 - **★**Model based on real life
 - ★ Necessary in an information-rich world
- 2. Asking questions
 - ★ How to ask a question
 - **★** Traffic light questions
- 3. Activity Stations
 - * Allow students to make choices and assess their own interests
 - ★ Free librarian to assist students one-on-one
 - ★ Less set-up and clean-up with multiple classes
 - * Students self-differentiate based on ability, practicing innovation and creativity

 - ★ Plan: Mini-lesson
 - ★ Do: Activity stations

- 5. What makes a good activity station?
 - ★ Usable by readers and emergent readers
 - **★** Intuitive
 - ★ Multiple uses, all educational
 - ★ Hands-on
 - ★ Learning, not reviewing
 - ★ Visual appeal
 - * Real world connection
- 6. How do I make it easier for the librarian?
 - ★ Create materials that have multiple uses
 - * Adapt existing ideas and materials
 - ★ Color coding
 - * Stations can be set up by students
- 7. Planning a unit
 - ★ Curricular and skills objectives
 - * AASL and NYS standards
 - ★ Learning styles
 - **★** Collaboration
 - ★ Don't forget copyright!

Always have students cite their sources!

- 8. Step by Step Like planning a party!
 - * Plan unit themes at least a month ahead
 - * Gather resources and materials, let ideas percolate
 - ★ Two weeks ahead create materials, esp. laminating
 - ★ Map out how the library will look
 - ★ Day ahead set everything out
- 9. Resources
 - ★ Mailbox magazine
 - ★ Preschool websites
 - ★ wildlibrary.blogspot.com
 - ★ Toy stores
- 10. Adapting worksheets
 - ★ Turn into a game

- ★ Cut into puzzle
- ★ Put in page protector/use dry-erase crayon
- 11. Useful materials to keep on hand
 - ★ Plastic page protectors
 - ★ Dry erase crayons or markers
 - ★ Magnet tape and Velcro
 - * Buttons, old magazines, greeting cards, junk mail envelopes, anything else you can save
 - ★ Draw and write paper
 - ★ Disinfecting wipes, hand sanitizer
