(2) Children's Behavioral Health Initiative (CBHI) / Behavioral Health services for Children and Adolescents (BHCA)

CBHI services include a variety of individual and at-home services that create a wrap-around care for a child and their family. Originally these services were only offered to Masshealth clients. As these services have proved to be highly effective in stabilizing and supporting children, they are now offered through a variety of private insurance plans (known as BHCA). CBHI/BHCA Services include the following: in-home therapy, in-home behavioral therapy, therapeutic mentoring, intensive care coordinator (case management), and a family partner (parent with lived experience of a child with mental health challenges). Many community health agencies (like those listed above) offer CBHI/BHCA services.

State Agencies that provide therapeutic services:

(1) The Department of Developmental Services (DDS)

DDS provides supports for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities including Autism Spectrum Disorder to enhance opportunities to become fully engaged members of their community. Adults and children on the spectrum are eligible to apply and receive numerous therapeutic services through DDS. Family support centers in your area serve as a hub to learn about services and receive assistance in the application process. (2) The Department of Mental Health (DMH)

DMH provides a variety of services outside of masshealth and private insurance. Typically families seek treatment through DMH when they need more support than what insurance-based services can offer. DMH is free and voluntary. Eligibility is determined by two factors (1) Clinical Diagnoses - your child must have a diagnosed mental health

challenge that is not solely/primarily a neurodevelopmental challenge (e.g. Autism Spectrum Disorder) (2) Needs and Means - DMH will consider whether or not you have tried insurance based services through CBHI/BHCA. They will encourage you to try these services prior to approving your DMH application.

DMH services include: intensive home-based therapy, day treatment services, case management, etc.

(3) The Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCF)

Parents can voluntarily request services and support through DCF. DCF provides case management for families who need services and support to keep their children safe and ensure their well-being. These services can be in-home or based in the community, and include mentors, in-home therapists, and transportation services. DCF can also make referrals to immigration and special education services, and can assist families in need of stable housing.
