 - Due February 18th

- 2. Course Notebook
 - Due on May 8th (last day of class)
 - Maintain a three-ring binder throughout the duration of the course
 - It must contain:
 - a. All notes you take in class

 - c. All handouts and scores for Landmark Works listening sessions
