Bakesale - 8 April







Touch Rugby

We've heard there's some interest in entering a year 3/4 touch team in this term's mixed competition. Touch is a great fun game that uses passing, catching and running skills, and teaches teamwork and the value of all roles playing their part in a team.

Here's are the details:


- The team is open to girls and boys, and we need at least 7-8 children to form a team (5 on the field and 2-3 subs).
- No experience is necessary at this level there's a coach on the field during the game to help players know what they need to do.
- It's a super short season with only six games in total. Practices are at school from next week and the season itself kicks off on 24 February.
- Games are at Wakefield Park on the artificial turf they're played between 4 and 6pm and last 30 minutes. They take place in all weather.
- The cost is \$165 per team the exact amount per player will be calculated once we know how many players we have.

And if you have a child from another year that would like to play, still fill out the form – if we get enough interest, and enough parents able to coach and manage, we can enter more teams.


