initial tie-in to build on in future. Could provide information about H4A kick off at the Governor's event. Question, how late can we have a kick off event? Mid to late January is still good for our kickoff, based on past experience. Avoid Jan. 22 and 23rd conflict with Tammy's organizational retreat. In the past the launch had good speakers and proposals for the

Legislative agenda. This year, what would we include in kick off? Goal is to decide at the Nov. 30 engagement committee meeting. We haven't had much emphasis on having lawmakers attending but could change that this year.

Discussion: Lillian as we get list of Tier 1 and Tier 2 issues focused Comms wants to do things in a timely manner. Once we have the 10 ideas for Tier 1, get the focus points to them. 3 - 5 bullet points of what you are asking for. 2 points on why. Get tot hem by Dec 1. Then can get it together by January launch. While they are making one-pagers, if your org has graphics or pictures get that to them by Dec. 1 as well. Voting won't be done until Dec. 16. They are asking if anything can be done ahead of time, then send it in. The later we get in Dec then the harder it will be to prepare the information. Circle back to coordinating committee to see what the plan can be. Every organization that is presenting a proposal should have 1 - 2 sentence descriptions.

Questions: Sue - if all proposals could provide the key points to Comms team in advance of the vote by Dec 1. How will comm teams be posting the Tier 2 and 3 issues? Suggestion of Hot link to Bills. There be a contact person that is taking the lead. Lillian - Comms wants to get things out in a more timely manner. Suggesting having a one pager for Tier 1 and Tier 2, then after the information is gathered they will come back to this group for a proposal of how to share the information. When H4A decides the policy agenda then they can get going right away. What website looks like is open to suggestion. Sue's suggestion: sooner rather than later add the agencies with contact person.

Final Ask: by Dec. 1, agencies need to submit 3-5 bullet points, and, agency contact to Comms before vote so that things can be timely. Agencies can create their own talking points. Want the key talking points per issue wherever it lands on the policy agenda. Send to Lillian

Linda: there is a need to include testimony from people with lived experience in the material. People do not have iconic messages ready. A large packet of information to the legislators. Are we getting our story out? Lillian: Concern is for whether the Comms team can do that. If agencies get the information together, H4A could brand it and share it. Last year, changes in message was hard for Comms team. Linda wonders if we can hire consultant to produce the material.

What is Comms team? Lillian; we are here to put out the communication that H4A uses. Twitter storms, social media content across platforms, work getting emails out to everyone and development of website.

Reach out to Lillian with other questions

Policy

Michael - process for setting policy agenda. Hope there will be 10 items to fit on main agenda for H4A. There will be rank voting where each org can vote on proposals. Voting starts after next Tues when the next final presentations will be made. The votes need to come in by the following Monday by the end of the day. There are about 30 proposals. 2nd side of one-pager will have the supported and endorsed agenda. The proposal will be sent to full group for final approval of policy agenda.

First proposal meeting - went well. Enough time for presentations. Lots of proposals. Annie and Michael will work on an email about proposals made on Tues. Talk about how the votes will take place. Will be sent out soon. The meeting was recorded and the link to that will be sent out.

Policy is starting to think about what kind of broad messaging they want to have.

Linda with a bylaws question, we need to have people who have experienced housing insecurity as co-chairs of our committee. Rhonda, the issue is identifying people who want to do that. Does Linda know anyone? Is trying to give others who have this experience representation. Ground it in the stories of the day, How about a stipend to get people to commit? Other organizations are engaging those people. We have room to grow there. Especially the policy team.

Sue - two points. In Policy asking for how to include these voices and encourage folks. MICAH willing to put in \$100 - \$200 a month and suggests that other organizations could also put in money to help pay for the expertise of people with lived experience. Rhonda, there used to be a fund. Those funds are gone. If we do this funding within the organizations then we need to approach MCH to hold the funds.

4. Post-Election Debrief

Gov Walz won, House DFL held leadership. Senate flipped to DFL. Trifecta - one party has control in all 3 spaces. Could be a big opportunity for Homelessness agenda. Will share more intel about who will be chairs and other positions. One-third of legislators are new. Committee structures will be released Dec. 3. Lisa DeMuth is minority leader instead of Curt Dout. Could be a better person to work with. Sue - encourage us to meet with newly-elected and current elected officials as soon as possible. Linda in a cohort that just went to White House about a lot of renters could own their homes.

5. What are you hearing? Minnesota Housing is concerned during the last time there was a trifecta that negotiations fell apart. Share out what we are hearing about big campaigns we are hearing about. What is being planned for 2023 within the housing realm? A list:

2023 Policy Agenda Setting Process

Michael Dahl - Policy team coordinator with Annie Shapiro. Suggested process for policy setting created by Annie. What we are asking for.

Trying to achieve - Homes for All agenda growing year after year. Hard to know what to talk about when so much needs attention. Hard to do every issue justice. Want to have fewer issues. Wants to optimize the experience of this group and to include people with lived experience of housing insecurity.

Organizations need to submit proposals by 5pm Nov 10.

Nov 15 and Nov 22 policy team meetings that everyone is invited to review proposals. Prepare by reading proposals in advance. Will not be long presentations. 3 - 5 min presentation and then Q and A. Lots of material sent out in past, so asking to keep it brief. Limit to 2 pages. One page is better than 2. Invite everyone who cares about these issues to be involved. Write out acronyms for special terms/programs. Use acronyms after writing whole name. Use simple language. Many legislators don't know what the acronym means. Include email and contact information. If asking for funding, provide the amount. Don't know how committees will be structured but try to identify which legislative committees that will have jurisdiction. Identify: is it a new program, modification of existing program, for funding? We want to know from people who are affected by proposal. Engage them and ask them about your proposal. Increase the number of people with lived experience in this group and in this process. What part of the continuum does this fall under?

Proposing Tier system. Level of involvement and support from Homes for All. Tier 1 - H4A will take initiative for these programs. Bonding example. Tier 2 issues- Your organization wants to take lead on the issue but still be on the main agenda for H4A. Tier 3 - endorsing agenda. Not on main agenda but on second side of page that is handed to legislators. Sign on issues - letters of support. Some issues proposed that don't belong will take 60% of vote to be taken off agenda. Not going to use the same scoring system as in past. Rank your top 10 issues and whether Tier 1 or Tier 2. Ranked choice voting to figure out what the top 10 issues that will be on first page.

