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Course Description:

This elementary French course is designed to develop three areas of communication in French: interpersonal, interpretative, and presentational. All learning activities are aligned with the National Foreign Language Standards, the World Languages Content Standards, and Common Core State Standards. The most important areas covered this year include:

- Cultural knowledge and appreciation of the Francophone world.
- French culture (television, music, art, films, cuisine, Internet applications, etc.).
- Practical, hands-on approaches to learning French as a second language.
- Emphasis on the 3 modes of communication(Interpretive, Interpersonal, Presentational).

Objectives:

- To communicate in basic French
- To read basic French
- To write basic French
- To understand basic verbal French

Skills taught throughout the course:

- Collaborative Team Work
- Academic Skills: reading, writing, listening, speaking, memorization, pronunciation, public speaking, presenting, researching, and using technology

- In some cases, I will allow a student to retake an exam or redo an in-class extended writing after coming in during lunch to study. Please see me if you wish to do so.

Extra credit policy:

- No extra credit is available.

Citizenship grading policy incorporates tardy and absence policies' consequences:

Your citizenship grade is based on your attendance, attitude, behavior, preparation, and degree of participation.

In order to meet the course goals, you must be physically present and participate in the class. This is your responsibility. You and your parents/guardians can check *attendance* through *Infinite Campus*. If you have difficulty coming to class regularly, or on time, please talk to me and I will try to help you.

How the CVH school-wide attendance policy impacts your citizenship grade:

- 1 uncleared tardy or 1 unexcused absence = "B" citizenship grade.
- 2 uncleared tardies or 2 unexcused absences = "C" citizenship grade.
- 3 uncleared tardies or 3 unexcused absences = "D" citizenship grade.
- 4 uncleared tardies or 4 unexcused absences = "F" citizenship grade.

Important! - It is you, the student, who is responsible for clearing tardies and absences in the attendance office.

Advice to help you manage your learning:

1. Review – Repetition is the Key! Study French regularly, for a short time, not all in one sitting.

- Concentrate on learning new material, and always remember to review the earlier lessons. Spend 15 minutes every day, outside of class time, learning French with 100% of your attention. You will be amazed at the results!

2. Use Quizlet.com

- Instead of making flashcard to learn new vocabulary, we will use **Quizlet** to practice and memorize new words and phrases.

3. Avoid depending on translators

- It's okay to use a dictionary to look up single word . However, do not use **GOOGLE TRANSLATE** to write your sentences and entire paragraph! You will never learn how to write in French this way.

4. Study with Friends!

- Studying with friends is fun. Quiz each other. Work together to review vocabulary or grammar.
