

Private Music Lessons - SPA

The Private Music Lesson Program at SPA offers private music lessons in a variety of instruments and voice. Group lessons will be offered upon request. You will find the instructors' names and bios below.

SCHEDULE: Weekly lessons are scheduled during the student's lunch time (LS only), free period or open tutorial time (MS/US only), or before and after school. Since requests will outnumber available times, it may not be possible to accommodate all students' requests. Lessons must be given at school. Students are responsible for getting to the lessons on time. We appreciate your assistance in this matter.

COST: 15 lessons, 30 min. each: \$660 per semester; 15 lessons, 45 min. each: \$865 per semester. **In case of early withdrawal, no refund will be made once a schedule has been set and lessons have begun.** If possible, missed lessons will be made up, provided at least 24 hours notice has been given and the reason for missing is a valid one. Lack of preparation, busy schedule, or forgetfulness is not a valid reason. Instructors cannot be reached at school, and notice must be given by calling or leaving a message on their personal phone. All instructors will do their best to be flexible with any official SPA schedule changes that the student may encounter. There is no refund for missed or canceled lessons that the instructor is unable to reschedule. If a student who signed up for a whole year decides not to continue lessons in the second semester, the family needs to give the instructor and the business office written notification, signed by the parents by December 15. Parents are responsible for providing supervision for their students (LS/MS) if the lessons don't happen immediately after school. Should a student not satisfy the standards of the instructor, whether it be because of attendance, lack of progress, or attitude, the instructor, in coordination with the Music Program Coordinator, has the right to dismiss the student, but only after the parents have been previously notified and both sides have tried and failed to alleviate the problem. In this case, there is no refund.

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If you are interested in private music instruction for your child, please fill out the [sign-up form](#) prior to September 7th (1st semester/full year) or December 17 (2nd semester). The instructor will contact the student to arrange a lesson time. If you sign up after this date, there will be a late fee of \$15 and possibly a lesser chance of openings in the teachers' schedules.
