- **President's Report – B.K.**
 - Welcome everyone and thanks to those in person and online for joining us. Next time bring a friend.

 - Thanks Principal Norton and staff at PS 254 for hosting us. And thank you to Principal Olivieri who hosted us at PS 222 last month.
 - Took a moment to remember Roderick Daly, the Chair of Community Board 17, a community leader and volunteer baseball coach who passed away last month after a long battle with cancer.

- Last month, we got a new building in district 22 on East 57th and Ave. M. It will be the fourth Joan Snow Pre-K center.
- Joan Snow Pre-K Center housed at 1326 East 57th Street will have two open houses. June 5th 10 to 2 pm and June 6th 10 to 2 pm
- **Responses to additional questions from Town Hall**
 - **Question:** District 22 lacks on-site afterschool programs for our youngest learners, particularly 3k and 4k in district schools, as well as our DOE pre-k centers and district 75. Parents struggle to obtain afterschool care for their children in these programs. What steps will you take to remedy this situation to ensure access to high-quality, developmentally appropriate on-site care for all families in the district? **Answer:** Since that particular question was asked of the chancellor when he had the town hall, you know that 2K came into effect also. How that changes the afterschool programs? I don't know yet. I guess the dollar sign will dictate but what I can tell you is that we are at the Joan Snow Centers trying to really increase the afterschool programs for that reason, parents need afterschool care. So, we know that at the Joan Snow, that will improve and increase. As far as 3K and Pre-K in the elementary schools, we are waiting for the budget to see how that plays out but it's more likely that the Joan Snow Center Pre-K classes may receive after school before a Pre-K class, let's say, here in 254.
 - **Question:** This year is the first time since my third grader started kindergarten at PS 217 free after school program had sufficient number of spots to meet the needs of our families. In previous years, the DYCD program had a waitlist and the school had a difficult time sustaining the after school options, both on and off-site. Because there are not enough families who could partake or pay for after school activities. **Answer:** So, in conclusion, this is also asking the same thing, where parents are in dire need of afterschool programs. The chancellor knows that. We remind the chancellor, along with our parents, we remind them all the time. And one thing that I know, especially at 217, there has been an increase in the number of seats available for afterschool programs. But that's just one school. I try my best whenever I am at central, and I speak to after school program directors, it's always a fight for more and more on both sides of the district, not just towards 217, but also in schools here on the southern side.

- President Kessler asks is it anticipated that additional Pre-K afterschool might be introduced as soon as next year? Superintendent Bove: Yes
- **District Presentation Regarding A.I. – Maureen Sheridan**
 - Let's Talk About Artificial Intelligence – This PowerPoint is available on the District 22 website, and it was recorded so you can view that as well as the link to enter your concerns or comments by May 8th. The DOE really wants to hear from you what your thoughts and concerns are.
 - President Kessler highlighted CEC22's previously passed resolution relating to a two-year pause on AI, and calling for caution and discussion relating to AI use in the classroom. President Kessler also noted that concerns with the DOE's approach to AI persist and that CEC has been hearing from and would like to continue hearing from parents about their views on this issue. President Kessler further requested a copy of the non-public Q&A from the District's AI Presentation, to understand what concerns and questions parents have.
