DESCRIPTOR: *Although I frequently make mistakes... I can invite someone to a play in the theatre and answer properly to the invitation, using accepting and refusing strategies.*

You want to go to the theater to watch the Spanish classic “The Tragicomedy of Calisto and Melibea.” Invite one of your friends to come with you. You have to use the information in the ticket below. Your friend has to accept or deny your invitation.



You can take the following dialogue as an example for creating your own one:

You want to go to the cinema tonight and you call your friend to invite him/her to come with you.

A: Hi, Mary! It's James.

B: Hi James. How are you?

A: Fine. Thank you. And you?

B: I feel fantastic. It is a great day.

A: Yes. Would you like to come to the cinema with me?

B: Great idea. I love watching films. What kind of film would you like to watch?

A: How about a horror film?

B: I don't want to see a horror film because they are scary. Why don't we see a Disney film?

A: How about *Encanto*?

B: I think it is really cool. When does the film begin?

A: It is tonight at 8 o'clock.

B: I have a dinner at half past 8. Why don't we go earlier?

A: We can go at 6:00

B: That is perfect for me.

A: Bye! See you later

HOW TO LEARN:

1. Read the example of a cinema invitation.
2. Expose the example with your partner
3. Identify the common structures to invite and accept an invitation ("Would you like to go to the cinema? - Yes, I would love to").
4. Taking the example as reference, create your own dialogue and represent it in front of the class, according to the following prompt: "You want to go to the theater to watch the Spanish classic *The Tragicomedy of Calisto and Melibea*. Invite one of your friends to come with you. He/she has to accept or deny your invitation.
