

Calling your state Senator to express your support for our bill is quick and easy! First, <u>find their office</u> <u>phone numbers here</u>. Next, plan what you want to say, using or adapting the script below.

Sample Call Script

"Hello, my name is [Name], and I live in [city/town]. May I please speak with Senator/Representative [Last Name]? [If he/she/they are not available] May I please speak with the Chief of Staff or the Legislative Director? Thank you.

If you get the Senator on the phone:

- Hi Senator [Last Name]. My name is [Name] and I live in [city/town]. I am also a [insert additional

- I am calling today to ask for you to support the Right to Read legislation S.338, which was
