Participants will be signed in/out by the residential leader.
Intimate relationships between participants	All Participants	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Mixed sex groups - Age of groups 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The participants will be adequately supervised at all times - Tents will be allocated to same gender participants - Participants will only go into their own tent. - Camps are positioned with leaders in between Male and female tents - Participants under 18 years of age will not be asked to share a tent with those who are older than 18.

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Participants physically fighting	All participants	- Behavioural issues not being challenged leading to fights.	Supervision of all participants to be suitable at all times. Residential leader to monitor all behaviour and challenge with suitable measures. such as calling parents or sending them home.
Participants bullying each other	All Participants	- Behavioural issues during Residential	zero tolerance approach to bullying. Residential Leader to handle behavioural issues Office staff on hand to support instructors Contacting parents to intervene where necessary Asking participants to leave if they detract from the experience for others