Questions/comments

Linda- weird to do the work and not be included in agenda.

Michael - will be hard to reach the threshold of not being included

Straw Poll on this new process: Thumbs up for the process.

Contact Michael or Annie with questions or comments. If you know other organizations to be added to Coalition list send to Michael or Annie

Sue - Are policy meetings every Tues at 10 except Election Day? Answer: **Next policy meeting will be Nov. 15 and also meeting Nov. 22.**

Matt - will the meetings where votes happen be sent by email to the full coalition list? Is voting live? Will non-policy team members be welcome to the space?

Michael asked the group:. Do people have the presentations recorded and shared with other members for those who can't attend the presentation meetings? Getting straw poll. 50% yes. Q and A will be recorded for proposal presentations. Each organization gets only one vote but wants inclusive attendance.

Paul - When to vote. Should people with lived experience get to vote based on being part of organization or give them a vote in another way?

Michael - within each organization, include people with lived experiences thoughts of what the agenda should be Shannon - put voting structure out before the first policy meeting.

Paul - comment. Telling organizations to do what they can is inadequate to increase involvement of people with lived experience. Would like us to be more intentional about this. Create a strategy for this rather than do the best you can. By next year have more knowledge about who is present and have better strategy

Rhonda - we don't capture who has lived experience in our introductions in our meetings. Could change that. Need to know how the organizations are capturing the thoughts of people with lived experience and how they are involved in your organization. We don't know what our organizations are doing in terms of reaching people with lived experience. Need to share that information with each other.

Sue - supports what Rhonda says. Not even waiting till next year. Ask groups like Freedom from the Streets and No More Streets and other groups of people with lived experience, with paid stipends, to review proposals.

Matt - Lived experienced groups who are not an endorsing organization of H4A. Could they get a vote too?

Sue - Agrees that separate votes from organizations of people with lived experience should happen

Michael - supports this but will check with Annie as co-chair. There are parts of the housing continuum that have not been included. How to include all these people.

Paul - supports

Linda - HUD wants every COC in nation to have members of people with lived experience. Parents with young adults with special needs have not been served. How to include them.

Matt - The longer we wait, the harder it will be. Yes, lived experience group can get their own vote.

Rhonda - straw poll - can lived experience groups have their own vote? Majority supports this.

Communications and Engagement Team Updates

Matt - we are planning for launch. H4A annual launch poll:

- 1. How should we do the Launch? In person Virtual Hybrid
- 2. If we do Hybrid or in-Person show we have regional Launches?
- 3. If we do Regional Launches, would you be willing to lead or help lead one in your region? This is to gauge interest.

Sue - regional approach great. Also great to do one major one with all the partners.

Rally - in person, presence at Capital. Easily do it Hybrid.

Ron - Comms had a good meeting with conversation about inclusion of people with lived experience. Discussed what endorsing agencies can expect from us and we from them.

Rhonda - Monthly hybrid meetings? Would love to host those at LSS. Jeru says there is space.

MICAH just completed virtual bus tours. Over 600 people attended. Enthusiasm to use \$12 billion for housing issues.

Coalition Conference at the end of Sept. 500 people gathered. Wonderful to be in person again Winona trying to do scattered site supportive housing. Building a trust fund with help of MHP.

Setting the Legislative Agenda - Rhonda & Dave

Working groups would prioritize what advances to legislative agenda. Who makes those decisions? Dave - the logical question. How does this relate to sticking to the agenda. Still open process to make proposals. Working groups around themes/goals makes sense that those groups to help to figure out primary agenda and support items. Need additional discussions, sooner than Oct full group meeting. Have something more refined; themes, working group model, and process for legislative agenda. Proposing another meeting to figure out these things. Rhonda - do we come with a proposal or give people opportunity to meet again. Poll - meet in Oct or another meeting before that.

Paul - like how we collectively setting policy directions last year. Then dividing those policies up according to the themes of the working groups. Disparities, race, disabilities in all the policies.

Michael - a lot of work and not enough people. Proposing additional work. Should it be responsibility of organizations who are working with people experiencing insecurity make sure those voices are at this table.? Or we can ask people for their feedback about what is being proposed.

Rhonda -One of the challenges for H4All, who holds responsibility?

Paul - some key voices are missing.

Sue - Both. identify folks we know involved in our work already to be here, and to pay them to be here. Can get that input in our different settings. It is a both. We want to grow leadership in these groups. Have to think of the timing of the meetings, does it work for people experiencing insecurity?.

Patricia - last year was overwhelmed how to engage with this organization. Is there an onboarding process? Could be overwhelming for those who are experiencing housing insecurity.

Aamina - could be cultural thing occurring that people in this space aren't aware of. Typical difficulty is don't feel understood and engage in a space where the culture is different. A lot of work for the person who is not part of the dominant culture. How to make meetings more engaging. Defaults to dominant scripts. Bailee - new in field. Onboarding process would be appreciated.

- Updates:

Policy Team

- DRAFT recommendations
- The legislative session ended the last Monday before memorial day weekend (18)
- o Getting the legislature to act was a win
- Bonding bills did not pass. HIB was pulled out of the overall bonding bill as could pass with a simple majority. Did not pass either.
- Below is how we will continue to advocate going into special session.
- Homes for All continues to advocate for \$100 million in housing assistance funding and policy alignment on the eviction moratorium that aligns with the federal CARES Act timeline on halting evictions (end of July + 30 day grace period).
- The coalition continues to advocate for at least \$200M in HIB and \$100M in GO. This includes two new uses the coalition supports on its agenda. A one-time 10% set-aside for shelter capital needs and deeper affordability. The coalition remains neutral on other new uses.
 - Deeper affordability This would be the only state resource that targets households at or below 50% AMI this is where there is the greatest gap in units available and affordable. Often families and individuals are forced into a traumatic experience of homelessness in order to get into housing (with supportive services, because that is all that is available) or they have to double up with friends or family.
- Currently, the multifamily market is producing roughly 8,400 units for households at or above 50% AMI whereas only 400 units for households at or below 50% AMI. To meet the demand for households at or below 50% AMI, we need to create nearly 4,500 new units/year. The need is especially acute for households at or below 30% AMI. There is supply gap of nearly 65,100. There is a supply and available gap of nearly 113,000 units.
- Shelter Capital 80 out of 87 counties in Minnesota don't have enough beds to meet the need. In the past 3 years the unsheltered homeless populations has grown 62% and shelters are at capacity. The coalition has never advocated for the development of shelter, preferring to put limited resources towards permanent housing, but the needs are too great. We have seen this highlighted with COVID-19 and too many people crammed into too tight of spaces. Shelters are doing the best they can.
- Any changes to the energy code (i.e. lines 8.31-9.2 in the Senate Housing Bill) do not align with the Homes for All agenda that we adopted this fall to support energy efficiency standards.
- The Homes for All coalition has not taken a position on other policy items in the Senate Bill and would like to see HIBs in the larger bonding bill and the housing assistance + eviction moratorium in a separate bill as well.
- Moving forward
 - We need to be unified with our message and what we advocate for

