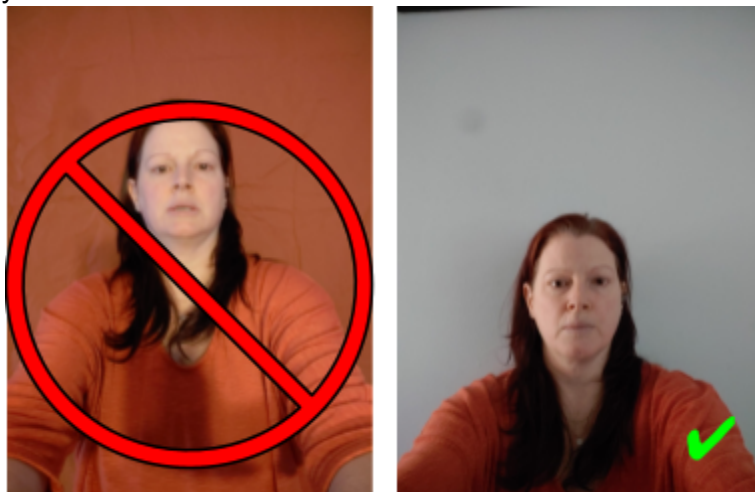
### Capture images from your virtual field trip exploration

Make sure you leave room for YOU to be added to the picture.



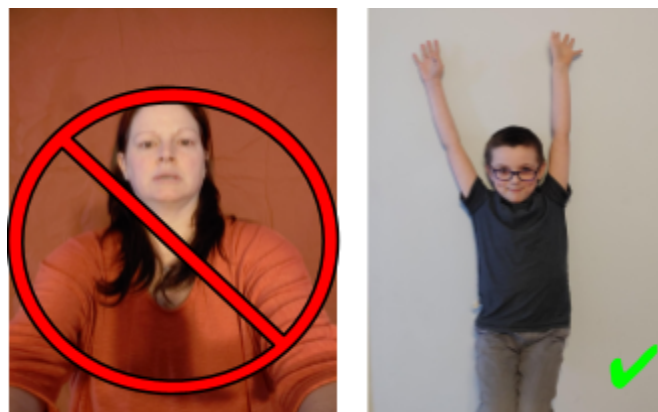
### Set the stage for perfect selfies

Find a blank wall or pin up a solid colored sheet- it doesn't have to be green!  
Make sure it isn't the same color as your skin, your shirt or your hair!



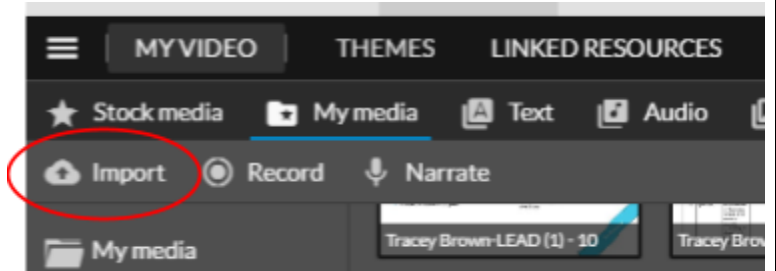
### Which YOU fits best?

Consider enlisting an assistant to get the best poses and full-body pics for more options.

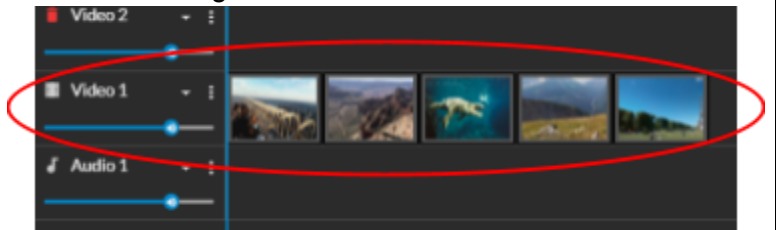


## Virtual Field Trip images

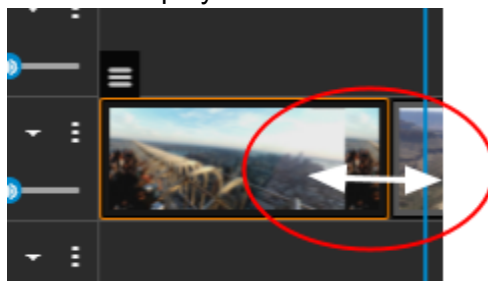
Import the location images into WeVideo.



Place these images into Video 1 track back to back.

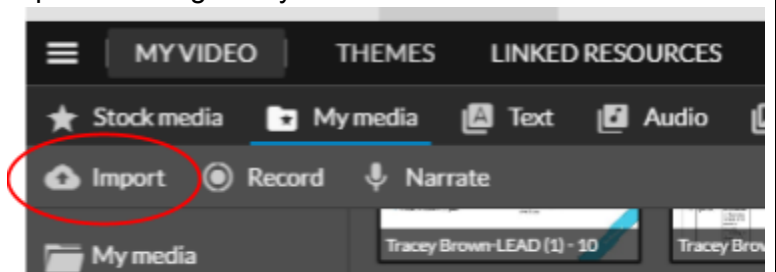


By default each image will play for 5 seconds. Click on an image and use the arrows on the right to shrink it or grow it to make it play for less or more time.

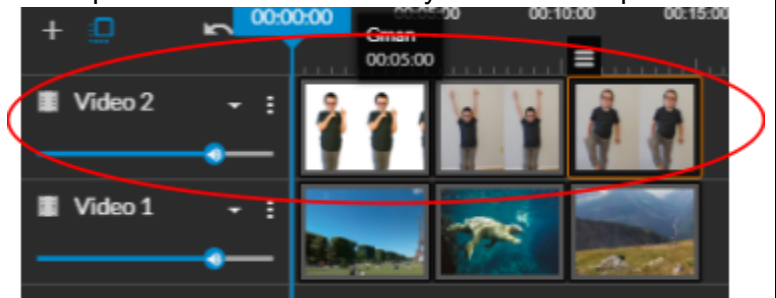


## Pictures of you



Import the images of you into WeVideo.



Place the images into Video 2 track back to back lining them up with the location where you want each pose.



If you adjusted the timing of the location images, you will

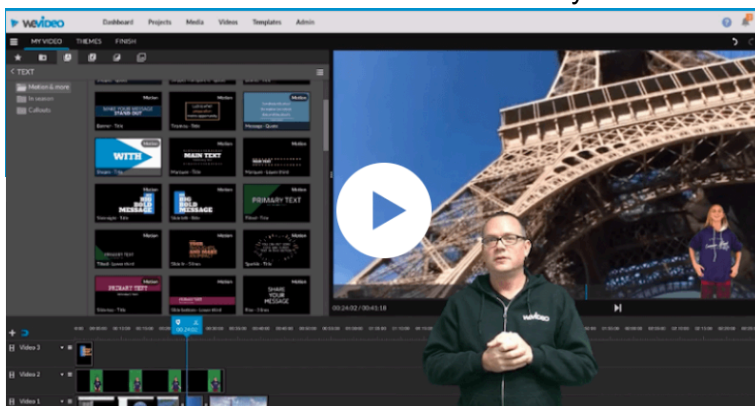
	<p>need to adjust the timing of these images as well. Use the directions above to shrink or grow with the arrows.</p>
