#### † The faith - Dan Mohler

The unity of faith in Christ empowers believers to reflect God's image, embody His love, and navigate life's challenges with resilience and true understanding of their identity in Him.

- 00:00 The unity of faith in Christ empowers us to reflect God's image and fulfill our purpose as lights in the world, recognizing Jesus as our mediator through His incarnation.
  - The unity of faith in the body of Christ is essential for understanding our purpose and identity, making us a powerful force.
  - Jesus reveals the image of God and our purpose on earth is to shine and reflect that image, rather than merely seeking blessings.
  - Our purpose is to shine as the light of the world, reflecting the life we are called to live in the Father.
  - Jesus came in the likeness of sinful flesh, setting aside his glory and operating as a man anointed by God, rather than as God himself.
  - Jesus, fully human and divine, mediates between God and man in his resurrected body, allowing believers to access the Father through him.
  - Discussions about Jesus' deity often lead to misunderstandings, but true discernment comes from acknowledging His incarnation.
- <u>07:57</u> Identity and value are found in Christ, urging Christians to embody His light, stand firm
  in faith, and build their lives on enduring truths while avoiding complaints and recognizing
  love through trials.
  - Identity and value are found solely in Christ, and one must listen with a pure heart to truly understand this message.
  - Christians should avoid complaining to remain blameless and selfless, reflecting their faith and shining as lights in a selfish world.
  - Stand firm in your faith and identity in Christ to resist the devil's attempts to exploit your weaknesses.
  - The wise man's house withstands the storm because it is built on a solid foundation, unlike the foolish man's, illustrating the importance of building one's life on enduring truths.

- God desires believers to embody and shine His light through their actions and character, rather than merely attending church or serving without true revelation.
- Trials reveal our true understanding of God's love, which is rooted in Christ's sacrifice, rather than our circumstances.
- <u>16:12</u> John the Baptist's recognition of Jesus and subsequent doubt in prison illustrate the struggle of faith amidst personal crises and persecution, emphasizing the need for true understanding and resilience in Christian identity.
  - John the Baptist, even in the womb, recognized the presence of Jesus and reacted with joy, demonstrating his profound revelation of the Son of God.
  - John the Baptist, despite knowing Jesus is the Messiah, questions Him due to his imprisonment, illustrating how personal circumstances can lead to offense and doubt in faith.
  - Questioning God's love during crises reveals a lack of understanding of true Christian identity and endurance in faith amidst suffering.
  - Christians in some regions face extreme persecution, including death for refusing to renounce their faith, highlighting the need for courage and resilience in the face of such trials.
  - Christians displayed mockery and resentment towards the former president after the
     2020 election, revealing a lack of Christ-like love and understanding.
- <u>21:03</u> True freedom and strength in faith come from understanding our identity in Christ, overcoming fear, and uniting against division and negativity.
  - Fear and panic during COVID led to debates about masks, but true freedom comes from understanding and not being controlled by fear.
  - Grow in humility and faith, recognizing that true authority comes from being in Christ and not fearing the world.
  - Believers must strengthen their faith and be prepared for potential persecution, learning from the courage and commitment of underground Christians in places like China.
  - Many come to the gospel seeking personal gain, but must remain steadfast in their identity and purpose to resist Satan's attempts to undermine them.
  - Embracing one's identity in Christ eliminates fear and encourages living in forgiveness, unity, and alignment with God's nature, countering the enemy's attempts to sow division and negativity.
  - People often hold onto anger and engage in blame games instead of addressing issues directly.