Minnesota Housing Finance Agency (MHFA) Request

- Challenge Program A flexible tool used for the development and preservation of multi- and single-family housing statewide. Outcome: \$5 million increase (one-time)
- Homework Starts with Home Supports collaborative efforts between schools, housing organizations
 and local governments to identify, engage and stabilize students experiencing homelessness and their
 families. Outcome: \$3.5 million base funding
- Family Homeless Prevention and Assistance Program (FHPAP) Rental assistance funding to serve adults, youth and children at risk of experiencing homelessness. Outcome: \$3.5 million increase
- Bridges Funds necessary rental assistance for adults with serious mental illness. Outcome: \$500,000 increase
- Workforce Homeownership Minnesota (WHOM) Provides funding support for statewide affordable home ownership development and rehabilitation. Outcome: \$500,000 increase
- Manufactured Home Grants. Outcome: \$2 million increase

Department of Human Services (DHS) Request

• Emergency Services Program (ESP) – Funds emergency shelters and homeless support programs (low barriers, etc.). Outcome: \$3 million increase (one-time)

Bonding Request

Housing Infrastructure Bonds (HIB) – Preservation of federally subsidized rental housing, construction of
permanent supportive housing for people experiencing or at risk of homelessness, and for Community
Land Trust land acquisitions for single-family home ownership. Outcome: \$60 million

TOTAL - \$78 MILLION in new housing money

How does ESP work?

- Grant program with Office of Economic Opportunity (OEO)
- This year represents 13% to Minnesota housing, and an ongoing 10% which is significantly more than any other programs
- Statewide/bipartisan support all around
- We need more but celebrate what we did win
- Significant wins on the policy side as well
 - Manufactured housing right to refusal language passed
 - 5 consensus items were worked on by a steering committee and they work on readjust how taxes/bonds are allocated

What did NOT pass?

- WHOM not included; made it to the Senate omnibus bill
- Tax Credit Contribution Fund
- Local Housing Trust Funds

 due to small amount of one time funding available
- Capacity Building for the tenant hotline
- Homeless Youth Act
- GRH Housing Supports
- Long-Term Homeless Supportive Services
- Housing Supports for Adults with Mental Illness
 - A lot was not funded on DHS side
- MFIP did receive \$100/mo increase

In the orgincal house position ESP had \$1.5M in negotiations even though the Senate had nothing and we doubled the amount

What things had an impact on our wins/losses?

- Dedicated chair Hausman we have a wonderful relationship with and we have meetings with her to talk through strategy
- We pushed leadership to have a committee
- The Lt Governor Forum and MHP candidate questionnaires make housing a "maturing issue"
- MFIP increase
- Provider tax helps continue some of the healthcare
- Governor/Lt Gov who are supportive
- Election helped; freshman class who wanted to take action
 - Put pressure on leadership to make housing on their radar
 - Senate was stagnant because the same players
 - A lot of distractions with the gas tax
 - While we had champions, we also had non-champions
- If we can't get the chairs to be supportive we need leadership to demand and make in a priority
 How will we change strategies going in?
 - leadership is increasingly important for advocacy; build out relationships with them and advocate hard for those issues

2. What could H4A improve for next legislative session?

- Towards the end we ran into feelings from members of the coalition that their agenda items were not given the same amount of effort
 - Earlier and quicker communication would help alleviate some of these discrepancies
- There were some legislators that introduced legislation that the coalition wasn't a part of; maybe we move forward differently in the future? SHould we discuss it in the coalition?
- The ability w/ clarity and transparency and be willing to pivot?
- Difficult because we work hard to put our agenda together in the fall and lawmakers were excited about something that we didn't have on our agenda we need to incorporate some way to come back as a group and move something forward
- Knowing what we anticipate lawmakers to need in session and how can the coalition move things forward whether they are on the agenda or not
- We need to be able to say no if it's no aligned with what we agree to as a coalition we can push back to lawmakers
- We did stay focused on our agenda this year, and our agenda came out as strong as it could and that
 was because we didn't pivot
 - Howe do we pivot later
- Transparency with who makes decisions and why
 - Clarity around who we are speaking for and when
- Make choices about what calls to make and when to be involved because we don't have a structure for who makes the decisions

- If you are submitting a policy proposal you have to include how much you are able to commit
- The teams try to communicate as often as possible; if there is a group leading on something try to connect on the different items that would be communicated out
- How can we engage in the committees without being completely involved
- We do have organizations that are small and can't make it all work how do we lift those voices up, as well as be able to say no to specific items
- How do we bridge the gaps
- How can we make it simpler?? Easier and quicker for an adult forum on a Sunday morning
 - Can we package the agenda in smaller and simpler ways it would be easier for more than just the policy folks at the Capitol
 - Push out the individuals and advocates so they can be strong with lawmakers
- Assume good intent if a policy agenda item is pushed forward or eliminated when we have limited time it's never about feelings or making bad choices
 - There wa a difference in the MHFA/DHS side; because the MHFA side taxes/bonding was handled with Libby/Kari – we need more on the DHS side who can facilitate, lead
 - Be willing to ask questions and step up
 - We need someone to volunteer and step up sometimes
- We need to set targets or a number of items before going into the policy process
 - Nobody wanted to make the tough call on which targets we should hold off on
 - We had a lot of items and no one would be able to take ownership or leadership on the items

