COVID-19 Premium Upgrades

Twitter has been alight with notifications of technology companies that usually cost for "premium" access. Many are taking the COVID-19 situation to "help out". (promote?) Regardless, if some of you wanted to try premium access, now is your opportunity. Remember, best practices is to stick with the school platforms but there are a few you and students might be used to - it's not the time to introduce new things but to keep it simple.

Newsela. Online news, history, science, etc. Simply visit our COVID-19 resource center, click "Get instant access", and you'll immediately see Newsela ELA, Newsela Science, Newsela Social Studies, and The Newsela Social-Emotional Learning Collection in your Newsela account.

<u>PenPals</u>. Connects students from around the world to learn together! Students collaborate through online projects ranging from human rights and the environment to fake news and robotics, all while practicing literacy, technology and social-emotional skills.

Kahoot needs no introduction. <u>This link on their website</u> has an explanation of how Kahoot can be specifically leveraged for distance learning. <u>At this link</u> you'll find how you can get premium access due to the virus outbreak. Kahoot would be a fun exit ticket after a lesson. (something our students I'm sure would appreciate to help feel like things are "normal") Here is an additional <u>blog post by Kahoot</u>.

<u>Screencastify</u> has been briefly introduced as a Chrome Browser Extension tool to screencast lessons. If you contact <u>sales@screencastify.com</u> you can apparently ask for premium access. Here is an <u>e-book</u> on how you can use Screencastify for learning.

WeVideo is now offering affected schools free use.

<u>Pear Deck</u> is an interactive Add-on for Google Slides. You can get <u>90-days for all-access</u> (usually it's 30-days for new users before you have to pay) If you are giving slide presentations it will allow you to do Yes-No polls and have students choose form lists. Here you can <u>watch a short video</u> on how Pear Deck works.

Google Hangouts Meet is offering all access to the recording tool and larger numbers of people able to join meetings. Our IT administrators must set this up. This is **Google's blog post** on the topic.

Edpuzzle has its <u>Pro version</u> free for teachers. It's a video too where you can create interactive quizzes with auto-stop where students can re-listen/review before answering questions and moving on.

<u>Buncee</u> is free for 90-days. "...easily create, and share visual representations of content, across grade, age and learning levels. Buncee is a one-stop-shop to build media-rich lessons, reports, newsletters, presentations" "If you'd like to learn more, reach out to info@buncee.com #buncee #edtech #education

Book Creator is giving 90 days free so you can collaborate together writing books.

BrainPOP has free access to affected schools.

Adobe Spark is always free.
