
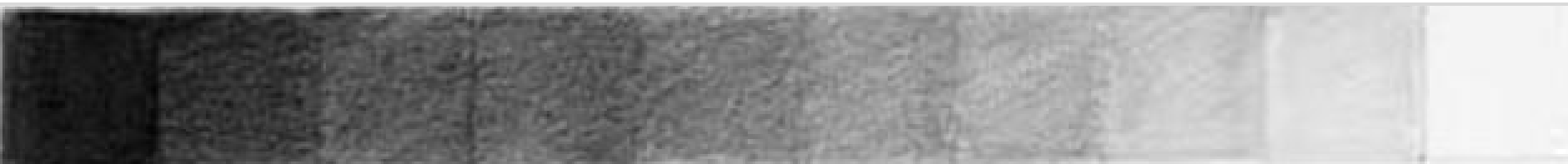


SEGMENTED GRAPHITE VALUE STRIP (FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT)