- 2. Policy Update
 - a. No budget targets, which has made the week slow in some ways
 - b. MHFA UPDATE
 - i. w/o targets, committee has been negotiating policy positions, policy has been very active in participating in this

- ii. Unique access we haven't had before, really great
- iii. There are some hang ups about some of the policy stuff
- iv. Ag policy provisions have moved quickly, most of the conversations happening behind closed doors which is somewhat disappointing
- v. Not sure why those conversations aren't happening out in the public
- vi. We can't comment on everything—a lot of finance and policy provisions—we made a comment on everything on the policy agenda which repeats our position all along (a lot has to do with changes to the challenge fund)
- vii. As far as budget goes, they've been making progress since the speaker of the house, senate majority gazelka, and governor have been meeting regularly
- viii. Missed deadlines to end session on time-we will likely have special session that will extend it a few days
- ix. Legislature is funded through July 1
- x. Looks like media may be addressed today-movement on the provider tax
- xi. Things are moving which is good, do we know where it will end up? No
- xii. Bonding bill was put on the Ways and Means calendar for a quick hearing–GO bonds were taken out of it
- xiii. They don't need 3/3 vote to move forward and there is already bipartisan support for HIB
- xiv. Sounds like we may have some bonding dollars in play this year–don't know what that means for the rest of our agenda
- xv. In a soft way, we were asked to continue to support a full bonding bill but should be a part of a larger bonding package
- xvi. House leadership in yesterday's hearing was trying to keep all options on the table good likelihood that there won't be a bonding bill though
- xvii. Until we have that big budget target there is no way to know how exciting this actually is
- xviii. Some organization's have had action alerts related to bonding go out and those should still be more general (support bonding for housing), not necessarily support house's actions
- xix. Exciting and reassuring that affordable housing is being talked about our efforts have been working
- xx. The action alerts should emphasize how critical appropriations are, it would be easy for session to end w/o HIB, we NEED to make sure the appropriations stay front and center
- xxi. Q: It's also important to not lose sight of the GO bonds for housing rehab, we don't want to lose sight of the fact that it's an important aspect of our bonding ask. From a messaging standpoint, how do we address all these fronts?
 - 1. We were surprised that GO bonds were taken out-not something we advocated for
 - 2. When we did talk to the governor's office, we were concerned that GO bonds were taken out and governor's office was too
 - 3. That is still something we are talking about even Rep Hausman was taken aback by this decision
 - 4. We asked her to say that there is an amendment to take GO bonds out and GOB fund housing, and she put in a good word for that as well
 - 5. Working hard to highlight it and we won't let up on it
 - 6. From strategy, it could be a vehicle bill for bonding bill of some sort-can be used to amend senate bill, could get HIB into omnibus ag and housing, or when it gets to the floor could be added back in

- 7. Some of the GOP in ways and means asked questions about that—they are worried—but Urdahl was working on a small bonding bill (\$500M-ish), so if they pursued that option certainly they would know that they had the votes for it
- 8. Bonding bill just got on the schedule for Saturday
 - a. Voting on it Saturday
 - b. Can work with lawmakers to make comments, some lawmakers will speak up about lack of GO bonds in the bill
- 9. MN Nahro just had an action alert sent out advocating GOB and HIB (bonds for housing)

c. TAXES UPDATE

- i. No new developments there
- ii. Run out of no cost, negligible cost provisions to discuss
- iii. They've taken up some things, not all things

- 1. Discussion on Manufactured Housing and inclusion of HIB use for acquisition
 - a. Toolbox build-give MH access to resources available to many other housing folks
 - b. Lowest cost, unsubsidized housing in every market
 - c. Not a lot of data
 - d. In our portfolio, 8 communities in state of MN
 - e. Income of residents is 37% of area median income

- f. MHFA is single family and multi-family until now, we haven't had access to funding on either side (own home, rent land)
- g. This bill would give MH access to pots of money most notably challenge funds and HIB

- i. Status of bill in senate housing bill

- I. Both the challenge and HIB were in a bill that passed in the legislature last year (omnibus vetoed by gov)

- n. H4A's support would garner stronger support in the house, we already has support in the senate
- o. The bipartisan folks developed bill, came up with it with our help
- p. Q: MICAH strongly supports this legislation, and would strongly encourage H4A to do this
 - i. Will likely be things in senate that are not in house
 - ii. While we have more and more uses of that, it also diminishes use of that, but gives us strength to go after more bonds and increase that strength
 - iii. MH are throughout the state, and our most viable options for people with the most limited income is this
 - iv. It's just been in the last year that the state even acknowledged MH
 - v. We can't have what happened in Lowry Grove happen again
 - vi. Just as much part of our NOAH units as any apartment building
- q. Q: Could you talk a little bit more about the tiny home piece?
 - i. It is NOT part of this legislation.
- r. Q: Could you expand on why/how these dollars are helping many of these MH home parks owning the land underneath?
 - i. There are two components expand access to acquisition and repair of infrastructure
 - ii. Infrastructure in MH parks are privately owned (in MN, most of those infrastructures have not been replaced in a long time/are failing, and there is so law that requires owners of land to replace the infrastructure)
 - iii. Cooperative buying of the land underneath is equally as important
 - iv. The trend in the industry, there has been consolidation and lot of big players have come along, but with nonprofit or municipality ownership, rents stabilize and stay at an affordable level
- s. There is good momentum this year–if there is legislation that stands a good chance of passing, we should go for it
- t. Q: I would feel more comfortable w this on a support agenda, I have some concerns around process re: amending agenda during session. In senate, there is support for including this provision under new eligible use HIB and challenge, there is less money in challenge. IF H4A were to amend its agenda, what would your position be on the senate's position on those pots of funding that other types of housing can't access?
 - i. Been ignored by government until the last couple years-devoting resources to MH is worthwhile
 - ii. Adding this as an allowable use and creating carve outs-shrinking pots for other housing and creating a new pot for MH, MH can now access the smaller pot of challenge fund