- 28:39 The purpose of life is to reflect God's nature by embodying Christ's love, transforming our hearts to selflessly love others and resist worldly influences.
  - The purpose of life is to reflect God's nature and glory, shining His light in all circumstances, rather than being hindered by deception or personal desires.
  - Guard your heart and live as Christ did, rejecting the normalization of worldly influences.
  - Jesus exemplifies love, and true faith should focus on embodying His heart rather than solely seeking miracles and power.
  - True faith involves a transformation of the heart that allows one to love others selflessly and see the world differently, rather than being consumed by personal grievances and conflicts.
  - Seeing oneself through God's perspective helps overcome negative emotions, which can otherwise leave one vulnerable to spiritual attacks.
- 34:33 Religion can mislead true belief, but through grace, Christians can attain purity and transformation into Christ's image while embracing humility over pride.
  - Religion often misleads people into not truly believing the word of God despite their outward agreement.
  - Believers will be transformed to be like Christ in their eternal state, free from sin and self-consciousness, and this hope should motivate them to purify themselves.
  - Many Christians believe living a pure life like Jesus is impossible, but true purity is attainable through grace and transformation into His image.
  - Pride and individualism can blind us to the diverse experiences of others, so we should strive for humility.
- 40:00 Embracing truth in Christ allows believers to overcome past struggles and live transformed lives, despite the presence of evil and misleading thoughts during worship.
  - Satan's presence in the Book of Job illustrates that evil can exist even in moments of worship, as he seeks to exploit vulnerabilities in believers.
  - Thoughts that arise during worship do not reflect one's true heart, and it's misleading to equate them with personal guilt or sin.
  - Memories and familiar spirits can lead to spiritual confusion, but embracing truth in Christ is essential for freedom and identity.
  - Many people struggle with past addictions and low self-worth, but through salvation and a renewed identity in God, they can overcome their past and live transformed lives, regardless of others' perceptions.

- o To live the life we were created for, we must deny ourselves and embrace our purpose in Christ, which transforms our reactions and perceptions through prayer and grace.
- o Jesus endured suffering selflessly and with love, without succumbing to the rational thoughts of victimhood or resentment.
- 46:21 True knowledge of Jesus transforms us into love, revealing that genuine faith persists through adversity and is not contingent on personal gain.
  - o True knowledge of Jesus transforms us into love, and if we lack love, it indicates we do not truly know Him.
  - o True knowledge of God comes from living in unity with Him, not just from studying scripture or preaching.
  - o People often only worship God when blessed, and in times of loss, they may turn away, as seen in Job's experience.
  - God has given humanity authority, and the true struggle lies in maintaining faith amidst adversity, rather than battling against the devil or others.
  - o Satan challenges Job's faith, believing people serve God only for personal gain, while true faith requires selflessness and commitment to God beyond earthly benefits.

**6 Q:** How can I develop an unstoppable faith?

A: Cultivate a unity of understanding about your purpose, Jesus' presence within you, and your new identity in Christ to become an **unstoppable army** for God's kingdom.



**c Q:** What is the true purpose of a Christian?

A: Focus on walking in the light as Jesus did and shining as the light of the world, rather than merely surviving, seeking blessings, or attending church.

### **Overcoming Challenges**



Q: How do I effectively resist the devil?

A: Stand steadfast in the unity of the faith, understanding your purpose, identity, and destiny in Christ, which provides motivation to resist the devil's attempts to crush your faith.

**TO Q:** What should I build my faith on to withstand trials?

A: Build on things tested by fire like love, forgiveness, and unity, rather than hay, straw, or stubble, to stand the test of time and overcome life's storms.

**♥ Q:** How can I manifest God's attributes in my life?

**A:** Recognize that the **Christ in you** is the hope of glory, and allow every aspect of God within you to be manifested, making Him known through your actions and character.

#### **Overcoming Negative Thoughts and Addictions**

Q: How do I deal with negative thoughts during worship?

**A:** Refuse to internalize negative thoughts or memories, focus on truth, and remember that truth sets you free, not someone praying for you.

**Q:** How can I break free from addictions and compulsions?

**A:** Focus on your **new identity in Christ**, forget your past, and **live like you've never been there** to crucify your flesh and walk in the Holy Spirit.

## Responding to Adversity

**Q:** How can I react to criticism and adversity like Jesus did?

**A:** Concentrate on **denying yourself** and living for God's image and glory, embracing selflessness and love as Jesus did when facing challenges.

**? Q:** How can I overcome suffering like Job?

**A: Continue believing** what you started out believing and **never be moved** from it, fighting the good fight of faith to crucify your flesh and walk in the Holy Spirit.

**OPPORTY** Q: How can I truly know Jesus and be transformed by Him?

**A:** Focus on **loving others** as Jesus loved us, recognizing that it's impossible to know Him without becoming like Him, making love the goal of your instruction in Christ.