- iii. We've always said we want new money for manufactured housing, and will continue to have that position
- iv. Another level of nuance-directly appropriating dollars for MH
- u. Q: you had asked that funds needs to be immediately available sometimes, but bc there is an RFP process w HIB and challenge, how would this actually be effective?
 - i. Supportive of adding acquisitions and direct appropriations in MN Housing
 - ii. We've had many conversations w MHFA and given ideas about working the timeline
 - iii. We thinks it's possible and are working with the agency to make sure it happens
- v. Policy adoption process in the coalition this has been around for all of session and could've had this conversation earlier
 - i. We have a process in place to add in the second year of the biennium
 - ii. If this was brought up by legislators, I would want to be able to add that to the agenda
- w. I would suggest that if we can add it to support agenda, that the team after talk about that
- 2. Unsheltered homeless led by Catholic Charities
 - a. We did ask for time to touch base with H4A on unsheltered homeless and the work that is happening on that issue alongside the legislation session
 - b. It's different people at different times a lot of groups that meet
 - c. Some of the same people in the space, and then there's not
 - d. The unsheltered homeless design team finished their recs to the state in Feb. those are out there
 - e. The leadership table is a number of commissioners, local gov leaders, H4A, etc. and are being charged with coming together as local govs and developing commitments on how to address and support unsheltered homeless
 - f. Folks around that table are asking "what are we doing right now? We are in a session and have vastly increasing numbers of unsheltered homeless."
 - g. Winter safe space/navigation center are both closed or closing, a number of people were housed but they didn't take on anyone else
 - h. Also thinking about folks who are sleeping on the trains (300+ people)
 - i. At CC, we did introduce and have an information hearing on a bill to add housing stabilization to HIB, which is a move away from HIB's firm position on permanent supportive housing
 - j. Admin decided not to support that particular bill
 - k. Committed to working on other immediate needs for unsheltered homeless
 - I. We are not asking for support-we are glad that it got folks talking
 - m. S/o to Sue, Shannon, MHP
 - n. These are all ways to get at the state investment in the structures to support our unsheltered homeless
 - o. Pushing hard on ESP and things in the H4A agenda to support in a much more meaningful way on the program side
 - p. I asked for time today to talk about the unsheltered aspect of our work-there is a lot of energy, need, and concern
 - q. Part of it is needing a process to address the fluidity of session i appreciate the challenge of figuring that out
 - r. I have facilitated calls with design team members who are interested in activity this session Washington and Dakota counties, other local governments, etc are working hard and trying to find solutions
 - s. Looking for H4A to be in a spot to support when the time comes
 - t. 1984, when we passed transitional housing bill, we had services and building part in different parts of the state

- u. Funding the building of shelter is now an eligible use on State Housing Trust Fund
- v. In 1991 when the publicly owned transitional housing bill was funding that was dedicated to transitional housing (a number of HRAs that were doing publicly-owned trans housing that got turned into supportive housing)
- w. Aeon has bought a number of NOAH units
- x. Task Unlimited (housing group w mental health services, employment services)
- y. Emergency solutions grant are part of the ESP application at the state level-larger entitlement communities can be used to build and make changes in the building/shelters, as well as community block grants dollars
- z. Just as in MN, about 15 years ago, there was a push toward permanent supportive housing was mostly congregate shelters, so most of those at the federal level moved to supportive housing
- aa. We now have people who have been housed in permanent housing for 15 years still using homeless dollars
- bb. How are we making that transition into mainstream subsidy programs instead of using homeless dollars
- cc. Lack of federal resources for a long time has lead to a more expensive homelessness system
- dd. All of the problems are being forced down to more local levels flat funding the same projects without being able to expand and address additional needs
- ee. We are seeing homelessness because we are not investing in the hardest to serve this is a failure by the federal government pushing issues to the local level
- ff. IN SW Coc region we were able to end chronic homelessness (much more manageable numbers), Rock Goodeman and SWMHP developed hundreds of affordable housing units, and 28 permanent supportive housing units I agree that it can be done, it's just a matter of resources

- Yesterday Lt Gov and 9 commissioners in this room for the first meeting for housing ever seen
- Starting with a big jump forward from before
- The big question for us collectively is how do we do this together knowing we sit where we sit
 - I've never been a commissioner before
 - We can figure this out together that gets the biggest and best result
- The thing that strikes me is I've been meeting with the legislature and this conversation is in a different place
- Some people used to check-out when you talked about housing
- Everybody sees housing as a worthwhile investment
 - Something big and bold
- Everyone sees housing as an issue in their district
- We got a Governor and Lt Governor that care and show up
 - Biggest housing request ever
 - First time ever has shown up to Homeless Day on the Hill
- How can Commissioner Ho be most useful
- Ouestions
 - What are you thinking throughout the rest of legislative session? Strategy around bonding because we see a larger focus...ways we can partner and push the Senate? Kari
 - I think the wild card here is the Senate
 - What they decide to do on the appropriations targets

- When they admit they are doing a bonding bill that's when we can think more about it
- Interest rates alone and the state's balance sheet says it
- All the problems are in the tails things cost more later
- Be mindful that there will be a budget adjustment / the Gov was mindful on how things are set
- What we have proposed on its own merits
- Keep projects deeply affordable not arguments against what we've done
- Biggest question how big???
- Internally how we are moving forward we may not like this
 - When you're passive, passive things happen and when you're assertive assertive things happen
 - I want us to do everything we can with our money and our programs because we invest too much to not make as much progress as can
- The level of commitment and the level of leadership we are in an unremarkable place
- How do we think expansively about the fact that all state agencies and their heads are committed to showing up once a quarter and pushing their staff on the 89 days between to do everything in between
- There is a commitment to push the Heading Home Together plan and using a racial equity lens
 - How can we take advantage and partner best with that????
- Think of everything you can ask for and ask.
 - That requires some three steps ahead thinking. We aren't asking folks to just do their job, we're asking them to do more than that. We have an opportunity to ask that right now.
- There are other agencies that we should be engaging; where our currently relationships are and what do we need to be doing collectively to make sure we are in comfortable positions? Fatima
 - We learned how to budget together
 - As soon as the Gov budget is released I want to start the next one. I want to have a deeper relationship between state money and gov money
 - There is more state money invested in housing and homelessness than the gov right now
 - Have an agenda when you sit down and talk about transportation know what you're saying
- What is the responsibility in the state vs. counties and cities? Does the table exist? Do we need to create it? Monica
 - Metro conversations about people sleeping outside my impression is that there is not a county answer because there are 87 counties and everyone starts different
 - Practically speaking we can't answer that but one thing I started when convening
 HHLC was a survey for different counties. I read results but didn't have a follow-up
 - Surprised at how many counties saw themselves with a leadership role
 - We are trying to go more the Brian Paulson route we all have a role to play
 - If we all say this is what I can do, what falls short? Where can we fill the gaps and find the right people to do the work with us
 - IDK if we can mandate how everyone plays
 - AMY response
 - A lot of people are at the table, and they have legislative agendas
 - How can we plug everyone in?
 - How do we model the agendas and strategic ideas already in play that are successful

- Homework Starts with Home and something lawmakers are on board. Anything else you know consensus is around?
 - Not applying that HSWH is uniquely positioned in favor
 - Nobody is kind of against the new investments or increases for HSHW
 - I can't speak to what is resonating in a HHS meaning
 - The tax credit incentive is definitely something that has some champions
 - Your role gets pretty narrow pretty quick when it's your part of the budget and an outcome there
 - AMY response
 - Intercity Agency tries to be on the same page as it relates to the plan
 - There is a lot that needed to be after the election
 - Budget requests there isn't a lot of sharing
 - Transition and timing
 - After the fact is usually when the connecting happens
 - The implementation of Medicaid will be everything; it will either be everything or nothing for people living on the trains or sleeping outside
- Will send an email out to the other commissioners; we met and you were nice and we want to meet
- We appreciate the open dialogue with MN Housing and you can we start with the HHS folks and the interagency? It would be very helpful and engaging. H4A is very broad and cohesive and clear message at the legislature. You're hearing a difference because of the coalition and the groups around the table that have worked. Part of the difference from what you've heard from 10 years ago is because of the H4A coalition. Thank you to the leadership for making that happen and moving it forward.

- b. Governor Walz and Flanagan released the budget-starting point of negotiation
- c. Programs that were included:
 - i. Homework starts w home \$6M, base funding as well (ongoing appropriation, was included in H4A at \$8)
 - ii. Challenge Fund at \$10M one time funding only, \$2M base funding (H4A included at \$15M)
 - iii. FHPAP was included at \$4M ongoing (H4A included at \$4M ongoing)

 - 2. Mention of housing supports in the write up, that is a forecasted program, there is a projection of decreased uses (less people being served), we are waiting for Feb forecast next week for greater understanding
- e. Also included \$150M for bonding bill, HIB at \$120M, GOB at \$30M
 - i. That is HALF of H4A's total bonding request
- f. This is a starting point, not set it stone
- g. Policy team is talking with lawmakers and referencing that this is a historic event in investment in housing from a governor's budget
- h. Truly represents the voices from folks who are living these experiences out and the people who are providing direct services
- i. We would like to see additional investments however, esp on HHS side
- j. Will the chart also show current levels of funding?
 - i. Yes
- k. The \$150M for bonding: that is just for this year, right? Correct
- I. MHFA budget breaks all of it out
- m. Messaging-if you take out bonding piece, is this still a historic investment from the governor?
 - i. Yes, it is still a \$28M increase to housing programs w/o bonding
 - ii. Has made it a top line communications message (Community prosperity>housing)
 - iii. Coming out of the gate saying historic might make it seem like we can afford to scale it back a bit when we can't-the problem is historic
 - iv. Chime in and say the comms team will cover this—working on putting a public statement that reads differently than this
 - v. Sadly, this is a historic number, but we look forward to continuing to work to increase those numbers and continue to highlight the needs for affordable housing throughout the state
- n. Homework starts w Home will be heard wednesday
- o. Manufactured housing bill and potentially tax credit also heard next week
- p. Governor's budget will be presented in HHS house and senate next week
- q. Helpful to understand the fact that some items are not in the budget, is that because the commissioner of DHS did not advance it to budget? Can we do a 101 about how something makes it to the budget?

Policy update:

- Moved to a three meeting schedule (Mondays, 11am (collective effort to get on same page)), MHFA (Thurs, 2pm), DHS (Thursday, noon, F&B offices)

- With session starting last tuesday, things started out slow
- A lot of lawmakers in the house and staffers who are new–slow uptake into a progression of getting into lawmaker meetings
- FYI we are trying this session to better tack lawmaker meetings, please track the meetings or phone calls you are having with lawmakers and update the co chairs
 - Helps to ensure we are having most effective meetings and follow ups with lawmakers
 - Will be documenting key points to better layer communications with lawmakers
- One of the reasons why we want to really know who is meeting with whom—we have a goal to have at least five meetings with each of our target lawmakers this session
 - Want to emphasize getting people with lived experience into the meetings we are having with lawmakers
- Hearing next week, go over the calendar
 - The hearing counter is fluid
 - Overview hearing next week that will go over the background of H4A, and talk about full agenda
 - Will break down and do topical hearing to delve into specifics
 - o 1/30 homeownership/manufactured housing

- MN NAHRO will do their DOTH, public housing/preservation that day
- Tenant protections, mental health, Homeless Day on the Hill hearing will focus on homelessness, etc.
- Are the hearings to be general education? Or also more broadly things that groups are working on?
 - It is going to be fluid-will have to make adjustment depending on what bills need to be heard, we will aim for 45 mins of time and if we go a little over we have at least 30-40 min for questions
 - If relevant, we can hear our specific bills on those hearing dates
 - We are able to set only the only topical ideas we want to cover, dates may fluctuate but first three are fairly set in stone
 - These dates are just recommendations to Rep. Hausman, and are subject to change:
 - 1/23, Advocate overview
 - 1/30, homeownership and manufactured housing
 - 2/6, public housing & bonding (MN NAHRO DOTH)
 - 2/13, multifamily
 - 2/20, health and housing
 - 2/27, economic development
 - 3/6, housing stability
 - 3/13, homelessness prevention (MCH DOTH)
 - 3/22, offsite visit
 - Homework starts w home was introduced in the house (in a largely education bill)
 - Heartening to see they prioritized that early
 - Rep. Howard and Sen. Weber carrying the legislation in house and senate, respectively
 - In house file 2, they included more money than we had initially in our agenda
 - Originally had \$4M in agenda, they put \$8M for the biennium in the House
 - Strategizing what to do in the Senate so as not to lose money on the senate side policy team is wanting to ask for \$8M
 - Bc there is no resistance to a \$8M ask, we will adjust handouts and the overall total will increase by \$4M (puts MHFA at \$29M)
 - Communications on the tax side—in the past on the WHOM bill, we haven't included a number—we are estimating a \$10M capture
 - Are there opinions about this?
 - Concerned w a \$70M tax ask, might be overwhelming
 - In the past, we have been able to have conversations with lawmakers without an amount-how do you all feel about that?
 - However we message it is fine, as long as it is still out there
 - Communications will play around with the language and run it past everyone
 - Hearing next week, 1/23 at 8am, room 200 in state office building
 - Background info and info on our agenda
 - Allison and Senta kick off the hearing and provide background on H4A
 - Profiles from MHP will be provided to lawmakers
 - We will then talk about full continuum of housing through stories
 - Monica will kick off and talk about homelessness side, followed by John Lewis
 - Stories will set the tone
 - Different coalition partners will end

- Commit to homes, video for tax contribution fund, preserve (Dana Hiltunen), build more home (Katie Topinka), increase home stability (Homework starts with home, Ryan Vernosh), services to homes (Jordan from Red Lake Shelter in person)
- Stepping stone emergency housing and village of hope will be making videos
- Homeownership where Jeff Washburne will testify, and later a homeowner will testify
- Q: concerned that there is no policy being talked about that day, and tenant protections not part of the agenda
 - There was some discussion because we have such a broad agenda and we are not presenting our bill package, a lot of agenda that isn't necessarily highlighted
 - We can have a discussion about how to touch on those-have to balance overwhelming lawmakers and representing the continuum of housing
 - Bc they are not highlighted doesn't mean they won't be mentioned
 - There will be a hearing completely dedicated to tenant protections
 - Principal vernosh will likely talk about need to protect people from evictions, and making changes to protect tenants
- We will figure out how to incorporate, and see if tenant protections could potentially be incorporated in videos and Senta and Allison's talking points

- News conference in the 23rd, capitol press conference room has been reserved
- Working through who will be speaking
 - Jordan from Red Lake will be speaking
 - Playing around with speaker list
 - o If people want to come and show support in background, it is great to have others around
 - o 11am on the 23rd
- Owen is here from Prosperity's Front Door
 - Been great to work with comms team to stay closely aligned and bring voices PFD is trying to engage to places like the press conference
- Started an internal media strategy that we are rolling out
 - Making media aware of H4A-who we are, what we are doing
 - Don't anticipate this conference to blow anyone out of the water
 - More of a tool into larger strategy so that when people throughout the state phone into local media outlets, they can refer to this piece as an entry point
 - Different handouts available
 - Agenda
 - mhfa/dhs need to ensure numbers are accurate before we distribute
 - One pagers that are more specific will also be available

 - o Good turnout, did mingle and networking for first hour, and had a program

- This process has been more transparent and welcoming than before, Policy chairs have done a fantastic iob
- We had twice as many proposals recommended or requested to be reflected on our first two year agenda Process for adopting first two-year agenda:
 - These documents will be projected onto the screen, and are on the website.
 - Would be beneficial if we were to enter into two-year adoption process
 - As you see, the process and policy team recommendation is that two year approach--keep in mind as you look at how many pieces are listed on agenda
 - Helpful to get brief background into what process looked like
 - Request for ideas went out, due in to the policy team by 10/16--44 ideas gathered
 - Policy team convened itself, sent out invite for those who submitted proposals to discuss in more depth their ideas (three dates to hear these proposals)
 - Thought a lot of accessibility--implemented new processes to create greater accessibility (Zoom)
 - Provided summary of ideas, additional documents, went through very robust (4 hr) discussion on both the 23, 26 and went out to Mankato for a meeting as well
 - Thought a lot about inclusivity, accessibility
 - After hearing ideas, sent out a survey with a summary of all these ideas--sent out the 2nd of November
 - Three additional policy meetings where we discussed results of the survey--lots of factors were considered
 - 11/27, Policy adopted the recommended agenda
 - 11/29, full group will vote on this entire agenda
 - 44 proposals could not end up on our agenda--we had to prioritize proposals and had difficult decisions to make
 - S/O to policy team that worked so hard and put in countless hours and work to make this happen
 - The policy team recommends the full coalition's support for the following items to be adopted on the agenda, but to remain flexible to respond to budget forecast, etc. as they come up
 - We do have a process in place for responding to those changes which includes coming back to the full group
 - DHS--Total Request: \$24.8 mil

Meeting Minutes:

There are five questions we will dive into--for folks on the phone, Matt and Caitlin will lead the conversation on the phone. We will reconvene for 10 minutes and discuss what each group came up with. We'll close with an update on the H4A Governor's housing forum (overlap w/ NAHRO and MCH's annual conferences)

Grounding:

- 1. Governor's task force on affordable housing
 - a. Home ownership, Rental group, housing stability are the 3 sub groups
 - b. They have all wrapped up and the final report will come out 7/31/18
 - c. What will happen with recommendations? There were concerns of who would take ownership
 - d. Phase 2 is starting to form--GMHF/FHF are hiring a campaign manager to take this to the next step, carry out these recommendations (strategically, which will be in next session and which will be down the road)
- 2. Heading home together leadership circle
 - a. Cathy tenBroeke and Jennifer Ho will be at august meeting for much deeper dive
 - i. Bringing together housing advocates from across the state in shared goal
- 3. MHP's Homegrown (dedicated funding source)
 - a. Homegrown initiative looking at dedicated revenue for the region that is expanded to a statewide effort
 - b. Been active in the governor's task force in dedicating revenue will likely be a top recommendation
 - c. Embarking on initial series if we were to secure \$250 MIL annually, how would that be allocated
 - d. First of three meetings has occurred--group will likely expand
 - e. Coming up with principles and values to guide us through the next couple of meeting
 - f. ELI households are a main focus of the group

4. WHOM

- a. Ten million dollar ask following up on appropriation in 2016
- b. Language is still in statute but no allocation for it
- c. Sought another revenue source this year
- d. Sunset in 10 years in legislation--strong bipartisan support
- e. Last session, on senate we made it through all the way to taxes, on house side, had to get through two committees
- f. Senate side never got a hearing -- so much focus on federal tax
- g. Very successful meetings w governor's office
- h. Endorsed officially by gov task force
- Talking about next steps--very much participated in MHP's dedicated source of revenue
- 5. Manufactured Home efforts

- a. Policy front- trying to educate educators and public of NOAH that occur in manufactured home communities
- b. Good faith negotiations with residents before selling
- c. Agencies intentions for new eligible use? We've heard the same thing despite meetings

Potential concerns for all of these efforts springing up --

- This iteration of H4A began around 2012
- Prior to that, there were a lot of different advocates with different ideas showing up at Capitol without a unified voice
- Made it easy to say yes or no to anything arbitrarily
- Bonding bills were passing without anything for affordable housing
- Admittedly, progress has been incremental
- Really unified advocacy voice has emerged
- When will these ideas begin to merge into one lane so we can speak with a common voice?

- v. Fact that individual partner orgs are connected to networks that find out about the work H4A is doing

- ii. Working together to respond in a short time frame for advocacy outreach by regular communication between teams

- v. Good energy, a lot of motivation that comes from the coalition (especially compared to other local coalitions)

e. Group five

- i. Regional lead model has engaged more people with lived experience than before
- ii. Policy proposal process more POC and people with lived experience have been a part of the process
 - 1. More transparent
- iii. Housing on radar as a top investment, since 2012 nearly \$400 mil for housing

2. What's missing that IF it were present would improve H4A's effectiveness?

a. Group four:

- i. Funding would help us do a lot including providing stipends for residents when they come to testify, and covering transportation costs (ditto)
- ii. Still a lot of orgs in greater MN that aren't endorsing or have not figured out a way to fully participate how do we engage further?
- iii. Other organizations, not necessarily housing, that would be interested in joining but haven't been approached or don't know of H4A
- iv. We have done a good job of growing, now time to focus on intersectional policy crossover (transportation, education, economic development)
- v. Having people with lived experience attend meetings on a regular basis (more direct outreach to people w lived experience) (ditto)
- vi. H4A day on the hill
- vii. More lawmaker education

b. Group three:

- i. Money, not having a budget
- ii. Because we have members contributing talents, how would we replace that?
- iii. Inclusivity piece (specifically as it relates to racial equity) (ditto)
- iv. Little intentionality in including people w lived experience in leadership roles (ditto)
 - 1. Focus on resources, not policy
 - 2. Some groups left H4A frustrated and are related to tenant organizing
 - 3. At the end of the day, focus is securing resources (number specifically) due to complacency with the agency
 - 4. A lot of the people at the table represent the agency
 - 5. Impacts our effective in how those resources reach those who most need them

c. Group two:

- i. Housing specific committee at the legislature
 - 1. Everything gets bucketed with jobs (only a few lawmakers are well versed in affordable housing)
 - 2. More success, more intentionality
- ii. Leadership that truly has housing champions and experts
- iii. Long range strategic planning in discussing what H4A's goals are
 - 1. Re: what we are and are not doing
- iv. Increase or try to gain active support from other industries
- v. Bigger, bolder ask from agency/commissioner
- vi. Engagement has not been as deep (broad reach) what hasn't increased is the engagement from those memberships (Ditto)

- 1. A handful of organizations primarily do work around the table, would want to encourage deeper connections w orgs outside of the usual suspects
- d. Group one:
 - i. Engagement packets
 - ii. Foundational learning
 - iii. Better coordinated way to do action alerts (how people are using and who)
 - iv. Greater MN involvement making it clear how to join one of the teams
- e. Group five:
- f. H4A does cover the full housing continuum misperceptions surrounding this
- g. Lack of connection with some executives about core H4A agencies and flow of information
- 3. What ACTION can we take over the next year to improve our effectiveness? What actions can we take over a longer period? (2-5 years)
 - a. Focus of August meeting will be action planning.
- 4. A) Should H4A ever publicly oppose a housing policy that is not aligned with our coalition's vision? B) What would a successful process look like when adjustments to our goals need to be made mid-session?
 - a. Group three:
 - i. A) Yes, we should oppose policies but there needs to be a process in place (ditto)
 - ii. Makes sense to make those decisions pre session
 - iii. Same process for adopting and proposing
 - iv. Case specific maybe we oppose pre session, maybe mid-session
 - v. Need guiding principles (vision is not super clear)
 - vi. B) Could be place of teams to make a recommendation to coordinating team re: what is politically feasible
 - vii. Needing a process around how we do that (nimble)
 - viii. Need transparency after the fact, and being specific about those instances
 - b. Group four:
 - i. A) No, with the caveat of making that decision pre-session
 - ii. Does opposing mean we are going negative? Goes against positive image
 - iii. Need educational component to an opposition
 - iv. B) If possible, have prioritization before session (not likely)
 - c. Group one:
 - i. Q4 EVERYONE AGREED It would be a mistake to have a blanket statement saying we will NEVER oppose. With that said, we would need a very concrete message on WHY we oppose something. We at least need an avenue for when/if we oppose something
 - 1. Be careful we are NOT turning away/upsetting endorsing organizations. Would need to analyze the impact on organizations if we were to oppose policy
 - 2. We would need to understand the ramifications of agreeing and/or disagreeing with policy.
 - 3. Who at the H4A table would make the decision to oppose?
 - 4. When appropriate go to the opposing group to make sure they know why H4A would oppose
 - 5. Would want to consider how much energy and resources would go into opposing vs advancing our agenda

- 1. Bring it before the H4A group and everyone would need to be willing to have an extra call/meeting if adjustments are needed.
- 2. Example of when it's happened when we realized the 2018 appropriations request was not going to have lots of success we pivoted to emphasize bonding
- 3. Timely distribution of information and we need to be responsive so people can gather to have a conversation.
- 4. Need to rely on those that are leading can make decisions on the fly. Trust that those leaders are following our Agenda
- 5. Engage through various communications Email coalition, host a full coalition call, and then go to the smaller leadership groups to make final decision
- 6. If we were to add others to the discussions (currently it's conversations with the co-chairs of each team) on pivoting we should decide who and how we decide who
- 7. I think that any successful process would have significant room for disagreement. That we could strive toward consensus but have space for disagreement.

d. Group two:

- i. Yes, should have ability to oppose
- ii. Ability to pivot is possible--to the degree possible, the coordinating team come up with a recommendation
- iii. A place to allow people to express their disagreement
- iv. If we don't engage the broader coalition in these decisions, that disincentives further engagement
